NAZY DECREE FORBIDS JEWS IN POLAND TO BUY ANY FOOD EXCEPT RATIONED BREAD, SUGAR

BERNE, March 27. (JTA) -- The Jewish population in Poland, already living under conditions of virtual stervetion, has been forbidden to purchase any food extept neager rations of bread and sugar, by a new Nazi decree reported in the German newspapers reaching here today.

At the same time, the Mazi authorities in Poland are cancelling the Polisi.
passports of the Jews in the ghetto and are replacing them with special "Jewish
passports." Polish passports of more than 500 Jews in Warsaw were recently taken
up. Similar action has been taken in Lodz and other cities.

With German reverses on the Soviet front forcing the Nazls to withdraw some of their troops from Foland, specially trained Ukrainians have taken over guard duties in most of the Jewish labor camps. The Ukrainians have been officially instructed to maintain the Nazi standards of severity in dealing with the Jewish inmates of the camps.

SPREAD OF TYPHUS AMONG JEWS IN HUNGARY AND YUGOSLAVIA REPORTED BY NAZI PRESS

ZURICH, March 27. (JTA) - Wasi papers report today that typhus has broken out among the Jews intermed in the Zovnik concentration comp in Yugoslevia and also in the Jewish quarters of the Hungarian towns of Gyor-Raab and Hodmozo-Wasarhely. Local authorities in the two Hungarian townships have isolated the areas where typhus has been found and the Jewish communities are hempered in their efforts to combat the spidemic by the scarcity of food and medicine.

The Hungarian Minister of the Interior has edmitted that a typhus epidemic in Carpatho-Russia has assumed alarming proportions. He mentioned particularly the them of Koerossmanee where almost the entire Jewish population has contracted the disease.

WAR CONDITIONS MAKING IT DIFFICULT FOR ENGLISH JEWS TO SECURE MATZOHS

LONDON, March 27. (JTA) - Many Jews in England have so far been unable to secure matsons for Passover as a result of the war conditions, it was revealed to-day when the Beth Din, the rabbinical council, appealed to rabbis throughout the country to devise means of securing sufficient matsons for all English Jews.

Declaring that there was a serious shortage of matsohs, the Beth Din asked those persons who were well supplied to spare whatever quantities they could for distribution among those who have been unable to secure any of the unleavened bread. A special appeal will be made tomorrow from the pulpits of all synagogues, in order to make possible a leat-minute distribution of matsohs.

"SOCIAL JUSTICE" THREATENS AMERICAN JEWS WITH POGROMS

DETROIT, March 27. (JTA) -- Apparently undisturbed by the reports that the Department of Justice has ordered an investigation into it cangerous un-petriolic propaganda, Social Justice, mouthpiece of Rather Coughlin today published inciting anti-Jewish articles threatening the Jews of America with pogrous.

Affeging that "Jews plot to ben Social Justice," the enti-Semitic organ writes that it could discontinue publication of its own volution salzing this opportunity to blame the Jews for its liquidation. There we to succeed to such a saturic temptation, the pograms which crissoned the soil of Europe would rank as a poor second to what would occur on the streets of New York," the mosthpiece of the letroit priest says.

Another inciting erticl covering the entire back cover-page of the magesine, under the title "And They Killed Christ," exploits the death of Jesus in an ettempt to impress its readers with the idea that Jews have been murderess ever since the tice of Christ.

SATURDAY EVENING POST ASKED TO WITHDRAW ISSUE CAPRYING "CASK AGAINST JEWS" ARTICLE

NEW YORK, March 27. (JTA) -- A demand that the current issue of the Saturday Evening Post, containing an article by Milton S. Mayor entitled "The Case Agelust the Jaws" be withdrawn from circulation "in the interests of America and in the interests of our soldiers," was made today by the Non-Sectorian anti-Nazi League.

"The Case Against America', "seid the letter signed by Prof. James d. Sheldon, chairsen of the Leegue's board. The letter, addressed to the sublishers, pointed out that the article "plays into the heads of News propagandists and will be used in further etterns to split the unity of the United States at wer."

JEWISH AGENCY ISSUES URGENT CALL FOR MEN AND WOMEN TO JOIN BRITISH FORCES

JEUSALEM, Merch 27. (JTA) -- Declaring that "Jewish honor end the rescue of Pelestine" necessitates the most urgent action, the Jewish Transy for Pelestine rodey issued a proclamation calling upon able-bodied Jewish Teneny former in Pelestine to join the British forces "to defend our country and the Middle Zest."

The Agency's proclemation stated that "masses of volunteers are needed for Jewish units within the British forces." It also urged "thousands of women to join the Pelestine Women's, Auxiliary Territorial Corps." It particularly appealed to childless, married persons, between the ages of twenty and thirty to enlist, and requested that those in other categories join immediately without working their turn.

DR. WETZMANNIS EXPECTED IN THE UNITED STATES WITHIN THE NEXT FEW DAYS

NEW YORK, March 27. (JTA) -- The errival of Dr. Chaim Weizzenn in New York is expected any day, according to edvices received from London by American Zionist leaders.

The American Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs today announced that it has received more than 600 messages from rabbis in the United States approving the formation of a Jewish military force in Palestine. Congressmen Andrew L. Somers, of Brooklyn, in a speech before the House yesterdey asked that President Roosevelt appoint an American general to find the best and most expedient way to create a Jewish military unit in the Middle East composed of Palestine Jews.

JEWISH YOUTH IN UNOCCUPIED FRANCE FACED WITH STARVATION OR WORKING FOR NAZIS

LONDON, March 27. (JTA) - Jewish youths in unoccupied France find themselves faced with the tragic dilemna of starring or working in ermament factories which supply the Nazis' war machine, according to information reaching Free Franch circles here today.

While the Jews in the Nazi-occupied section of France have been set to compulsory labor under the same conditions prevailing for Jews in Germany, those in the unoccupied zone have not been officially forced to work in factories. Constant tightening up of the anti-Jewish restrictions by Viohy, however, is gradually depriving these youths of all opportunities to curn a livelihood, except by joining the training centers which have been established by the Viohy authorities to supply labor for factories working on German war orders.

Apparently the chief reason for the recently increased Nazi pressure on Vichy for more rigid application of the anti-Jewish decrees is the desire to secure Jewish manpower in unoccupied France for use by the Germans, the Free French circles declered.

GOV. LEHMAN, PROF. EINSTEIN LAUD JTA'S IMPORTATE IN JEMISH LIFE

NEW YORK, March 27. (JTA) -- Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Prof. Albert Einstein, Hrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, Wendell L. Willkie and many other Jewish and non-Jewish personalities today joined the numerous organizations and institutions throughout the country in sending messages of congratulations to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency on the occasion of its twenty-fifth anniversary.

Governor Lehman, in his message, stated: "I have been acquainted with the work of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency ever since its inception. It has devoted itself to the gathering and distribution of information concerning those of our faith here and abroad. It has furnished to the press and to individuals accurate and impartial information and has frequently interpreted Jewish life to the non-Jewish world. It has rendered a very real service. Please accept my congratulations and my best wishes for continued success."

Prof. Binstein sent the following message: "The information disseminated by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency regarding all major problems concerning Jewish life is considered by me as of great merit and importance. Wilkie, in a statement, wrote: "I was delighted to learn that this is the twenty-fifth emiversary of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and went to offer my most sincere congratulations on the fine work you have done and are doing. The Agency has at all times lived up to the best traditions of newspaper coverage. I hope that in the years to come you will have even greater success in a world where freedom of the press as you have practiced it, will be once again assured to all peoples."

Mrs. Roosevelt, in a letter of congratulations, declared: "I have been interested to learn that the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is celebrating the twenty-fifth amiversary of its existence and I am happy to have an opportunity to extend congratulations and best wishes to all those connected with this organization. I hope that during the years to come the Agency will be in a position to render even greater service to those it has served so faithfully for a quarter of a century."

Mrs. Felix M. Warburg, in lauding the JTA, said: "I never miss reading the reports of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and feel that it keeps me in close touch with the Jewish happenings all over the world. Judge Louis E.
