NAZIS PLAN TO MAKE BIG SHOW OF GRYNSPAN TRIAL

VICHY, France, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- A big "show" will be made of the trial of Herschel Grynszpan, young Polish Jew, for the murder of Ernst vom Rath, German Embassy official in Paris in 1938, according to reports from Paris today. The trial is expected to open shortly.

(Four lines were censored at this point.)

Grynszpan shot and fatally wounded vom Rath on Nov. 7, 1938, in what he said was a protest against Nazi persecution of Jews. He was being held in a Paris prison pending trial when the German invasion of France began. The young Polish Jew was evacuated from Paris before the occupation of the capital, but later fell into the hands of the Germans, who transported him to Berlin.

The assassination of vom Rath was the signal for the unleashing of a wave of anti-Jewish disorders throughout the Reich and the imposition of a \$400,000,000 "fine" on Germany's Jews.

NEW JEWISH CASUALTIES IN LONDON AIR RAIDS

LONDON, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- Nazi bombs inflicted a number of Jewish casualties, razed a small synagogue and demolished and damaged many houses in its vicinity in last night's raids on London.

12 SCHOOLS TRAIN AVIATORS IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- The keen interest of Palestine's Jewish youth in aviation was described at a meeting of the Jerusalem Aviation Club today.

Dr. Isaac Gruenbaum, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, disclosed that the Agency was supporting three flying schools and that the Vaad Leumi (Jewish National Council) was supporting another which has 11 training planes and five gliders. Fifty Jewish pilots from these schools obtained licenses from the Palestine Government last year, he said.

90 IMMIGRANTS ARRIVE IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- Seventeen Jewish immigrants from Lithuania, who came via Soviet Russia and Turkey, and 73 Yemenite Jews, who traveled through Iraq and Syria, arrived here today.

REFUGEES BROUGHT \$20,000,000 TO U.S. TO AID INDUSTRY

NEW YORK, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- Refugees have provided work for many Americans instead of depriving them of jobs, according to a pamphlet entitled "Meet the Refugees" compiled by the Committee on Refugees of the Young Women's Christian Association and published by the Womans Press in this city.

Between 5,000 and 6,000 refugees have brought with them to this country an estimated \$20,000,000 which already has been put to work in a wide assortment of industries, the pamphlet says.

But more important than the capital are the patents and the processing secrets many refugees have brought to this country, the pamphlet adds. The pamphlet points out that a survey made several months ago by the National Refugee Service revealed that some 2,200 American citizens were employed in 303 refugee-founded enterprises.

McWILLIAMS FREED PENDING APPEAL

NEW YORK, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- Joseph E. McWilliams, anti-Semitic agitator, was released from the workhouse today pending appeal when his attorney obtained a writ of reasonable doubt from Justice Ford in Special Sessions Court. The writ was based on the contention that Magistrate Edgar Bromberger, who sentenced McWilliams, was prejudiced and that the section under which he was sentenced was unconstitutional.

MEXICO CUTS ENTRY QUOTA

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 20. (JTA-Airmail) -- Mexico's immigration schedule for 1941, made public today, cuts quotas for most European countries from 1,000 to 100 each, but permits entry of those fleeing from Europe because of religious or political conditions which place their lives in danger.

STREET FOR JABOTINSKY NAMED IN PALESTINE

TEL AVIV, Oct. 22. (JTA) -- A street was named for the late Vladimir Jabotinsky today at Bat Yam near Tel Aviv. It was the first street in Palestine to be named for the leader of the New Zionist Organization, who had been in exile from the Holy Land.

FIRST FREE LOAN SOCIETY SET UP IN CHILE

SANTIAGO, Oct. 10. (ONA-By Airmail) -- A Jewish free loan society, which will extend credit principally to small Jewish tradesmen, manufacturers and farmers, has been formed here, the first such institution established in Chile.

The financial organization was set up following talks between Dr. Noel Aronovici, vice-director of the American Joint Reconstruction Foundation, and Jewish and other officials here.

The institution has been established on a cooperative basis and is known as the Cooperative de Credito para la Industria, Agricultura y Comercia, LTDA. The abbreviated name is COCIAC, LTDA. The initial capital is 500,000 pesos. Practically all groups of Jews in Chile, including long established residents and newly-arrived Ashkenazi and Sephardic Jews, are represented on the board. Jaime Levy, president of the Sephardic Community of Santiago, was elected president of the board.

JEWISH BIRTHS DROP, SUICIDES RISE IN HUNGARY

BUDAPEST, Oct. 14. (JTA-By Mail) -- A catastrophic decrease in Jewish births in Hungary, a wave of suicides and a great number of conversions were recorded during the past year as a result of the serious deterioration in the position of Hungarian Jewry caused by anti-Jewish legislation, it is stated in the annual report submitted to the general meeting of the Pest Jewish Community.

The report, which covers the first six months of the current year, in addition to 1939, declares that relief activities had to be considerably curtailed owing to the reduced capacity of Jewish communities abroad to come to the assistance of their co-religionists in Hungary. Nevertheless, \$400,000 for relief work in Hungary was received from the Joint Distribution Committee last summer. Morris C. Troper, chairman of the European Executive Council of the J.D.C. visited Budapest several times during the period and high tribute is paid in the report to the warm sympathy shown by this organization for the plight of the Jews in Hungary.

Foreign relief was supplemented by a large-scale relief action undertaken by the Jews of Hungary themselves. This organization, known as "OMZSA," is under the direction of Dr. Geza Ribary vice-president of the Pest Community, and has resulted in a total of 1,150,026 Pengoe being collected for relief work among Hungarian Jews in the first six months of the year.

CHICAGO OIL MAN AIDS RESEARCH AT HEBREW U.

JERUSALEM, Oct. 15. (JTA-By Mail) -- A cabled grant of \$2,000 from Hiram Halle, president of Universal Oil Products, Chicago, to the Department of Physical Chemistry of the Hebrew University, has made possible the continuance of systematic research work into the catalytic transformation of hydrocarbons recently carried out by the brothers Professor A. Farkas and Professor L. Farkas.

The brothers Farkas, who are well known for their valuable research work in problems relating to oil production, have lectured both in London and in the United States on their latest investigations in the Jerusalem laboratories in the production of heavy or double weight oil by the use of hydrogen.
