#### PALESTINE MEETINGS ASK BOMBING OF GERMAN CITIES IN REFRISAL FOR MASSACRED JEWS

JERUSALEM, Nev. 29.(JTA) -- Mass-mostings throughout Palestine last night, called to protest the docimation of European Jowry by the Nazis, adopted resolutions domanding the establishment of special jewish air units to bembard German cities in reprisal for the atrocities inflicted upon the Jews. The formation of Jewish military units to participate in an invasion of Europe was also urged at these gatherings. All synapogues were crowded with worshippers who recited special prayers and "El Mole Rachmin" for the markyrod Jews.

Meanwhile, new demonstrations took place in Tel Aviv with throngs marching through the streets carrying black flags. Rundreds of soldiers of the Allied forces stationed in Palestine participated in the demonstrations as did 10,000 school children, who assembled before the offices of the municipality. Addressing the children, Mayor Rokach of Tel Aviv urged the formation of units of "ghetto-breakers" to help free the enslaved Jows.

A delegation of the orthodox Agudas Israel Organization visited the Apostolio Delegate in Jerusalem and asked him to suggest to the Pope that a special committee be established of representatives of the Holy See and of the Allied Governments to save the remnants of the Jows in Nazi-held Europes. The Delegate promised immediate actions. The group also saw United States Consul-General Lowell C. Pinkertons.

# AMERICAN JEWRY WILL MOURN ON WEDNESDAY FOR JEWS MURDERED BY NAZIS IN EUROPE

NEW YORK, Nove 25. (JTA) - Leading American Jewish organizations joined today in an appeal to the Jews of the United States and to the Jews of free lands throughout the world to observe Wednesday, December 2, as a day of mourning and prayer for the Jewish viotins of Hitlerian.

Signatorios to the appeal include the American Jewish Committee, American Jewish Congress, Blani Brith, Synagogue Council of America, the American branches of the Zionist movement, including the Misrachi and Poale Zion, the Union of Orthodox Rabbis in America, and the American branch of the Aguacht Israel.

At the same time, the Jewish Labor Committee made known that members of trade unions will observe the day of mourning on December 2 through a fifteen minute stoppage of works. This time, however, will be made up in order not to retard the war efforts. In their appeal to the free Jows of the world, the American Jowish organizations point out "that the greatest calemity in Jewish history has befallen Jowish communities" and that "nearly two million Jows have been cruelly done to death while the remaining millions live in the shadow of impending dooms."

Supporting the proclamation of the American Jewish organizations, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, joined with Dr. Stephen S. Wisc

and Dr. Nahum Goldmann, heads of the World Jowish Congress, in cabling twenty-mino communities in various sections of the world to observe December 2 in their own countries as a day of mourning, fasting and prayer "for the Jowish victims of the greatest crime against humanity." Jewish communities invited by them to join in the world-wide observance of the day of mourning include Argentina, Australia, Bolivia, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, Curacao, Ecuador, England, Guatemala, Iran, Iraq, Palestine, Panama, Nicaragua, Peru, Costa Rica, South Africa, Swodon, San Domingo, Syria, San Salvador, Mexico, Trinidad, Uruguay, and Venezuelas

### POLISH LEADERS URGE RETALIATION FOR NAZI ANNIHILATION OF JEWS IN FOLAND

LONDON, Nove 29. (JTA) -- The Polish National Council which last Friday adopted a resolution protesting against the Nazi mass-slaughter of Jows in Poland, will consider practical proposals aimed at checking the Nazi outrages at a forthcoming session. The proposals include:

1. Taking steps, together with other members of the United Nations, for re-

prisals against Germans who are at present in the hands of the Allies.

2. Dropping printed accounts of the Mazi atrocities against the Jews in the occupied territories over Germany, "so that the German people in the future will not be able to pretend that they were unaware of these atrocities."

3. Calling an Allied conference for the purpose of reviewing the situation and of planning effective measures which would force the Masis to discontinue their

cold-blooded annihilation of Jews.

An appeal to the civilized world, emphasizing that history has never recorded such mass-crimes as the present Nazi extermination of Jaws in Poland, was adopted unanimously by the Polish National Council. It read: "The Polish National Council solemnly appeals to all Allied nations to take immediately all possible steps against the violation of human rights and dignity and against the extermination of the population of Poland, especially the mass-murder of Jaws there. In the work of Jawshim mass-annihilation, the Nazi bestiality has touched the lowest recorded dopths. The Council calls upon the population of Poland = Poles, Jaws and other viotims = to hold out and continue their struggle, and fight as the Poles and the Jaws did hitherto, with faith that victory is near and that just retribution will be takens"

Dr. Ignacy Schwarzbart, Jewish member of the Polish National Council who introduced the appeal, declared at the session that he has nothing to add to it "as words cannot describe the terrible occurances." Samuel Zygelboim, the other Jewish member of the Council, deckred in a broken voice: "There is nothing I can say except to hope that the Germans will be defeated before they kill all my people." The Council stood in silonce while the motion to adopt the appeal was passed.

Vice-Fremier Stanislaw Mikolajozyk rend to the Council an appeal published in the underground press in Poland confirming the Neai mass-killing of Jews. "The recent victories of the Allies," the appeal said, "have let loose a new wave of Mari cruelties hitherto unknown in the history of mankinds. Today it is the Jews that are being massacred. When the Nazis finish with the Jews, they will turn on the Poles. Six million innocent Jewish victims face extermination. We cannot remain silents We cannot help them at present, but our protest must be heard emphatically througheout the entire worlis"

# Jows In Canada Joining in World-Wide "Day of Mourning"

MONTREAL, Nov. 29.(JTA) -- The Embinical Council today issued a proclamation calling on the Jowish population to observe Wednesday, December 2 as a day of mourning and fest for victims of Nasi atrocities in German-occupied Europe. It urged special services in the synagogues and a two-minute stoppage of all activities.

# SWEDISH CHIER-RABBI ATTACKED BY NORWEGIAN PRESS: NORWAY WILL RETURN SWEDISH JEWS

STOCKHOLM. Nove 29.(JTA) -- Chiof Rabbi Ehrenprois of Stockholm is attacked in the Mai-controlled Norwegian press today as being a leader in the anti-Mazi activities in Sweden. At the same time the press charges Sweden with being a "bastion of international Jewry and plutocracy."

The Svenska Dagbladet, which is published here, today reports that Jews who emigrated to Norway from Sweden in recent years are to be sent back here by the Quisling government. The property of these deportees, which was confiscated whem all Jewish belongings were seized by the Norwegian authorities, will be returned, the Dagbladet says. It adds that similar action will be taken in respect to persons who have married Swedish Jews.

#### MAZI POGROMS AGAINST JEWS PROVE THAT FASCISM MUST BE ERADICATED, A.F. OF L. LEADER SAYE

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.(JTA) -- The shocking revelation during the past week of intensified Nasi atrocities against the Jews in Europe makes it clearer than ever that Fascism must be eradicated from the surface of the earth, Matthew Woll, vice-president of the American Federation of Labor, declared here last night addressing the 18th annual convention of the National Labor Committee for Palestine, attended by 2,000 guests and delegates from all parts of the country.

"I speak to you as a Christian," Mr. Woll said. "There are no words in the lexicon of the human race to express the horror which those acts have provoked. It is impossible for ordinary men to conceive of flesh and blood capable of such cruel and monstrous behavior. These are no men - these are flends. Kind words will not subdue them. A surgeon cannot appease a cancer. Prayers will not influence the downly. Our answer must be cold steel."

Mr. Woll praised the achievements of Jewish labor in Palestine and expressed the hope that in the post-war world reorganization that lies ahead Jews will gain their independence under the Balfour Declaration on the soil of Palestine in addition to securing freedom and equality in their adopted countries. The convention also received greetings from William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor and Philip Marray, president of the C.I.O.

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, in a message to the convention, emphasized the role which Jowish labor has been pleying in the upbuilding of Palestine and expressed the hope that Palestine will become a Jowish Commonwealth. Israel Mereminsky, representative of the Histadruth in America, declared in his address that the Histadruth is now preparing plans for bringing into Palestine over 250,000 Jewish Workmrs during the first six months after the war.

Abrogation of the anti-Semitic laws in French possessions in North Africa after the United States invasion was lauded by Morris Feinstone, scoretary of the United Hebrew Trades, who presided at a luncheon meeting of the 2,000 delegates attending the two-day convention.

# SYMAGOGUE COUNCIL COMPLETES SURVEY OF UNDESIREABLE PASSAGES IN JEWISH TEXTBOOKS

NEW YORK, Nove 29.(JTA) — The completion of a Synagogue Council survey of Jewish religious toxtbooks with a view to eliminating passages unfriendly to other religious denominations, was announced today by Rabbi Israel Goldstein, president of the Synagogue Council of America, which represents rebbinical and congregational groups in American Judaism, Orthodox, Conservative and Reform.

#### NEW YORK FEDERATION OF JEVISH CHARITIES CRIERRATES. ITS 25TH ANNIVERSARY

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.(JTA) — A solemn service of thanksgiving and re-dedication at the Temple Emanu-El today marked the 25th anniversery of the New York Federation of Jewish Charities and the official opening of the annual merged campaign of the New York and Brooklyn Federations of Jewish Charities.

The service, attended by more than 3,00 invited guests, opened with the reading of a special message of greetings and congratulations from President Roosevelt. The meditation and prayer services were. led by Rabbi Samuel H. Goldenson, Rabbi Israel H. Levinthal and Rabbi David deSola Pool.

George 2. Medalie, president of the New York Federation, in a statement saids "At this time of orisis, it is fitting and proper that we mark the 25th anniversary of the founding of the New York Federation, not in a mood of celebration, but in the spirit of solemn thanksgiving and re-dedication. In this hour of meditation in the synagogue, the community will give expression to the thanksgiving that is in our hearts for the privilege that has been ours through all those years to serve humanity in Kindliness and brotherhood, under the cexts of freedom in this blessed lands

"Drawing inspiration from the wellsprings of our history, we shall rededicate ourselves to the prophetic tradition of our faith which affirms that each man is in truth and in duty his brother's keeper, and that charity is justice. We shall rededicate ourselves to the vision for which America stands, the right of every human being to liberty to opportunity and to the docent life. In this spirit we shall pledge ourselves anew to the great tasks that face us today and temorrow, and we shall go forth with renewed courage and faiths"

#### JR. HADASSAH ADOPTS \$100,000 BUDGET FOR PALESTINE; PLEDGES SACRIFICE FOR WAR EFFORT

NEW YORK, Nove 29.(JTA) - A budget of \$100,000 for the support of health and welfare projects in Palestine was adopted here today at the closing session of the nineteenth annual convention of Junior Hadasah. The delegates also went on record confirming the organization's policy of cooperation between Jews and Arabs in Palestine and paid tribute to Miss Henrietta Spold, veteran American-born leader of Hadassah

Discussing Junior Hadassah's participation in the war effort on the home front, the delegates set themselves a 1943 goal of \$1,000,000 in war bonds and pledged utmost "support and sacrifice" to the war effort. Hiss Nacmi Chertoff of this city was elected president of Junior Hadassah for the coming year.

In a message read to the convention yesterday, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, stated that the end of the war will not automatically bring an end to the Jewish problem. He warned the delegates against complicating concerning the post-war solution of the difficulties facing the Jews of Europe. The restoration of the rights of the Jews on a basis of equality with other inhabitants in every land is only a partial solution of the problem, he stated. To be complete, the solution must include the recognized legal right of the Jewish people to rebuild Palestine as a Jewish commonwealth, free to Jewish imagration, land acquisition and commonic development measured only by the country's capacity and the creative ability of its builders.

## TWO PORTUGUESE STRAMERS LAND NEW GROUPS OF JEWISH REFUGEES IN PHILADELPHIA

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 29.(JTA) -- Two groups of Jowish rofugees from Nazi-occupied lands arrived here today on the steamers Sorpa Finto and San Thome, which sailed from Lisbon, Portugal. They were met at the pier by representatives of the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society of New York who routed them to relatives and friends in various parts of the country.
