NEW GHETTO SET UP IN LUBLIN; JEWS ORDERED IN BY APRIL 15

LONDON, April 3. (JTA) -- A ghetto has been established in the city of Lublin, Polish circles here reported today.

Non-Jews must leave the ghetto area by April 10 and Jews living outside must move in by April 15. Non-Jewish shops and enterprises in the ghetto must leave by May 3 but Jewish shops outside are allowed to remain for the time being, for how long is not known.

Jews who do not enter the ghetto voluntarily will be expelled from Lublin and will not be permitted more than 25 kilograms of luggage. Boundaries of the ghetto are Kowalska, Sienna, Kalinowszyna, Franciszkanska, Unicka and Lubarkowska streets.

FRANKFURT PARLEY HEARS PLAN FOR PAN-EUROPE ANTI-JEWISH POLICY

STOCKHOLM, April 3. (JTA) -- Major Vidkun Quisling's latest ambition to become Europe's Jew-baiter No. 1, which is revealed in the Dagens Nyheter's prominently-featured report of Quisling's proposal in Frankfurt for introduction of pan-European anti-Jewish legislation within the framework of the Nazi "new order," has already had repercussions in Norway.

Following publication by the Quisling organ Fritt Folk of a six-column front-page article violently agitating against the Jews, Jewish shops in Oslo and other centers have been defaced nightly with abusive slogans smeared in white paint.

Quisling's speech was made before the Institute for Research into the Jewish Problem, held in Frankfurt-am-Main, Germany, with the attendance of leading Nazis from various parts of the Reich and German-occupied territories.

RUMANIA CURBS EMPLOYMENT OF JEWS

ISTANBUL, April 3. (JTA) -- The Bucharest press publishes a decision of the Rumanian Labor Ministry cancelling labor contracts of (1) Jewish apprentices, whether their employers are Jewish or Christian, (2) Jews who obtained professional certificates after losing their jobs under the "Rumanization" decree of Nov. 16, (3) professional certificates of Jews not working for employers, but independently.

VICHY SEEN PLANNING TO INTENSIFY ANTI-JEWISH LAWS

VICHY, April 3. (JTA) -- The Vichy authorities intend to take more stringent action against the Jews in unoccupied France, it was indicated today.

Xavier Vallat, newly-appointed Commissioner for Jewish Affairs, gave a hint of the policy he would follow when he told the newspaper *Le Journal* in an interview that the Jewish problem was one of foreigners attempting to seize the reins of control of the French people.

Commenting on this statement, the paper added that the sweeping anti-Jewish legislation in force in occupied France should be extended to the free zone and that restrictions on Jewish ownership of property should be enacted.

Vallat's duties, according to a law published in the Official Journal, include drafting all legislation relating to Jews and their participation in public life, "fixing the date of liquidation of Jewish property in cases where such liquidation is prescribed by law," appointing receivers for Jewish property and controlling their activities.

LONDON, April 3. (JTA) -- An announcement by the Nazi-controlled Paris radio that Xavier Vallat, was going to Paris was taken in French circles here today as indication that Vichy's policy on the Jews in the future would be still more dependant on German instruction. The measures enforced against the Jews by the occupation authorities in Paris will probably be applied also in unoccupied France. it was said.

BRITAIN ENGAGES SOME REFUGEE SCIENTISTS FOR WAR WORK

LONDON, April 3. (JTA) -- A number of refugee specialists have been engaged by the Government for medical and industrial research work, Lord Hankey revealed in the House of Lords today during a debate on the Scientific Advisory Committee. He said:

"Much of the research work is so secret that precautions have to be taken. Nevertheless, a number of refugee specialists have been employed in research laboratories, mainly on the medical side, but also in industry. Special organizations have been set up for obtaining information, suggestions and assistance from friendly refugees, including scientists, and to assist them in obtaining employment."

COOPERATION OF ALLIED JEWISH CHAPLAINS PLANNED

LONDON, April 3. (JTA) -- Permanent cooperation among Jewish chaplains of the continental Allied forces was envisaged at a special conference of the Keren Eatorah. It was pointed out that many thousands of Jews were now serving with the Allied armies in Britain and overseas. Allied chaplains will work in closest cooperation with the senior Jewish chaplain of the United Kingdom, it was stated.

Among those participating in the conference were Major Melzer and Captain Klepfisz, Polish army chaplains, and Lieutenant Krausze, Czechoslovak army chaplain.

The first OZE nursery for Jewish children was opened today at Hemel-Hampstead by Lady Reading, who declared that "if our generation is to disappear, at least the children will remain alive to enjoy the better world." A representative of the Ministry of Health praised the OZE's work. The mayor promised the cooperation of the local authorities.

JACKSON URGES USE OF REFUGEES FOR DEMOCRATIC 'FIFTH COLUMN' OFFENSIVE IN EUROPE

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- Attorney General Robert Jackson urged tonight that refugees in the United States be utilized for a propaganda offensive in Europe which would "out-fifth-column the master fifth columnist himself."

At the same time, he asserted that "propagandists of unfriendly powers" would never succeed in conquering the U.S. by racial agitation because "we have never failed to achieve a working unity, especially in the presence of any danger from without."

Hitler's domain of conquered peoples, "held down only by the machine-gun and disciplined by the concentration camp," constitute the greatest fifth column opportunity in history, Jackson said in a speech prepared for delivery at a dinner of the Common Council for American Unity at the Hotel Astor.

The time has come "when we should no longer concede the initiative to enemies of our way of life or rely solely upon defensive measures against foreign penetration," he said. Aided by loyal aliens in this country, "we can take the propaganda offensive and out-fifth-column the master fifth columnist himself. If we are to attack this menace at its source we could have no more effective weapon than the good offices of the alien."

"Given the help of our immigrants from the recently-oppressed countries," he asserted, "we could send, in Europe's own tongues, from her own native sons, messages of their progress and happiness under free institutions that would stir new vitality for democracy in every occupied community in Europe."

Jackson pointed out that "propagandists of unfriendly powers have said that a conquest of the United States could be done by playing race against race, religion against religion and class against class." While this policy has succeeded in Europe, of the U.S. Jackson said:

"We all realize the fact that we are not a distinct and separate race, but rather a mosaic of races, introduced into public life emotional cross-currents that are often unfortunate. We know, too, that our very diversity tends to make them cancel each other. And so, while we often disagree on foreign policy, we have never failed to achieve a working unity, especially in the presence of any danger from without."

Jackson called for modernization of immigration laws to permit firmer but more flexible alien control. He said: "Deportation of undesirable aliens has broken down in practice because transportation to most countries has become impossible and because many countries refuse to accept their return. But the law still commands us to issue deportation orders that cannot be carried out. Over 6,000 persons have been ordered deported who, because of conditions beyond our control, cannot be gotten out of the country. Such a situation breeds contempt for law and government."

"I have called this situation to the attention of Congress and have asked, in lieu of deportation, that an independent board, after hearings, be allowed broad discretion to intern dangerous criminal aliens and to condone mere technical violations of the law which would now subject aliens of good character to deportation. This would assure the country of protection against the vicious, which it cannot get from present procedure, and would regularize the status of decent and loyal aliens."

WAR DEPARTMENT ISSUES THREE-FAITH PRAYER BOOKS FOR ARMY, NAVY

WASHINGTON, April 3. (JTA) -- Two new-type manuals of religious service which will enable soldiers to conduct religious services in the field and in camp in the absence of a chaplain have been developed for army and navy use, the War Department announced today.

Both hymnals contain sections with guides for Jewish, Catholic and Protestant services. A total of 100,000 copies of the "Song and Service Book, Army and Navy, for Field and Ship," and 50,000 copies of the "Hymnal, Army and Navy" for use in camp chapels have been ordered, at a cost of \$46,569.

Designed to meet all sorts of field conditions where services must be improvised, the Jewish section of the field hymnal has a Sabbath eve service with responses, appropriate music and hymns. The new books were developed by two years of work in which service chaplains of all faiths participated.

Sails to Conduct Seder in Puerto Rico

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- To conduct the first passover services for enlisted men of the Army ever held in Puerto Rico, Rabbi Ivey Becker, of New Haven, sailed today for San Juan aboard the S.S. Coamo under the auspices of the Jewish Welfare Board. There is no Jewish Army chaplain in Puerto Rico. Governor Guy J. Swope of the territory and other officials plan to attend the ceremonies on Friday, April 11. Men of the Jewish faith at all posts on the island will be granted leave to go to San Juan for the services.

B'NAI B'RITH REELECTS MONSKY PRESIDENT

CHICAGO, April 3. (JTA) -- B'nai B'rith's triennial convention yesterday reelected Henry Monksy of Omaha as president. Other officers are Frank Goldman, Lowell, Mass., Abe B. Freyer, Shreveport, La., and Judge I.M. Golden, San Francisco, vice-presidents; Maurice Bisgry, Washington, secretary, and Sidney G. Kusworm, Dayton, O., treasurer.

Resolutions called for broadening B'nai B'rith's program of aid to democracies and war relief and endorsed the program of aid to the British civil population.

PALESTINE NURSING SCHOOL EXPANDS TRAINING

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- Junior Hadassah announced today that to meet the possible call for emergency nursing service in the Near East as the war situation there grows more tense, the Henrietta Szold School of Nursing in Jerusalem has undertaken to prepare a large corps of trained nurses and lay volunteers for war duties. Cooperating with the British military authorities, the school, which is the largest and most modern of its kind in Palestine, is revising and expanding its program to provide trained service for war needs.

MRS. JABOTINSKY ARRIVES HERE

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- Mrs. Jean Jabotinsky, widow of the late Zionist-Revisionist leader, arrived here today from Lisbon on the Portuguese steamship Carvalho Araujo. She had been living in England since the outbreak of the war. "The treatment of the passengers on our steamer was wonderful," Mrs. Jabotinsky said. She was met at the pier by her son, Eri, who arrived here from Palestine several weeks ago, and a number of friends.
