### EXPULSION OF JEWS FROM CZECH CITIES RESUMED BY NAZIS; PILSEN MADE "JUDENREIN"

ZURICH, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- The Czech city of Pilsen is to become "Judenrein" by the end of this week, according to information published in the Nova Doba, a Nazi-controlled newspaper in the Czech Protectorate, reaching here today.

The paper reports that a large group of Jews were transported from Pilsen to an "unknown destination" on January 15 and that two more transports will follow this week. The remainder of the Jewish population will be "moved" from Pilsen to neighboring villages and will be put to "useful work," the report states.

The Nazi authorities in the Czech Protectorate have, according to other reports reaching here today, also started ruthless expulsions of Jews from other cities in Bohemia and Moravia. Der Neue Tag, the leading newspaper appearing in Prague, publishes every day a list of death sentences carried out in Bohemia and Moravia, from which it can be noted that a large number of Jews in the Protectorate are either being shot or hanged. The same paper publishes daily lists of Jews sentenced to various prison terms and fines for alleged violation of the food rationing laws.

### MUFTI URGES ARABS TO PRAY "FOR SUCCESSFUL MOSLEM REVOLT" IN INDIA, PALESTINE, SYRIA

CAIRO, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- The ex-Mufti of Jerusalem who is now in Hitler's service as his chief propagandist for the Moslem world, today issued an appeal to the Arabs to pray for a successful Moslem revolt in India, Iraq, Palestine, Syria and other countries in the East. The appeal, broadcast from German and Italian stations in Arabic, also urged the Arabs to pray for the fall of Singapore.

The "Regime Fascista," Italian anti-Semitic organ, which reached here today from Rome, carries an article stating that the British are deliberately favoring "Jewish infiltration" in Egypt. Intended to stimulate both anti-British and anti-Jewish feelings among the Arabs in Egypt, the article declares that since 1900 the number of Jews in Egypt has increased from 25,000 to 92,000.

"Although these figures do not seem very important when compared with the 10,000,000 Egyptians," says the journal, "it must be remembered that the Jews have succeeded, with the help of the English, in gaining many of the key positions in the country. Thus, the banks, and especially the press, of Egypt are very largely in Jewish hands.

"Eighteen of the twenty French newspapers published in Cairo are under Jewish influence," the "Regime Fascista" declares, "as well as three of the newspapers published there in English. Four of the six Alexandria papers are Jewish, while the French newspapers published in Port Said are owned by Jews."

JEWISH FEDERATIONS ASKED TO CONTRIBUTE \$150,000 FOR COLONIZATION IN SOSUA

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds throughout the country, exclusive of New York City, were today approached by the Dominican Republic Settlement Association with an appeal to contribute \$150,000 towards the 1942 budget of \$250,000 necessary to conduct the Jewish settlement work in the Dominican Republic, it was disclosed by James N. Rosenberg, chairman of the Association.

The appeal, signed by Leon Falk, Jr., president, James N. Rosenberg, chairman, and Dr. Joseph A. Rosen, chairman of the executive committee, points to the fact that the successful Jewish colonization in the Dominican Republic may have an important effect on post-war Jewish immigration in Latin-American countries. Three such countries are already conducting discussions with the executive officers of the Dorsa with a view of having Jews settled in their territories, along the same lines as this is being done in the Dominican Republic.

Mr. Leon Falk, Jr., who is returning tomorrow from the Jewish settlement of Sosua in the Dominican Republic, will, together with James N. Rosenberg and Dr. Joseph A. Rosen, appear next week at the General Assembly of the Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds in Chicago to personally support the appeal. The appeal which is also supported by a letter from James G. McDonald in his capacity as a member of the President's Advisory Committee on Political Refugees, emphasizes that the Jewish settlement scheme in the Dominican Republic "is the only concrete result of the meeting of 32 nations convened by President Roosevelt at Evian in 1938."

PHILADELPHIA JEWISH WOMAN MAKES IMPORTANT DISCOVERY AT HEBREW UNIVERSITY IN JERUSALEM

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- A former Philadelphian, Mrs. Ruth Schimmel Hoffman, who majored in biology at the University of Pennsylvania, has collaborated on what may be one of the most important discoveries in the annals of medical science, made during laboratory experiments at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, it was announced here by the headquarters of the Zionist Organization of America.

Mrs. Hoffman discovered that an extract from the tissues of animals heals wounds which have failed to respond to ordinary treatment. Sensational results have been obtained in tests of experimental cases in both civil and military hospitals of Palestine. Among cases which were described as remarkable, was that of a soldier who, after one year of the only medical help available, was expected to have his leg amputated. After being treated by the new method he completely recovered the use of his leg in three weeks.

PUBLIC TRUST FOUNDATION FORMED TO PUBLISH "THE DAY," N.Y. YIDDISH NEWSPAPER

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- The Day, national Yiddish daily published in New York since its founding in 1914 by the late Herman Bernstein, will henceforth appear under the auspices of a public trust foundation, it was announced yesterday by Louis Lipsky, who has been chosen to head the foundation. Associated with Mr. Lipsky as vice-president and managing director is Morris Margulies, former secretary of the Zionist Organization of America. Dr. Samuel Margoshes, associated with The Day for over twenty years, will continue to serve as editor-in-chief.

The announcement adds that any profits which may accrue from the publication will be used for Jewish public purposes. The editorial policy of The Day, which since its inception has been non-partisan in national and local politics as well as on Jewish questions, will retain its independence, it is stated in the announcement.

DECREE FORCING JEWS TO DON MOGEN DAVIDS EXPECTED IN NORWAY; PROPAGANDA INCREASING

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- A decree ordering all Jews in Norway to don yellow Mogen David badges is expected soon as a result of the appointment this week of M. Fugelsand, liaison officer between the German occupation authorities and the Quisling party, as chief of all anti-Jewish activities in the country, it is reported here today by the Dagens Nyheter, a Swedish newspaper.

Since the appointment of Fugelsand, who is Chief of the Norwegian State Secretariat, anti-Jewish propaganda in Norway has become increasingly severe, the Stockholm paper writes. It is understood that far-reaching laws aimed at Jews are being prepared, the paper adds.

Intensification of anti-Jewish activities in Norway is similarly reported today by the Svenska Dagbladet. Discussing Norwegian reaction to the anti-Semitic drive, the Dagbladet writes: "One can easily imagine the reaction of Norwegian patriots to the labored anti-Jewish propaganda, as the Jewish problem hardly existed in Norway."

Nazi Press In Denmark Warned To Cease Drive For Anti-Jewish Laws

A warning to the Danish Nazi press, addressed especially to the Nordschleswigsche Zeitung, organ of the German minority in Denmark, to cease its "useless incitement" aimed at securing the introduction of the anti-Jewish laws in the country, is published in the Danish paper Fredrickshaven Avis, reaching here today.

Assailing the rumors concerning the imposition of the Nuremberg Laws on Danish Jews, the newspaper reminds the Nazis that Denmark adopted German children during the last war "not because of a preference for Germans." "We have no special preference for Jews, but we wish them to have the same human rights enjoyed by other people because the tradition of equal justice is deeply rooted in the Danish mind," the paper says.

JEWISH AGENCY SEEKING \$800,000 FROM PALESTINE GOVERNMENT FOR AGRICULTURE, INDUSTRY

JERUSALEM, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- The Executive of the Jewish Agency is negotiating with the Palestine Government for \$800,000 to be used for the enlargement of agricultural and industrial facilities in the country, it was revealed today by Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Agency.

At the same time Kaplan announced that the Agency's war expenditures for the past two years totalled \$6,872,000. The "lion's share" of this sum came from the United States, Kaplan stated. The expenditures were apportioned as follows over the two-year period, he reported: thirty percent for agricultural colonization; seventeen percent for labor and housing; eleven percent for urban colonization; seven percent for education and culture; eighteen percent for national organization and security measures; ten percent for immigration activities; six percent for administration, including payment of interest on loans and one percent for health and social work. In addition about \$8,000 was distributed every month to the families of men who had enlisted in the army.

JEWISH RABBINICAL ORGANIZATIONS BACK FDR INFANTILE PARALYSIS CAMPAIGN

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- The Central Conference of American Rabbis, the United Synagogues of America and the Union of American Hebrew Congregations today each issued a call asking the Jews of America to support the "Fight Infantile Paralysis Campaign," which is conducted by the Committee for the Celebration of the President's Birthday.

RABBI WISE CRITICIZES, PROF. MORRIS COHEN APPROVES N.Y. TIMES' ANTI-ZIONIST EDITORIAL

NEW YORK, Jan. 26. (JTA)-- Two statements, one approving and the other disapproving the views expressed by the New York Times in an editorial last week opposing the formation of a "Zionist Army" and the post-war establishment of a "Zionist State" are published today on the editorial page of the New York Times. The statement criticizing the editorial is signed by Dr. Stephen S. Wise in his capacity as chairman of the American Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs. The statement praising the editorial comes from Morris Raphael Cohen, professor emeritus of philosophy at the New York City College.

Declaring that there has been no demand for the formation of a "Zionist Army," Dr. Wise says in his statement: "The proposal envisaged, not the formation of a separate Jewish army, but the organization of a Jewish military force as an integral part of the British and Allied commands. The proposal was born of the profound conviction that thousands of Jews in Palestine could make their most effective contribution to the defeat of Fascism if they were organized under their own flag and fighting in the name of their own people. General approval of Dr. Weizmann's proposal was given by Mr. Churchill's government; and preliminary steps toward formulating a plan for the organization of the Jewish divisions were taken. No effective action, however, followed. The proposal, approved in principle, was stymied in its implementations by a series of improvised objections. None of the arguments that have been advanced against the formation of a Jewish military force can stand the test of objective scrutiny."

Dr. Wise then argues against the fear expressed in the N. Y. Times' editorial that the establishment of a Jewish military force in Palestine would be tantamount to sanctioning creation of a Jewish national home in that country. "Such views," Rabbi Wise writes, "are wholly invalidated by the facts and come a quarter of a century too late. The justice of the Zionist claim was recognized some twenty years ago by the representatives of over fifty nations at San Remo. The purpose of the Balfour Declaration was integrated in a policy of this country by a Congressional resolution adopted in 1922 and signed by the President of the United States. That policy has since been reaffirmed by every American President."

Jewish Negotiations With Arabs Urged by Prof. Cohen

Prof. Morris Raphael Cohen, in approving of the anti-Zionist views expressed by the N.Y. Times' editorial, says: "It seems too obvious for discussion that the desperate need of defending the eastern gateway to the Mediterranean and the oil fields of Iraq and Iran, whether by a separate Jewish army or by one based on the general Near East population, which is predominantly Arab, is something that must be left to the military authorities in touch with the actual situation without interference on the part of laymen in a country thousands of miles away.

"Perhaps not so obvious, but certainly no less important, is the warning against the false or near-sighted nationalistic philosophy behind this proposal - namely, that the cruel sufferings of the Jews can be removed by setting up a politically independent Jewish State in Palestine. No one at all acquainted with the horrible plight of the harassed Jews in Hitler-ruled Europe doubts that hundreds of thousands, and perhaps millions, of Jews will have to leave Europe to find living room elsewhere, and that for material as well as moral reasons Palestine offers a haven to them. Elementary political sense and decency, however, must recognize that Palestine can be made available for this purpose only by negotiations with the native Arab population of the country. No people will submit to being made a minority in their own land. Against any such attempt the Arabs will certainly fight, and in such a fight they will have the support not only of 30,000,000 fellow-Arabs but the sympathy of all lovers of democracy and fair play."
