DAY OF PROTEST AGAINST ALLIES' INDIFFERENCE TO JEWISH TRAGEDY PROCLAIMED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, June 6.(JTA)-- Work will be stopped, stores will be closed and traffic will be suspended by Jews in Palestine on June 14 in accordance with a decision adopted today by the Jewish National Council of Palestine to proclaim that day "a day of solidarity with the heroic stand taken by the Jews in the Warsaw ghetto as well as an expression of protest on the part of the Palestine Jews against the indifference of the Allied Nations to the unprecedented Jewish tragedy."

Every Jewish adult in Palestine will sign a petition on that day which will be sent to the Allied Nations appealing for urgent aid for the Jews in Nazi-held countries. Mass-meetings will be held throughout the country. Even the Jewish bus lines running between one city and another and constituting the major transportation system in the country will not run after twelve noon.

CANADA ASKED TO SET EXAMPLE FOR DEMOCRATIC WORLD BY EXTENDING AID TO JEWS IN EUROPE

OTTAWA, Canada, June 6.(JTA)-- Since Canada was not represented at the Bermuda Conference, it is a free agent and can act vigorously and independently to alleviate the suffering of the Jews in Nazi-held Europe, it was pointed out yesterday by a delegation of prominent Canadian Jewish leaders who were received by Minister of Mines Thomas A. Crerar, who is responsible for the government's immigration policies:

The delegation, which represented the Canadian Jewish Congress and United Jewish Refugee and War Relief Agencies, included Samuel Bronfman, president of both groups; Saul Hayes, director of the Congress, and several others.

Mr. Hayes, who acted as spokesman for the group, stressed the fact that Canada can do a great deal to aid the Jews in Europe, even though a full solution of the problem must await an Allied victory and a destruction of the Axis powers. He said that Canada had a great opportunity to set an example for the rest of the democratic world by offering asylum now to Jews. He specifically suggested that the Ottawa government agree to admit Jewish refugee children now in Spain and Portugal, and also Yugoslav Jews who are presently in Italy.

Canada, Mr. Hayes added, could also ensure that the neutral countries such as Spain, Portugal and Turkey, would admit refugees, if it gave them guarantees that after the war it would admit a number of the refugees who are given asylum for the duration. The delegation also urged that these Jews who are still interned in Canada as "enemy aliens" be released.

Interviewed after the conference with Mr. Crerar, the delegation stated that they had been well received and had reason to believe that concrete results would follow from their recommendations, which, the minister promised, would be carefully considered.

GOVERNMENT CONTRACTORS ASKED TO UTILIZE SUPPLY OF ALIEN MANPOWER

WASHINGTON, June 6.(JTA)-- Urging full use of all loyal aliens, the War, Navy and Justice Departments and the Maritime Commission today jointly announced shortening and simplification of the procedure whereby holders of government airplane and "classified" contracts may obtain permission for hiring aliens within two weeks of less.

A statement signed by Secretary of War Stimson, Attorney General Biddle, Secretary of the Navy Knox, and Maritime Commission Chairman Land also emphasized that government contractors may employ aliens as freely as citizens on all other types of work; and in fact, such contractors are forbidden by Executive Order 8802 from discriminating in hiring because of a worker's race or national origin.

"Even on aeronautical and classified contracts, if a qualified applicant whose services the contractor needs is an alien whose loyalty to the United States the contractor has no reason to doubt, the contractor is obligated to cooperate with the applicant in applying for consent to his employment," the statement said. It went on to say that failure to employ such an alien is a breach of the contract anti-discrimination clause and contrary to national policy.

The shortened procedure whereby a contractor on aeronautical or classified (as secret, confidential or restricted) government contract can obtain consent to employ aliens is outlined in full in the statement, which supersedes previous regulations on the same subject. Either the employer or the alien may ask for reconsideration if consent is denied, and in case of final denial, the alien should be directed to the U. S. Employment Service for referral to other work. Furthermore, the statement emphasizes that an employer is not subject to penalty resulting from loss or damage if he has obtained, in good faith, the permission of the government department involved before permitting an alien to have access to the work, plans or trial under aeronautical or classified contracts.

TRUSTEESHIP IS URGED FOR NAZI-CONFISCATED PROPERTY UNTIL PRE-WAR OWNERS ARE FOUND

NEW YORK, June 6.(JTA)-- A post-war Europe wherein "the legal situation of the day before the occupation" would be restored and a trustee management office established to administer Nazi-confiscated property until its pre-war owners could be determined, was proposed yesterday at the conclusion of a series of Pan-European conferences at the New York University Faculty Club.

The discussion of the proposed trustee management system was led by Paul F. de Marxov, a Dane who is president of the Induag Corporation for Industrial Developments, a Swiss concern which stimulated development of industrial plants in various parts of Europe and exported the necessary machinery. Mr. Marxov said organization of post-war trusteeships was necessary now so they might function immediately upon liberation of occupied countries.

INTER-DENOMINATIONAL MASS-MEETING IN BRITAIN URGES FIGHT ON ANTI-SEMITISM

LONDON, June 6.(JTA)-- A determined fight on anti-Semitism in Britain was urged here today by 3,000 people assembled at an inter-denominational mass meeting called by the League for Unity Against Anti-Semitism.

Eleanor Rathbone, Independent M.P., attacked the claim that the admission of refugees fostered anti-Semitism and urged easing of the immigration barriers. Prof. F. Levy of the Imperial College of Science praised the contribution to the Allied war effort of the Jews in Russia and warned that Britons must unite to fight anti-Semitism if they are to escape the scourge of Fascism.

LEADERS OF REFORM JUDAISM NEGOTIATE FOR PEACE ON ZIONISM; PROGRESS REPORTED

PHILADELPHIA, June 6.(JTA)-- Progress was reported here today in connection with negotiations initiated by Adolph Rosenberg, president of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, to achieve peace within Reform Judaism on the question of Zionism.

A sub-committee which met here to draft a program on the Union of American Hebrew Congregations' attitude on Palestine and post-war rehabilitation of the Jews in Europe, was reported today as having reached an agreement. When approved by the executive board of the U. of A. H. C.; the program will be communicated to the American Jewish Conference and given as the Union's instructions to its delegates to the Conference.

The sub-committee consists of Adolph Rosenberg, Rabbi Barnett Brickner, Rabbi Maurice Eisendrath, Dr. Julian Morgenstern, Judge Horace Stern, Rabbi Louis Wolsey, Rabbi James G. Heller, Rabbi Solomon Freehof, Rabbi Louis Egelson and Rabbi William Fineshreiber.

NATIONAL WOMEN'S LEAGUE DEMANDS UNRESTRICTED JEWISH IMMIGRATION INTO PALESTINE

NEW YORK, June 6.(JTA)-- A resolution on Palestine which will be presented to the American Jewish Conference by the National Women's League of the United Synagogues was adopted here at a three-day conference of the League attended by more than a hundred delegates from every part of the United States.

The resolution urges "that the gates of Palestine remain open for Jewish settlers; that the Jewish Agency for Palestine be vested with the control of Jewish immigration into Palestine, and that Palestine be established as a Jewish Commonwealth where the Jew might live as of right and not on sufferance."

The conference was called by Mrs. Samuel Spiegel, national president of the League, for the purpose of formulating plans for the Simultaneous Regional Conferences to be held by the organization on November 10 of this year, in lieu of the organization's regular national convention, which has been postponed in order to cooperate with the government's request to curtail traveling.

DICKSTEIN ASKS U.S., BRITAIN EASE IMMIGRATION BARRIERS; URGES BAN ON ANTI-SEMITISM

NEW YORK, June 6.(JTA)-- An appeal to the governments of the United States and Britain to ease their immigration regulations to permit the entry of additional numbers of refugees was voiced here today by Congressman Samuel Dickstein, addressing a conference called by the Jewish Peoples Committee. He also urged lifting of immigration restrictions in Palestine. Discussing the extent of anti-Semitism agitation in the United States, Rep. Dickstein called on Congress to pass his bill making it illegal to send anti-Semitic material through the mails.

Congressman Emanuel Celler criticized Rep. Sol Bloom, one of the delegates to the recent Bermuda Conference, for his failure to take a decisive stand there on the question of aiding the Jews in Europe. Other speakers included Congressman Walter Lynch, Max Perlow, president of the Jewish Peoples Committee and several other legislators and trade union leaders.

"RALLY OF HOPE" AT MADISON SQUARE GARDEN ASKS AID FOR JEWISH CHILDREN IN EUROPE

NEW YORK, June 6.(JTA)-- A star-studded "Rally of Hope" to express the sympathy of the American people for the Jewish children in Nazi Europe was held at Madison Square Garden here today.
