### 10,000 JEWS DEPORTED FROM GERMANY TO POLAND IN ONE WEEK; DEPORTATIONS CONTINUE

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- Ten thousand Jews were deported from Germany to Poland and other Nazi-held Eastern countries during one week this month, the Berlin becorrespondent of the Swedish newspaper Goteborgs Poster reported today.

The mass-deportations of Jews from Berlin and other German cities are being conducted on such a mage scale that civilien treffic for Germans has been restricted, the correspondent states. This, and not the typhus epidemics in Poland and the Baltics, explains why the German authorities last week suspended for several days the expulsion of Jews from the Reich and re-routed to the Czech Protectorate some of the transports with Jewish deportees, which were on their way to Lodz, Minsk, Riga and Kaunss, he adds.

On January 15, the correspondent reports, 5,000 Jews were transported from Berlin to Poland. Four days later enother transport with 5,000 Jewish deportees followed. This necessitated restricting civilian travel on trains for the third time. A twenty-five percent reduction in the normal civilian railway traffic was ordered and the mass-deportation of Jews was resumed, the Swedish journalist reports.

The Berlin correspondent of the Swedish newspaper Svenska Dagbladet reports today that the Pari outhorities announced that Jews who are taken to work in German war industries are not to benefit from the existing Labor Protection Law. Similarly, the regulations with regard to working hours are not to be applied to Jews over 18 years old.

## ZIONISTS ARRESTED IN BULGARIA; JEWISH INDUSTRIALIST SEIZED IN CROATIA

ANKARA, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- Reliable reports received here today from Bulgaria state that a number of Zionists, mostly members of the New Zionist Organization, have been arrested in Sofia, charged with conducting secret emigration of Bulgarian Jews to Turkey with a view of later securing passage for them to Pelestine.

The reports also inform that Baron Guttman, who was one of the largest Jewish industrialists in Yugoslavia, has been arrested and all his property and factories confiscated by the government of the Nazi puppet-state of Croatia.

The Utro, a Bulgarian newspaper reaching here today, reports that a Bulgarian version of the anti-Semitic film "The Eternal Jew" is now being shown all over Bulgaria. The first showing took place in Sofia last week at the Gloria theatre.

# AIR-RAID SHELTER ERECTED IN JERUSALEM NEAR WAILING WALL

#### ROSENWALD, RABBI SILVER, RABBI J.B. WISE ELECTED NATIONAL CHAIRMEN OF U.J.A. FOR 1942

NEW YORK, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- William Rosenwald, President of the National Refugee Service, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal and Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, Fund-Raising Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee, have been elected to serve as 1942 National Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, the unified fund-raising drive for these three major American rescue agencies, it was announced here today.

Upon assuming the tasks of National Chairmen of the 1942 United Jewish Appeal, Rabbi Silver, Rabbi Wise and Mr. Rosenwald issued a joint statement in which they summoned Jewish communities throughout the country to give wider support to the United Jewish Appeal not only as a means of meeting the increased needs of large numbers of Jews confronted with the problems of war and oppression, but also of siding the worldwide front for democracy.

The National Chairmen outlined as follows the 1942 needs and programs of the Joint Distribution Committee, United Palestine Appeal and National Refugee Service:

#### Relief Program of the Joint Distribution Committee for 1942

The J.D.C. which in 1941 spent \$5,694,100 bringing direct sid to 950,000 Jews in fifty countries on five continents, must, according to the amountment, mong other tasks, continue to aid Jews in neutral countries of the old world; to aid refugees to emigrate to safety from Portugal and other neutral countries, from which limited emigration continues; to provide sustemance, in cooperation with the Polish Government-in-Exile, for 600,000 Polish-Jewish refugees who fled before the advance of the Nazi war machine and are now living in destitution in Asiatic Russia; to provide essistence for hundreds of thousands in enemy-occupied territories such as Polend, Bungary, Rumania and Shanghai where, following the recedent of the last war, local committees have been authorized to borrow funds on the guarantee of the J.D.C. to repay when that can be done without siding the enemy. These commitments for the next six months total \$1,500,000. On a minimal basis, for the first half of 1942, the Joint Distribution Committee needs \$5,200,000.

# United Palestine Appeal and N.R.S. Obligations for the Year

The United Palestine Appeal must provide in 1942 for the absorption, edjustment and retraining of thousands of refugees who continue to emigrate to Palestine from Russia, Syrta, Turkey, Iran, Iraq, Yemen and Austrelie. It must purchase land and also help to establish from eight to ten colonies vital for food production, refugee settlement and for post-war absorption of thousands of homeless Jews; to maintain measures for the assurance of internal security of the Jews in Palestine; to stimulate trade and industry, artisans and small trades, so that increased materials may be made available to the British army; and to support the Jewish school system, which now has a student body of 60,000 Jewish children. The sum of \$8,037,527 will be required for these activities in 1942.

The National Refugee Service has, in 1942, the responsibility of acting as an essential limison organization between the federal government and Jewish communities concerning refugee status and control, and providing the communities with prompt information and advice on these matters. War has also increased the other obligations of the N.R.S. A rising relief program, due to the unemployment caused both by a "priorities depression" and wartime anti-alien sentiment, must be met by N.R.S. so no refugee will become a burden to the public. The N.R.S. program for resettling refugees easy from the major ports of entry continues with government permission and will be an important part of the agency's work. The N.R.S. spent \$5,059,295 in 1941.

### TEL AVIV ISSUES CALL TO COMBAT TERROPISM; THIRD VICTIM DIES OF TIME BOND EXPLOSION

TRL AVIV, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- Measures to prevent terrorism in this city, especially a repetition of the bomb explosions which took the lives of three police officials this week, were discussed today at a special session of the municipality attended by Issae Ben-Zvi, president of the Jewish National Council of Pelettic.

While the municipality was in session, the news came that Folice Inspector G.Y. Turton had died from injuries he received on Tuesday when a time bomb exploded in a private mouse. He was the third wictim or the explosion. Deputy Superintendent of Police Shlomo Shiff was killed instantly by the blast on Tuesday and constable Nachum Goldman died from injuries on Wednesday.

Condemning these terroristic activities, the Tel Aviv Municipality today issued a cell to the population to assist the authorities in "uprooting this evil." Articles condemning the terror are published today in all the leading Jewish newspapers here.

Davar, the largest Hebrew daily in Pelestine, in a leading editorial today states that "this new crime is added to a long chain committed by a band of perpetrators, showing that they are prepared to go very far if not stopped. They are willing to and might succeed in runing the entire Yishab. Defense against this band is, therefore, a tark of the greatest national importance. The entire lishub and each member must essist in uproving them."

The Hamsshkiff, another large Hebrew daily newspaper, in its editorial declares: "The acts of robbery and murder which have occurred recently are disastrous to the entire Yishub. While the Jewish nation is doing its utmost and stending as an ally in the death struggle against Hitlerism, such crimes are disturbing the war affort and normal activities of the Yishub. This crime is vile because it was committed against a superincement who served in the Jewish Legion and who was preised for bravery in defending the Yishub during the disturbances. Licenticusness and crime have reached a peak. Their prevention is imperative."

## CZECHO-POLISH PACT GUARANTEES EQUAL RIGHTS TO ALL CITIZENS

LONION, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- Equal civil and religious rights for all citizens are currenteed in the post-war confederation agreement signed here today by the governments of Polend and Czechoslovakia.

The constitution of both states and any other nation that may become a signatory of the pact, must contain the following guarantees: 1. Freedom of conscience; 2. personal freedom; 5. freedom of learning, 4. freedom of the spoken and written word; 5. freedom of organization and association; 6. equality of all citizens before the law; 7. free admission of all citizens to performance of all state functions; 8. independence of the courts of law; 9. control of government by representative national bodies elected by means of free elections.

### BELGIANS THROW STENCH BOMBS IN THEATRE IN PROTEST AGAINST ANTI-JEWISH FILM

LISEON, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- A Nazi-sponsored showing of the anti-Semitic propagands film "Jew Suess" in a large Brussels theatre recently precipitated an anti-Nazi riot, it was reported today by Belgian circles here.

The demonstrators within the theatre threw stench bombs, flung about enti-Jewish leeflets which had been distributed to them and shouted "Long Live Free Belgium." The Nazi authorities unable to quell the disturbance were finally forced to stop the show and clear the theatre.

# ZIONISTS TAKE ISSUE WITH N.Y. TIMES ANTI-ZIONIST EDITORIAL; CALL PROTEST MEETING

NEW YORK, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- The American Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs today announced its decision to call a meeting in Cernegie Hall to protest against the views expressed in the editorial in yesterday's Wew York Times in which opposition was voiced against the formation of a Zionist Army in Palestine and the post-wer establishment of a Zionist State there.

Declaring that it "is leunching a nation-wide campaign to mobilize public opinion in support of a Jewish Army in Palestine, details of which will follow shortly," the Emergency Committee issued the following statement to the press:

"The New York Times' unfortunate regression to appeasement and distortion is calculated to serve the democratic cause no good. The Jewish people claim the right granted to all other peoples who have been the victims of Fascism to make their maximum contribution to the democratic victory and to defend with every resource at their command the soil which they have reclaimed with their blood and sweat and toil and tears. To impute ulterior motives to that demand is to slur not only the Jewish people but every other oppressed nation which has taken up arms against aggression and tyranny. The search for arguments against the establishment of separate Jewish units in the British army is nothing but an attempt to disguise the real purpose of that opposition - appeasement of the Arab populations in the Near East. Until the democratic powers recognize that the results of appeasement in the Near East are bound to be no less disastrous than they were in every other part of the world, and until they great to the Jews as they have granted to all other peoples the opportunity to make their maximum contribution to victory, the ultimate triumph of justice and freedom is being delayed and endangered."

### Wise Calls Times Editorial "Blow Below Belt"

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, former President of the Zionist Organization of America, Chairman of the American Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs and President of the American Jewish Congress, made public the following statement: "Zionists and non-Zionists are in the midst of what were imagined by us to be friendly negotiations with respect to the Zionist position vis-a-vis the Peace Conference. I have no hesitation in saying that this is a blow below the belt.

"I am losth to believe, though all but constrained to do so, that this editorial is designed to serve as a warning to men like Secretary Knox and Secretary Morgentheu, whose brave and generous words to the Cleveland Conference are hardly understandable to the Editor of the New York Times. The Times may have enother end more sinister purpose to sabotage all efforts to bring about understanding between Zionists and non-Zionists. One is tempted to say to the New York Times that it has never dared, despite its Jewish ownership, to stand up and out on any Jewish problem. Will not the New York Times, therefore, be good enough to leave the Jews alone in their problems, policies and difficulties?"

### FASCISTS ATTEMPT TO SET FIRE TO TURIN SYNAGOGUE

A watchman smothered the blaze before it spread to other parts of the building. This is the second case of attempted aron aimed at synagogues in Italy this year.
