### JEWISH STATEMENT ON NAZI ATROCITIES IGNORED AT INTER-ALLIED CONFERENCE IN LONDON

LONDON, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- Jewish leaders here are greatly disappointed over the fact that a statement on Jewish sufferings in Nazi-occupied countries was completely ignored at the session of the Inter-Allied conference held in St. James Palace today, at which representatives of Poland, Belgium, Greece, Czechoslovakia, Holland, Norway, Yugoslavia, Free France and Luxemburg pledged themselves to "punish all those guilty and responsible during the war for acts of violence against the civilian population."

The Jewish statement was prepared by the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board of Jewish Deputies. It was addressed to Gen. Sikorski, Polish Premier, who presided at today's session. The communication, however, was not read to the assembled delegates by the Polish premier. The Jews and their plight under the Nazis were mentioned at the session only once, and then only incidentally by the foreign minister of Luxemburg.

In its statement, the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board of Jewish Deputies referred to the sufferings of Jews as victims of Nazi atrocities in all territories occupied by the Nazis. It drew the attention of the Inter-Allied Conference to the fact that Jews are being treated with special brutality by the Nazis. It emphasized the fact that Jews are being mercilessly herded into ghettos and deliberately tortured to death by the Nazis through hunger, epidemics and refusal of a minimum of medical aid. It pointed out that the Jews of the democratic countries especially welcome the creation of the Inter-Allied Conference which will make one of its principal war aims the apprehension, trying and sentencing of all those guilty of violence against civilians in the Nazi-occupied territories, irrespective of nationality.

At today's session the nine nations participating in the Inter-Allied Conference signed a four-point declaration, placing amongst their principal war aims the punishment of Nazis responsible for the present atrocities committed against the civilian population. This declaration was not signed by the United States, Britain, Russia and China. In addition to the statement sent to today's session by the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board of Jewish Deputies, some Jewish refugee groups in London have sent petitions to the Inter-Allied Conference asking a hearing at the proper time.

### ALL JEWS EXPELLED FROM BELGRADE; MANY SHOT; FATE OF OTHERS UNKNOWN

JERUSALEM, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- Not a single Jew is now left in Belgrade, Nazi-occupied capital of Yugoslavia where 9,000 Jews resided before the Nazi occupation, a report received today by Yugoslav circles here states.

The report informs that all Jews were expelled from Belgrade by order of the Nazi authorities. Many of the Jewish men have been shot as "communists" while the fate and whereabouts of the others is unknown. The Jewish women and children have been deported to neighboring villages where they are compelled to do forced labor twelve hours daily.

JDC ANNOUNCES RELIEF PROGRAM FOR 500,000 POLISH JEWS IN RUSSIA

NEW YORK, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- A substantial program of aid to half a million needy Polish Jews in Russia has been started by the Joint Distribution Committee, it was announced today by Joseph C. Hyman, Executive Vice-Chairman of the J.D.C.

Organization of this relief work is well under way, Mr. Hyman said, and preparations are being made to send a first shipment of clothing, medicine and other urgently needed supplies. The J.D.C. program has been undertaken in collaboration with the Polish Government-in-exile. The Polish authorities are organizing a major relief program on a non-sectarian basis for Polish nationals in Russia, comprising a million five hundred thousand non-Jews as well as half a million Polish Jews there. The Council of Polish Organizations in the United States and other organizations are likewise contributing to this program.

The J.D.C. has made available an initial allocation of \$50,000 out of a first appropriation of \$100,000 for Polish relief in Russia, Mr. Hyman said. Jan Ciechanowsky, the Polish Ambassador in Washington, has written to Edward M. M. Warburg, Chairman of the J.D.C., confirming the arrangement and stating that a first shipment of 600 tons of clothing is about to be sent to Russia on a Soviet ship. Further purchases of concentrated foodstuffs and medical supplies are now being negotiated.

J.D.C. appropriations, together with the funds raised by a number of Polish-American organizations and the contributions of the Polish Government, will be used for the purchase of the supplies in the United States and elsewhere in non-Axis countries, Mr. Hyman said. In accordance with an understanding between the Polish and Russian Governments, the shipments will be sent on Russian or Russian-chartered vessels without freight charge and duty free, consigned to the Polish Embassy in Kuibyshev. Distribution of the supplies in Russia will be supervised by local committees of Polish citizens, Jewish and non-Jewish. Ambassador Ciechanowsky has furnished the J.D.C. with a list of Polish Jews who have been named to these committees. Among them are some who are well known to the J.D.C. because they collaborated with it in relief and reconstruction work in Poland for many years.

CANADIAN JEWISH CONGRESS SENDS MESSAGE OF ENCOURAGEMENT TO JEWS UNDER NAZI REGIME

MONTREAL, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- Solidarity with the Jews of Nazi-oppressed European countries was expressed in a message of encouragement sent to them by the Canadian Jewish Congress last night following the closing of its three-day plenary session at which Samuel Bronfman was re-elected national president.

The session also adopted a resolution expressing "admiration for the magnificent struggle of the Russian people" and urging the Soviet government to release imprisoned or exiled Zionists. Another resolution demands that Jews in Palestine be allowed "to fight under their own flag as do all other allied nations."

In its message to the Jews in Nazi-held countries, the Canadian Jewish Congress said: "Courage, fellow Jews. The time is not far distant when the fetters which shackle your bodies and degrade your spirits, will be struck from you and you will again be able to live as free men in an enlightened free society."

Canadian Jewry was called upon in one of the resolutions to make still greater contributions and sacrifices to Canada's war effort. Other resolutions call for adherence of the Congress to the Inter-American Jewish Council recently formed at the Pan-American Jewish Conference in Baltimore, for participation in the World Jewish Congress and for unstinting support to the Jewish Agency.

QUEEN WILHELMINA IS HOST TO JEWS WHO ESCAPED FROM HOLLAND

LONDON, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- A Dutch Jew and his wife who succeeded in escaping from Nazi-occupied Holland in a 65-hour perilous crossing of the North Sea were today the guests of Queen Wilhelmina, and reported to her concerning the hardships which the population in Holland is enduring under the Nazis.

"It was very risky to cross the sea," the escaped woman told a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, "but life for Jews in occupied Holland is so terrible that we decided to take the risk. Not a single Jew in Holland is today sure of his life." The woman, who is thirty-five years old, is joining the Dutch Red Cross in London while her husband today enlisted in the Dutch air force here.

A report reaching Dutch circles here today states that 250 more Jews were this week deported from Holland to the Buchenwald concentration camp in Germany. This took place after the Nazis transferred some 200 non-Jewish Dutchmen from the Buchenwald camp to a new concentration camp in Holland, apparently with a view of making room for the new contingent of Jews which the Nazis rounded up in Holland. The seizure of Jews in the streets and at their homes has been intensified by the Nazis in Amsterdam ever since the Nazi retreat on the Soviet front, the escaped Jewish couple reported today.

JEWS IN SLOVAKIA ORDERED TO SURRENDER THEIR FURS

ZURICH, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- All Slovak Jews and Jewish-owned enterprises in Slovakia have been ordered to surrender all furs and fur-trimmed clothing to the Hlinka Guards and the S.S. men, who are now in charge of executing all the anti-Jewish laws, it was announced today by the Bratislava radio.

No explanation was given as to why the furs were required but it is thought here that the order to surrender them may be tied up with the recent drive in Germany and the occupied countries to obtain warm clothing for the German armies in the Soviet Union.

THIRD OF PALESTINE'S INCOME TAX COMES FROM TEL AVIV, OFFICIAL DATA SHOWS

JERUSALEM, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- The all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv has paid to the Palestine Government some \$100,000 in income tax since September last when this tax was introduced in the country for the first time, official figures revealed today.

The data, issued by the Palestine Government for publication, discloses that a total of £77,000 has been paid in income tax since September from all parts of Palestine. Of this sum, £25,000 were paid by inhabitants of Tel Aviv.

OTTAWA JEWRY PRESENTS TEN MOBILE KITCHENS AS GIFT TO BRITAIN

OTTAWA, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- Ottawa's Jewish community of approximately 700 families today presented War Services Minister Thorson with a cheque for the purchase of 10 mobile kitchens to be used in the Battle of Britain.

The mobile kitchens will be given to Britain through Hon. Vincent Massey, Canadian High Commissioner in the United Kingdom, with the request that they be placed by him wherever he considers they are most needed.

FORD IS URGED TO TAKE LEGAL ACTION AGAINST DISTRIBUTION OF "THE INTERNATIONAL JEW"

NEW YORK, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- Henry Ford, whose letter condemning anti-Semitism was made public Sunday by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, was today asked by L. M. Birkhead, national director of Friends of Democracy, to take legal action against all persons who continue to distribute a Ford publication, "The International Jew," which the motor magnate repudiated in 1927.

Birkhead pointed out that "The International Jew," which was published by Ford in 1920, has been one of the spearheads of the Nazi propaganda campaign throughout the world. Currently it is being distributed by the Ku Klux Klan in the form of a series of pamphlets which carry Ford's name on the cover.

TRACT IN PALESTINE NAMED IN HONOR OF DR. ISRAEL GOLDSTEIN

NEW YORK, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- A special area of the "Land for Victory" tracts which the Jewish National Fund is now acquiring in Palestine to further America's and the Allies' war effort in the Middle East, will bear the name of Dr. Israel Goldstein, President of the Jewish National Fund of America, it was announced today following a session of the Fund's Board of Directors held in the hotel St. Moritz. The session was held in the form of a dinner in tribute to Dr. Goldstein in appreciation of his many years of service to the Zionist cause and as President of the Fund in the United States.

JEWISH STATE PARTY HALTS NEGOTIATIONS WITH ZIONIST EXECUTIVE

LONDON, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- The Jewish State Party today announced that its negotiations with the World Zionist Executive for unity within the Zionist ranks have broken down because "constructive proposals for inner and outer policy of the Zionist Organization were rejected or unanswered."

TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF HEBREW THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE MARKED IN CHICAGO

CHICAGO, Jan. 13. (JTA)-- More than 1,500 rabbis, teachers and leaders of Jewish institutions gathered here at a banquet marking the twentieth anniversary of the founding of the Hebrew Theological College. Large delegations came from Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana, Colorado and other states to attend the ceremonies.

Rabbi Saul Silver, president of the college, pointed out that a total of 460 students had been prepared for rabbinical and teaching careers in the twenty years that the institution has been functioning. Included among these were students from such far-flung points as Palestine and South Africa. A 500-page anniversary journal, in which were published contributions from thirty prominent scholars and rabbis, was issued by the college in connection with the anniversary celebration.
