DEPORTATION OF ALL JEWS FROM REICH, HOLLAND, BELGIUM, FRANCE TO BE COMPLETED THIS MONTH

ZURICH, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- The deportation of all Jews from Germany, Austria, Holland, Belgium and occupied France will be completed by the end of September, it was reported here today from Berlin.

The report says that orders have been issued to the Gestapo in all these countries to speed the deportation of Jews to Poland and occupied Russia.

The Swiss press reports today that the ex-Mufti of Jerusalem is now in Athens where the Nazis have opened a school for Arab propagandists.

SOVIET DIPLOMATS PROMISE INTERVENTION FOR ZIONISTS IN RUSSIA

JERUSALEM, Aug. 31. (JTA)--A promise that they will discuss with the central authorities in Russia the question of enabling Zionists and stranded Palestine citizens to leave the USSR for Palestine was given here today by the two Soviet diplomats, Pavel Michailovich and M. Petrenko, who came here from Ankara to attend the conference of the Palestine League to Aid Russia.

The pledge was made by the Russian representatives at a press conference held today prior to their departure for Ankara. The two diplomats asked the Jewish press to convey to the Yishuv their thanks for their warm reception and indicated the possibility of an exchange of visits by journalists of Russia and Palestine. "We were greatly impressed with the economic and cultural achievements of the Jews in Palestine where hundreds of thousands of Jews have received the opportunity to build a new and happier life on a new basis," Michailovitch declared.

The Soviet diplomats today visited the headquarters of the Jewish Agency and the Jewish National Council and bade official farewells. The delegation also met with leaders of the Arab Anti-Fascist Committee. The meeting took place at the farm school for Jewish girls.

POPULATION IN PALESTINE ORDERED TO REGISTER FOR BREAD WITH BAKERIES

JERUSALEM, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- An order directing the entire population of Palestine to register with their grocery-shops and bakeries for bread and flour in order to insure equal distribution of these commodities, was issued here today by the office of the Food Controller.

At the same time the office of the Jewish Agency today called a press conference at which the journalists present were urged to impress upon the Jewish population the need for speedier enlistment.

The executive of the Jewish National Council today addressed a letter to the Palestine Government asking for permission to send through a neutral country a direct cable to the Jewish Council in the Warsaw ghetto expressing the condolences of the Yishuv on the tragic death of Adam Cherniakoff, the head of the ghetto who committed suicide, and urging the Jews in the ghetto to maintain courage and patience.

JEWISH CONTRIBUTIONS TO RUSSIAN AVIATION LAUDED; NAZI POGROM IN GALICIA REPORTED

KUIBYSHEV, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- The contributions which Jews in Russia are making to the aviation industry there as engineers, factory workers and directors of aviation plants are highly praised in the Soviet press following an interview on the subject given by Alexander Wasserman, chairman of the Central Trade Union Committee for Aviation Industry in the USSR.

The press lists a number of Jews who have been decorated by the Russian Government in recognition of their intensive efforts to speed up the production of motors and combat planes. It pays special tribute to Matvei Schenkman, a Jewish engineer who is credited with "Americanizing" the Russian aviation industry after spending some time in the United States studying the methods used in American aviation plants. Schenkman, who was the head of one of the largest aviation factories in Russia and who successfully conducted the evacuation from Moscow of a number of industrial enterprises when the Nazis were close to the gates of the Russian capital, was recently killed in an airplane crash.

The Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee here today made public a number of eyewitness accounts of Jews who succeeded in escaping from the Nazi-held Ukraine, Galicia and Byelorussia. Describing the Nazi brutalities in the occupied city of Przemysl, Galicia, one of the reports reveals that the Nazis massacred 508 Jews and their families in that city in one night.

Landsmanshaften in America Asked to Aid Russian Army

A description of Nazi massacres of Jews in the city of Novozibkov, in the Ukraine, is given in the report of Abraham Zevolev, a Jewish student at Moscow University who just returned from guerrilla operations in the rear of the German lines. "The Jews in Novozibkov who remained alive were ordered by the Nazis into a ghetto and I saw with my own eyes how they were made to wear on the chests a sign reading 'Jude.'"

Pointing out that "hardly half of the Jewish population is left in Galicia after the Nazi pogroms in Przemysl, Lwow, Tarnopol and Stanislawow," the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee today issued an appeal to the Galician Jews in America asking them to urge their Landsmanshaften throughout the United States to respond to the Jewish appeal from Russia for funds to present the Russian Army with a Jewish gift of 1,000 tanks and 500 bombers. The tanks and bombers will carry names of Galician Jews, the appeal said.

Signed by Dr. Elias Wattenberg of Stanislawow who lived in America for many years, the appeal emphasizes that only the Russian Army can save the Jews in Galicia by delivering them from the hands of the Nazis "those who did not manage to escape from the Brown pestilence and remained under Nazi rule of terror or under Hitler's Hungarian henchmen and who are now suffering starvation and disease." A similar appeal is addressed to the Jews in America who have emigrated from Orsha, Vitebsk, Minsk, Mohilev, Homel, Rogachev, Babrova, Rosnova and other cities in Nazi-occupied Byelorussia. The appeal is signed by Michael Jacob Entin of Rosnova, a Nazi-held city in the Mohilev district.

JEWISH FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION TO BUY TEN TANKS FOR RUSSIAN ARMY

NEW YORK, Aug. 31.(JTA)-- A campaign to raise \$100,000 among Jews in America to purchase ten tanks for the Russian Army in response to the appeal issued by the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in Kuibyshev has been launched by the Jewish section of the International Workers Order, a fraternal organization, it was announced here today.

UNITED JEWISH COMMITTEE IN LONDON DECIDES TO RAISE FUND TO AID RUSSIA

LONDON, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- A decision to raise a special fund among the Jews of Great Britain in response to the appeal of the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in Russia to the Jews of the Allied countries to contribute 1,000 tanks and 500 bombers to the Red Army was adopted here last night at the closing session of the conference of the United Jewish Committee to Aid Russia. The meeting was attended by 150 delegates representing all shades of opinion among British Jewry.

Messages from Soviet ambassador Ilya Malisky, Prof. Selig Brodetsky, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews, Chief Rabbi Joseph Hertz and from the Anti-Fascist Jewish Committee in Kuibyshev were read to the delegates. Prof. Brodetsky's message stressed that the foe of the Soviet Union is the greatest enemy that the Jews have had in their thousands of years history. "As citizens of free Britain," he stated, "as Jews who for centuries have carried the burden of human freedom and equality, we join our fellow Jews in Russia in support of the Soviet Union for the ultimate destruction of Nazism." Chief Rabbi Hertz's message expressed his "utmost sympathy" with the aims of the conference.

RELIEF COMMITTEE FOR STARVING POPULATIONS IN NAZI EUROPE FORMED IN ENGLAND

LONDON, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- Jewish and Christian groups in Great Britain have formed a Famine Relief Committee whose purpose is to secure permission from the British Government for the shipment of food and other supplies to the starving populations of occupied Europe, it was announced here today.

The committee was formed following several conferences on the food situation in German-occupied countries which were called by Dr. Bell, Bishop of Winchester. It has been endorsed by Cardinal Hinsley and the Archbishop of Canterbury. The Bishop of Winchester, in explaining the reasons for the formation of the new committee, declared that it will press the government concerning the possibility of shipping food to the people in the occupied countries who are dying from disease and starvation. Such shipments might be sent in the same manner as relief has been furnished the people of Greece, he said.

NAVY WILL HONOR TWO JEWS BY NAMING SHIPS AFTER THEM

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- The memory of the late Samuel Gompers, founder of the American Federation of Labor, will be honored on Labor Day by the launching of a Liberty ship which will carry his name, it was announced here today.

A vessel of the destroyer type will be named after the late Ensign Ira Weil Jeffery, of Minneapolis, who died in action while aboard an American battleship during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, the Navy Department also announced. Secretary Knox honored Jeffery in a posthumous citation for his "distinguished devotion to duty and extraordinary courage and disregard of his own safety during the attack on the fleet in Pearl Harbor."

JEWS CRITICIZE APPOINTMENT OF LORD MOYNE AS DEPUTY MINISTER FOR MIDDLE EAST

LONDON, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- The appointment last week of Lord Moyne, former Colonial Secretary, to the post of British Deputy Minister of State in the Middle East "is noted with consternation and deep anxiety" in Jewish circles, according to a statement issued here today by the Emergency Committee of the New Zionist Organization.

"Lord Moyne, as Colonial Secretary, revoked the promise of his predecessor for the creation of Jewish military units in Palestine," the statement says. "In his recent speech in the House of Lords, he even aligned himself with Hitler's proposal for the settlement of Jews in Madagascar instead of Palestine. His appointment will be received by the Jewish people with regret and apprehension."

JEWISH CONFERENCE ASKS FOR RECOGNITION OF JEWISH PEOPLE AMONG UNITED NATIONS

NEW YORK, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- Addressing itself to President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and other Allied leaders, the Jewish National Workers' Alliance today adopted a resolution at the closing session of its three-day national conference, appealing "to the conscience of America, England and our gallant Allies to recognize the Jewish people in the community of the United Nations." The conference decided to launch a campaign for \$350,000 for war relief in Europe and Palestine, and for American welfare and war agencies.

Pointing out that the treatment of the Jews in Europe by the Nazis today is distinct from the plight of the other peoples of the occupied countries and that in the post-war world special consideration will have to be given the Jewish problem, the resolution says "that the nations fighting for the Four Freedoms and the principles of the Atlantic Charter for all, have a duty to end also the age-old anomalous position of the Jewish people; freedom and civic rights for the individual Jew are not enough, the Jewish people must be considered as a corporate entity, and in that spirit the Jewish problem must be attacked."

The resolution emphasizes that in Palestine Jews have demanded, since the outbreak of the war, their own army to fight the enemy wherever he may be engaged. "The recent announcement that a Palestinian regiment would be formed, while a long step forward, is not enough," the resolution maintains. "It is high time to stop playing appeasement politics in the Near East and to accept as full partners those who are willing to lay down their lives for the United Nations' cause."

"DAY OF POLISH JEWRY" MARKS ANNIVERSARY TODAY OF NAZI INVASION OF POLAND

NEW YORK, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- The third anniversary of the Nazi invasion of Poland, marking the destruction of the largest Jewish community in Europe, will be observed here tomorrow as a "Day of Polish Jewry" at a number of mass-meetings at which the memory of the tens of thousands of Polish Jews massacred by the Nazis will be honored.

The meetings, arranged jointly by the American Jewish Congress and various representative organizations of Polish and Galician Jews in America, will be addressed by prominent speakers. The Representation of Polish Jewry in America issued a manifesto proclaiming its unshaken confidence in the liberation of Poland and in the restoration of normal Jewish life there after the downfall of Hitlerism.

CHRISTIAN CHARITY OUTRAGED BY NAZI TREATMENT OF JEWS, DETROIT ARCHBISHOP SAYS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- "The spirit of Christian charity has been outraged in tyranny's barbarous treatment of the Jews," declared Archbishop Edward Mooney of Detroit today, addressing the opening session of the Inter-American Seminar on Social Studies sponsored by the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

Archbishop Mooney told the distinguished churchmen, economists, educators and social work leaders gathered here that "if men are to dwell in peace and security, religion must be accorded its rightful place in their individual and social lives."

DR. NISSIM J. OVADIA, PROMINENT SEPHARDIC RABBI, DIES AT 52

NEW YORK, Aug. 31. (JTA)-- Dr. Nissim Joseph Ovadia, 52, former chief rabbi of the Sephardic community in Paris, who came to this country after the collapse of France, died last night in the Peekskill, New York, Hospital, where he was taken after suffering a heart attack while visiting friends. He served as the chief rabbi of the Sephardic community in Vienna from 1916 until 1935, when he assumed his Paris post.
