VICHY REPORTED PERMITTING MAZIS TO DEPORT POLISH JEWS TO MADAGASCAR

LONDON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- The Vichy government is reported here today as having agreed to permit Nasi Germeny to send the first 5,000 Jews from Nasi-held Poland to the French island of Madagascar. The settlement of the deported Jews on Madagascar will be Amanced by the French administration there which will utilize the deportees for forced labor to develop the island.

Explaining that the 5,000 Jews will be sent to Madegascar as "an experiment", the report states that the Mexis have definitely made up their mind to accelerate the expulsion of Jews from Poland to Madegascar. "Registration of Jews in Poland for this purpose is now being conducted by the German occupational authorities there," the report says.

At the same time it was reported here today that the last 400 Jews in Danzig, formerly a Free City under the supervision of the League of Nations, have been placed on a boat by the Nasis and shipped to an unknown destination in Africa. The victims included Jewish holders of Soviet passports who were not molested in Danzig by the Nasi administration there while the German-Soviet pact was still functioning. The Jewish doctors in the group were taken off the boat the last minute before the departure and were transported to German military hospitals in East Prussia to attend to German soldiers wounded on the Soviet front. The deported Jews were permitted to take along only a few of their belongings and some clothing and bedding.

SOVIET AMBASSADOR IN LONDON TO ISSUE STATEMENT ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM IN RUSSIA

LONDON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- A statement dealing with the problem of religious freedom in Soviet Russia will be issued shortly by Ivan Maisky, Soviet ambassedor in London, it was disclosed here today by the Agudas Israel headquarters.

Leaders of the Agudas Israel organisation stated that the Soviet embassador "had shown considerable sympathy" when the question was raised by a delegation of orthodox Jews. In addition to discussing the problem with Maisky, members of the Agudas Israel executive have also approached the Foreign Office and the Folish government in London with a view toward securing their intervention with the Soviet authorities.

On the occasion of the Russo-Polish agreement, the Agudeh World Executive today sent a message of congratulations to the Polish premier Gen. Sikoraki. Pointing out that almost a million Jews are involved in the war zone on Soviet and Polish soil, the Agudeh message said that "although these victims ere now suffering from the Nesi mareuders, they too will rejoice over the fact that Russia and Poland have joined friendship."

PALESTINE AND GERMANY TO EXCHANGE INTERNEES

LONDON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- Negotiations between Palestine and Germany for the exchange of women, children and aged men intermed in these countries as enemy aliens ere nearing completion, it was reported last night to the Commons by Richard K. Law, underscretary form-forming affairs. The lists of the intermees to be exchanged ere now in preparation The exchange may be effected before the arrival of winter.

HUNGARY THREATENS TO CLOSE DOWN SYNAGOCUES WHEN "V" APPEARS ON THEIR WALLS

LONDON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- The Hungarian authorities have threatened to close down a number of synagogues throughout the country following the appearance of the letter "V" on their walls, it was reported here today.

The threat follows an order issued this week by the Hungarian authorities in the provinces of Transylvania and Carpatho-Russia providing for the immediate closing down there of a number of Jewish schools in reprisal for the appearance of the letter "V" on the walls of the schools. Hungarian Nazi newspapers reporting the liquidation of the schools stated that "the synagogues and the Jewish schools are nests of anti-Hungarian activities, and their existence can no longer be tolerated."

RUMANIAN POPULATION REPORTED DEVELOPING SYMPATHY FOR JEWS

LONDON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- Dissetisfaction with the Germans in Rumania is running high among the population there, and sympathy with the Jews is growing, according to information received here by Virgil Tiles, former Rumanian Minister in London, and leader of the Free Rumanian movement.

Speaking lest night before the Anglo-Palestine Club, Tiles stated that this information resched him directly from Rumania through a neutral country. The Rumanian people, he said, are becoming sympathetic to the Jews as it is now obvious that Germans, rather than Rumanians, are being placed in the positions from which the Jews have been ousted.

The former Rumanian Minister predicted in his address that Jews in Rumania will be restored to their rights when the war is over. He urged, however, that a mutual understanding should be reached between the Jews and the post-war Rumanian government with regard to the question of "voluntary Jewish emigration" from Rumania. He pointed out that Lord Melchett, the British Zionist leader, made a similar proposal some years ago, when he suggested the gradual reduction of the Jewish population in Rumania to 600,000. The emigration of Jews from Rumania should be undertaken under a mutual economic errengement with the Rumanian authorities, while the Jews remaining in Rumania should be allowed to share responsibility for developing the country on an equal basis with the rest of the population. Tiles said.

NAZIS DEMOLISH STRASBOURG SYNAGOGUE TO USE SITE FOR PARADE GROUND

ZURICE, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- The synagogue in Strasbourg, Alsace-Lorreine, a city from which all Jews have been expelled, is in the process of demolition, according to an article in the Strasbourger Newste Machrichten, reaching here today. The article is devoted to the "inglorious past of the town under the regime of the Kaiser when Judaism was one of the religious officially recognized by the State."

Revealing that the dome of the synagogue, famous as one of the most imposing buildings in the city, had already been removed, the article states that the Masi authorities have decided not to convert the synagogue to any other purpose but to pull down the building and use the site as a perade ground where "columns of Strasbourg National Socialist will soon be marching to seal the final union with the greater Reich which liberated Europe from the Jews."

JEWS BARRED FROM ALL WOODS IN PRAGUE AREA

ZURICH, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- Jews have been barred from all access to woods in the greater Pregue eres by order of the Prague police chief, it is reported in the Neue Teg, reaching here today.

MEXICAN PRESIDENT EXPRESSES ACCORD WITH INTER-AMERICAN JEWISH CONFERENCE

NEW YORK, Ang. 1. (JTA) -- President Hanuel Avila Camacho of Mexico has expressed his full accord with the purposes of the forthcoming Inter-American Jewish Conference which will be held in Meshington at the end of October, it was announced here today by the American Jewish Congress, which is sponsoring the Conference in cooperation with the World Jewish Congress.

President Camacho expressed his "gratification that Mexican Jewry will be represented at the Conference by a delegation," in the course of an interview with Dr. Nahum Goldmann, Chairman of the Administrative Committee of the World Jewish Congress, the amnouncement said.

NOCK'S ANTI-JEWISH SENTIMENTS DATE BACK TO 1928, RABBI PROVES

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- Albert Jay Nock, whose two recent erticles in the Atlantic Monthly espoused the thesis that anti-Semitism is a result of the Jews being an Oriental people living in an Occidental environment, is a "proved and tested anti-Semite," declares Rabbi Saul E. White of Temple Beth Sholem in San Francisco, in an article appearing today in the Enemu-el and Jewish Journal, published here.

Nock's articles of the last ten years or so, are proof, says Rabbi White, that the two in the Atlantic Monthly are not occasioned by a "feeling of outrage against the growth of anti-Semitism in our country" but are rather a development of "an old humch into a major thesis; and that "in days not so distant he did not look for fine feathers in which to clock his vulgar anti-Semitism."

Rabbi White reveals that in a book of esseys entitled "On Doing the Right Thing," published in 1928, Mock wrote: "In actual life they (the Jews) are dreadful people. I sometimes think that there will be record-breaking pogroms in New York some day and there are occasions even now when the most peace-loving person among us wishes be could send over a couple of sotnies of Cossecks to floor manage the subway rush."

In a "Journal of These Days," published in 1954, Nock, according to Rabbi White's revelations, wrote:

"It is ironic that the offsprings of those who crucified Jesus are the ones who profit most by the seasonal sentiment of Christmas. But in the Jewish view Gesheft ist immer Geshaft and most Christians are too dull-witted to perceive the enomaly." In the same Journal he also writes: "This morning I was thinking of our newspapers here in New York as a typical echt Jewish enterprise for its peculiar quality of unscrupulousness and shabbiness."

Addressing himself to "those who are disturbed by Mr. Nock's adumbrations and prophecy of doom," Rabbi White says, "it may be some comfort to know that he was expecting pogroms as early as 1928, and that his acute awareness of a dangerous Jewish problem which we are led to believe has come to him only yesterday, is dated in his "Journal of Our Times," as December, 1955. For the past decade he has been waiting for disaster and catastrophe.

"I prefer the old Mr. Nock, the open and above-board anti-Semite, the one who yearned for the Cossacks and pogroms to Mr. Nock, the pseudo-philosopher of folk and country, the poor disciple of Goebbels and Rosenberg," Rabbi White concludes.

REPRESENTATIVE DICKSTEIN ASKS PRESIDENT TO PROCLAIM OCTOBER 28, "STATUE OF LIBERTY DAY"

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- President Roosevelt would be suthorized by Congress to proclaim October 28 - the 55th anniversary of the dedication of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor - as "Statue of Liberty Day" to "rededicate the American people, especially the foreign born, to American concepts of Liberty, "under terms of a resolution introduced by Representative Samuel Dickstein, Chairman of the House Committee on Immigration and Naturalization.

The resolution, which was introduced by Dickstein at the behest of the American Committee for the Protection of the Foreign Born, asks the President to call upon Federal and State officials to display the American flag on all state and government buildings on October 28, and to invite the people of the United States to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies. The measure was referred to the House Judiciary Committee for action.

AMERICAN JEWS ASKED TO OBSERVE TISHA B'AV BY AIDING PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- A call to the Jews of America to observe Tisha B'Av -- the 1872nd anniversary of the destruction of Jerusalem and the burning of the Temple by the Roman legions - on Sunday, August 5, by contributing to the wartime Palestine land program, was issued today by Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Jewish National-Fund in the United States.

"The 1872nd anniversary of the destruction of the Jewish Homeland by the legions of encient Rome in a drive for world conquest, not unsimilar to the one which is being resisted by the free world today, conveys to us end to the world a message of transcandentel importence," Rabbi Goldstein's appeal said. "For centuries Jews alone knew the bitter taste of Tisha B'Av. Today Jews are not the only people on whose destruction the forces of hatred and evil are bent. During the past several years the Czechs, the Poles, the Norwegians, the Dutch, the Belgians, the French, the Yugoslavs and the Creeks have come to know the meaning of national catestrophs.

Win our people's history Tisha B'Av epitomizes the beginning of the Galuth - life in exile. Tisha B'Av, however, also epitomizes the yearning for the end of the Galuth and the resolve to bring about national redemption and reconstruction through the re-establishment of the union between the people and the land. Pursuing this objective through our support for the wartime program of the Jewish Mational Fund in Palestine, we are not only helping to strengthen the defenses of the Jewish National Home and increase the powers of resistance at a vital sector of democracy's front, but, as a people long experienced in resistance to oppression and defection, are also helping to strengthen the Will to Victory of the other nations that have been brutally victimized, despoiled and subjugated."

YIDDISH PRESS IN BRAZIL WILL APPEAR IN PORTUGUESE

SAO PAULO, ERAZIL, Aug. 1. (JTA) -- The three Yiddish-language newspapers published in Brasil announced today that they will begin to appear in Portuguese, in accordance with the new ordinance which prohibits the publication of foreign-language newspapers in Brasil.

The ordinence, issued in February, was supposed to have gone into effect yesterday. At the last minute, however, it was announced that it will become effective on August 51st. The ordinence also effects all Polish, Italian, German and other foreign-language newspapers in the country. The three Yiddish papers involved are the Yiddishe Volkszeitung, a daily newspaper, and the Yiddishe Presse, a weekly, both appearing in Rio de Janeiro, and the Yiddishe Zeitung of Sao Paulo, published three times a week.
