QUISLING ORDERS ARREST OF ALL JEWISH MEN IN NORWAY; EVICTS WOMEN AND CHILDREN

STOCKHOLM, Nov. 1, (JTA)-- All Jewish men in Norway, between the ages of 14 and 75, are now being arrested by order of the Quisling government, according to reports reaching here today from Oslo.

At the same time Jewish families are being evicted from their homes as a result of the decree issued by the Quisling government last week confiscating the property of all Jews in Norway.

The round-up of the entire Jewish male population is being conducted in co-operation with the Gestapo, under the supervision of the Quisling commissar Landgraff who was transferred from Trondheim to Oslo for the express purpose of directing the mass-arrests of the Jews.

Concentration Camp for Jews Established; Swedish Press Condemns Action

In Oslo, alone, more than 200 Jewish men are reported to have been arrested in one day. They included children of fourteen years as well as aged Jews. The arrested persons are all sent to a concentration camp at Grini from where, it is feared, they will be deported to Nazi-held eastern territory.

Confiscation of Jewish property in Norway is condemned in an editorial in today's issue of the Swedish newspaper Vestmanlands Lans Tidning. "Though the actions of the Nazi rulers should no longer cause surprise," the editorial says, "one is astounded that such a thing could happen in Norway. That such things took place in Germany we know. There the Nazi regime practised the robbery of Jewish property and the murder of Jews on a large scale, but it was hoped that the shame such actions signify in the eyes of all right-minded persons would be spared the people of Norway."

"There are always moral dregs in every community, and it is in this stratum that such measures find support. It is a deep social misfortune when the 'rulers' of a country seek their support from the worst instincts inherent in a very small portion of the population," the Swedish newspaper writes.

ARCHBISHOP OF PARIS SEES PETAIN AND LAVAL ON ANTI-JEWISH MEASURES IN FRANCE

LISBON, Nov. 1, (JTA)-- The Transoceanic Nazi news agency today reported that Cardinal Suhard, archbishop of Paris, conferred at Vichy during the week-end with Marshal Petain and Premier Laval, discussing with them "certain measures decreed against Jews," to which the Catholic Church in France is opposed.

The same agency reported today that German authorities in the Nazi-occupied part of France have issued an order forbidding Jews in Paris to enter any food store, except between 11 A.M. and noon, which is the busiest shopping hour.

LABORITE CONFERENCE BRINGS NO PEACE IN PALESTINE LABOR RANKS; REFERENDUM SCHEDULED

JERUSALEM, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- The five-day conference of the Palestine Labor Party, called for the purpose of settling the internal struggle within the ranks of the party, concluded last night in Kfar Vitkin without solving the basic problems which precipitated the conflict and without bringing about an understanding between the opposing factions.

Of the 401 delegates attending the conference only 205 voted for the principal resolution offered by the group led by Ben-Gurion, which provided for new by-laws and which would actually restrict the entry of more opposition elements into the party. The new by-laws would abolish factions within the party and provide for the holding of referendums whenever basic problems are to be decided upon. The same 205 votes were cast for the political resolutions offered at the conference, which were adopted several months ago at a conference of the Histadruth, the Palestine Federation of Labor.

Although Aaron Zisling, one of the leaders of the opposition, was given a seat on the new secretariate of the party elected at the concluding session of the conference, it is considered doubtful whether this will improve the internal situation. This was particularly emphasized in a demonstration at the closing session by one of the veteran leaders of the party, Idelson, who, after the passage of the resolution on the admittance of new members into the party, rose from his seat and announced: "I declare I am no longer a member of the party. I have nothing more to do here." He then walked out of the hall. His attitude represents that held by many other members of the opposition.

Opposition Leader Lists Grievances; Katznelson Appeals for Goodwill

The sentiments of the opposition were summed up by Aaron Zisling in a two-hour concluding speech in which he accused the present leadership of the party of suppressing independent political thought, charging the leaders - especially the laborite members of the World Zionist Executive - with abandoning the party line in external and internal problems and in taking political steps before consulting the party as a whole. Zisling appealed to the delegates not to split the party and pleaded for a more democratic attitude within the party leadership and for a lenient attitude towards their ideological opponents who, he pointed out, were among the builders of the Labor Party in Palestine.

Berl Katznelson, the spiritual leader of the Palestine labor movement, in a speech at the concluding session, stated that internal discipline is of paramount importance. He demanded that the opposition display more goodwill toward the leaders of the party in order to avoid a breach.

Both groups expect to gain a majority in the referendum on the basic problems, which the party is obliged to hold under the new by-laws.

BULGARIAN GOVERNMENT WILL LIQUIDATE SMALL JEWISH ENTERPRISES

ZURICH, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- Small Jewish firms in Bulgaria which did not comply with the government order to liquidate themselves during the week-end, will be taken over by administrators of the Commissariate for Jewish Affairs, the Sofia radio announced today.

Receipts from the sale of these firms will be placed in the Bulgarian National Bank in a blocked account to be used "for the support of the Jewish population," the announcement said.

WILLKIE BACKS JEWISH NATIONAL HOME IN PALESTINE; SEN. THOMAS ASKS JEWISH STATE NOW

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- A vigorous endorsement of the demand for a Jewish National Home in Palestine was given today by Wendell Willkie, in a message sent to a mass-meeting at Carnegie Hall here to mark the twenty-fifth anniversary of the issuance of the Balfour Declaration by the British Government on Nov. 2, 1917.

At the same time Senator Elbert D. Thomas of Utah, ranking member of the Military Affairs Committee of the Senate, addressing the gathering, demanded the immediate proclamation of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine as one of the democratic war aims.

In his message, wired to the organizations sponsoring the meeting, which included the American Emergency Committee for Zionist Affairs, the American Palestine Committee, the Free World Association and others, Mr. Willkie pointed out that his plea was based upon a survey made on his recent visit to Palestine in the course of his world tour as President Roosevelt's emissary. "Your case for a national home," he stated, "has always rested upon historic rights and international law. Hitler's program of extermination of the Jewish people has made it a case for the conscience of mankind. The doors of Palestine will have to be opened for the homeless Jews of Central and Eastern Europe who will survive this war. The extent of that immigration must be measured by the needs of the Jewish people. While one cannot foresee the exact organization which will follow this war the establishment of a Jewish National Home in Palestine in fulfillment of the promise contained in the Balfour Declaration must find its rightful place in the new world of tomorrow."

Senator Thomas, who was the principal speaker of the evening, declared: "We demand recognition of the Jewish national home as one of the United Nations. We demand the establishment of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine as one of our war aims and peace aims. We ask that the Jewish people be given direction over its homeland, unhampered direction of its immigration and of colonization. We ask, moreover, that these things be recognized and that these policies be declared now!"

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and the World Zionist Organization, wired that "the Balfour Declaration has stood the test of time despite many setbacks and attempts by enemies to subvert its purpose. It is today the only answer to the homelessness of the Jewish people."

The meeting adopted a resolution asking that "a place of equality be secured the Jewish people, and that to that end there be established a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine integrated within the structure of a revived and reconstituted society of nations."

Speakers at the meeting included Alvarez Del Vayo, former Foreign Minister of the Spanish Republic; Baron Guy de Rothschild; Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr, of the Union Theological Seminary; Dr. Nahum Goldmann; Dr. Stephen S. Wise, who presided; and representatives of many of the United Nations. Messages were received from Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Senator Robert F. Wagner and other notables.

LONDON, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- Two-thousand people crowded the Palace Theatre here tonight to mark the twenty-fifth anniversary of the issuance of the Balfour Declaration by the British Government.

Speakers at the meeting included Lord Henry Molochett, who presided; Prof. Selig Brodetzky, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews and Arthur Greenwood, British Labor Party leader. Messages were received from Prime Minister Jan Smuts, of the Union of South Africa; Sir Archibald Sinclair; Viscount Caccia and other leading British statesmen and Jewish figures.

"MEYER LEVIN DAY" MARKED BY PARADE AND CELEBRATION IN BROOKLYN

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- A bronze plaque praising the "courage and gallantry in action" of Sgt. Meyer Levin, twice-decorated Army Air Force bombardier from Brooklyn, was presented to his family today during ceremonies marking the observation of "Meyer Levin Day."

The plaque will be placed on the outside of the Levin home in Brooklyn. The celebration was organized by the War Savings Staff of the Treasury Department to initiate a monster war-bond campaign in New York City in November. A parade of Sgt. Levin's neighbors and friends preceded the presentation ceremonies.

DR. EMANUEL LIBMAN, NOTED SCIENTIST, HONORED ON 70TH BIRTHDAY

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- Dr. Emanuel Libman, eminent physician and scientist, was honored on the occasion of his seventieth birthday by an anniversary dinner last night given by the American Friends of the Hebrew University, the American Jewish Physicians Committee, and a group of Dr. Libman's friends, at the Hotel Waldorf Astoria.

Dr. Libman has made significant, original contributions to pathology, bacteriology and clinical medicine. He is a member of the board of governors of the Hebrew University. Dr. Morris Fishbein, editor of the Journal of the American Medical Association; Rabbi Stephen S. Wise; Colonel Leonard G. Rowntree; and Dr. Joseph H. Pratt were among the guest speakers at the dinner. Dr. Nathan Ratnoff presided.

PALESTINE FUNDS SPENT \$8,000,000 IN ELEVEN MONTHS, DR. SILVER REPORTS

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- The Palestine national funds which obtain their American support through the United Palestine Appeal spent over \$8,000,000 in Palestine in eleven months ending September 1, 1942, according to data made public here today by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, national chairman of the U.P.A.

HIAS OBTAINS LIST OF 2,500 JEWS DEPORTED FROM FRANCE TO NAZI COUNTRIES

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- The first list of names of Jewish refugees who by order of the Laval regime were surrendered to the Nazis for deportation to unknown destinations in Germany and countries occupied by the Nazis, was received here today by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society. The list covers the victims who were formerly interned in the French concentration camp, Camp de Gurs.

AMPAL BUYS \$150,000 WORTH OF BONDS OF JEWISH NATIONAL FUND LOAN.

CHICAGO, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- The Ampal, American-Palestine Trading Corporation, of which Albert K. Epstein of Chicago is president, today announced that it has purchased \$150,000 worth of notes issued by the Jewish National Fund in an effort to raise a \$2,500,000 loan in America for Jewish land acquisition in Palestine. The first bond subscribed by the Ampal was issued to Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization.

AMERICAN JEWS URGED TO OBSERVE ANNIVERSARY OF MASS-BURNING OF SYNAGOGUES IN REICH

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.(JTA)-- Jewish communities throughout the country were urged today by the officers of the United Jewish Appeal to observe the fourth anniversary of the black November 10 in Nazi Germany when many synagogues were burned and Jews were brutally attacked in the streets.
