AUSTRIANS REPORTED ATTACKING "ARY ANIZED" JEWISH SHOPS

LONDON, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- The recrudescence of "Boeller outrages" in Vienna is reminiscent of the days of pre-Maxi political warfare, says the Budapest correspondent of the Daily Telegraph. Boeller, an Austrian specialty, is something between a large firecracker and a small bomb. It can cause considerable damage.

The outrages are mainly directed against "Aryanized" shops taken over by Nazis from Jews. The new proprietors not only have paid not a farthing to the Jews, but have no money to pay the wholesaler because of the demand by members of the party for credit. They also raise prices.

This is illegal, even according to Nazi laws, but the illegalities continue to flourish and they have promoted turnoil in the business world. Baldur von Schirach, leader of the Hitler Youth, has unsuccessfully tried to remove the scandal. Now outraged shopkeepers, anti-Nazis and sacked assistants spend part of the bights "Boellering," according to the report.

Meanwhile, repeated requests eddressed to the Jewish Communal Board in Vienna to the Mari authorities for the allothemy to Jews of material for shrouds for the burial of the deed have fallen on deaf ears, 'The Jewish Chronicle reports. The Mari authorities declined to issue Jews any ration cards for materials. The Jewish burial authorities have therefore been obliged to decide that the Jewish dead must be buried in their own shirts.

CANADIAN ZIONISTS ASK PALESTINE COMMONWEALTH AFTER WAR

MONTREAL, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- Establishment of a Palestine Jewish commonwealth after the war was demanded last night by the Zionist Organization of Canada in a resolution adopted at the close of its 26th national convention. A.J. Freiman, of Ottawa, was elected president for his 25rd year.

In other resolutions the convention declared "the greatest and most urgent task of our times is to crush the menace of the Axis powers," deplored the Pelestine administration implementation of the White Paper, condemned all territorial schemes for colonization of Jewish masses and asked the opportunity for the raising of a Jewish army in Pelestine and the disspora.

A resolution said: "The principal task of the Zionist Organization of Gamada during the coming years will be...to assist in producing at the termination of the war...equal individual end group rights for Jews in all countries where they reside and eradication of all racial, religious and national discrimination in any form...The establishment of Pelestine as a Jewish Componwealth of British Commonwealth of Nations."

MAX NORDAU WOULD URGE INTENSIFIED PALESTINE SETTLEMENT TODAY, DAUGHTER SAYS

NEW YORK, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- If Max Nordau, the femous Zionist writer and theoretician, were living today, he would counsel the Jews not to lose hope, but to launch a strong movement for redemption of Britain's pledge to establish a Jewish homeland in Palestine, it was declared in am interview today by his daughter, Maxa Nordau Gruenblat, who arrived here yesterday on the U.S. liner Excembion from Lisbon for a nation-wide lecture tour.

Nordam, Mrs. Gruenblat said, would tell the Jews to gain consolation from history, which has recorded the rise and fall of previous tyrents, and to make svery effort for mass immigration to Palestine. She said that present events were reculzing her father!s prophesics. She recalled his belief that anti-Sentition was immate in the Christian world and that the Jews could not hope to escape persecution until they had their own state.

Mrs. Ofuenblat, a native Frenchwoman, lived near Paris until the German occupation, when she moved to southern Framco, and from there proceeded in December to Lisbon. She was accompanied here by her husband, Claude Gruenblat, who was a French air captain, and their daughtér. They will remain in the United States indefinitely. Mrs. Gruenblat will open her lecture tour in Chicago on Jan. 28.

RABBIE SET FEB. 8 AS "JNF SABBATH"

JEWS BARRED FROM SOUTH AFRICAN NATIONALIST PARTY

JOHANNESBURG, Dec. 30. (JTA-By Mail) -- At the Transvaal Congress of the Herenigde Party (Re-United Nationalist Party). It was decided, after a long discussion that Jews should not be permitted to become members of the Party and that the Federal Council should endeavor to persuade the parties in the other provinces also to exclude Jews from membership

The whole agitation, says The Zionist Record, is "an artificial one, motivated purely by selfish material and political aims and playing upon ignorance prejudice."
