LAST JEWS DEPORTED FROM HAMBURG PRIOR TO HEAVY BOMBING OF THE CITY FROM THE AIR

LONDON, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- The last 400 Jews permitted to remain in the German city of Hamburg were deported shortly before the huge Allied air raids on the city, it was reported here today from Switzerland. Previously, the Jews in Hamburg had not been allowed to use any air raid shelters.

Polish official circles here today received a report from Stockholm stating that two French war prisoners who succeeded in escaping from Germany to Sweden revealed that Jewish girls from Poland are being used by the Nazis for demolition work, under the threats of bayonets. The two said that they witnessed a scene when Jewish mothers were killed on the spot for protesting against taking away their children for heavy physical forced labor on demolishing buildings bombed by the British air force.

NAZIS EXECUTE JEWS DEPORTED FROM FRANCE TO POLAND; MORE EXECUTIONS FEARED

GENEVA, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- A majority of the Jews deported from France to the district of Lodz and Pabjanice, in occupied Poland, have been executed by the Nazis, it was revealed in a report reaching here today. Those who were left alive, according to the same source, are working eighteen hours each day on construction work and road building.

"It is expected that with the advent of the rainy season, when construction work will no longer be possible, the remaining Jews will also be massacred," the report adds.

In addition to using Jews from Western European countries for hard labor in the mines of Upper-Silesia, the Nazis have also segregated some of the Jews from Holland and Belgium in eight isolated townships in the Lublin area in Poland. The places mentioned in the report are: Izbica, Krasnystaw, Modliborzyce, Piaski, Trawniki, Ossowa, Ujasdow and Deutsch-Horst.

JEWISH LEADERS APPEAL TO AMERICAN JEWS TO SAVE 1,700 JEWISH CHILDREN FROM POLAND

GENEVA, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- Jewish leaders in Hungary and in Rumania today simultaneously notified Jewish organizations here that 1,700 Jewish children whose parents have "disappeared" under the "Nazified" regime are now concentrated by the German administration in occupied Poland, in the city of Bochnia, Galicia.

Emphasizing that great concern is felt for the fate of these children, the Jewish leaders from both pro-Nazi countries stated that it is improbable that the children can be rescued without the aid of American Jews. They themselves are doing whatever is in their power, but this will not be sufficient to save them. They express the hope that Jewish groups in Switzerland will contact American Jewish organizations and do all that is possible to get the children out of Poland.

DANGER TO JEWS IN BALKANS BROUGHT TO ATTENTION OF BRITISH GOVERNMENT

LONDON, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- The attention of the British Government to the dangerous situation which will be created for Jews in Italian-administered Balkan territories when Italy withdraws its troops from that area, was called today by a delegation of the Agudath Israel orthodox organization who visited the Foreign Office.

The delegation pointed out that many Jews in the Axis-occupied Balkan countries saved themselves by escaping from the territories under Nazi occupation into sections occupied by the Italian armies. Should they now fall under German administration, they face the prospect of extermination in the same manner as the Jews in Nazi-held parts of Greece, Yugoslavia and Croatia, it was declared.

A report from Switzerland reaching here today states that the chief of police in the Bulgarian city of Plovdiv introduced a special curfew for Jews under the pretext that he "suspects Jews in leading anti-Government activities." The Plovdiv Jews are prohibited to appear in the street from 7 o'clock in the evening to 7 o'clock in the morning.

MANY JEWS CAN YET BE RESCUED FROM NAZI EUROPE, EXPERT ASSERTS

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- The opinion that "many more Jews could be rescued even at this late day if the British and American officials entrusted with framing the refugee policy had a better understanding of the problems confronting the Jewish people, and more concern with them," is expressed in an analysis of the British and American official documents of the Bermuda Conference, prepared by Ilja Djouri for the Jewish Scientific Institute.

"It is true that there are different ways of looking at the matter," Mr. Dijour writes. "It may be held that at present the only hope for the Jews is the coming victory of the United Nations, when, perhaps, practically no Jews will be left in the Nazi-dominated countries."

The United States did not absorb the full quota of refugees possible under the law, the expert further declares. On the basis of the annual reports issued by the Commissioner General of Immigration and by the Attorney General of the United States, Mr. Dijour argues that under the fixed annual immigration quota, more than 1,500,000 immigrants could have entered the United States during the years 1933-1942, but not more than 453,205 entered. Of these, only 291,112 came from Europe, including 243,420 from the Axis-countries.

Mr. Dijour reveals that during the ten years since Hitler came to power, only 163,423 Jews were admitted to the United States, half of them since 1939. TISHA B'AB DRAWS CROWDS TO LONDON SYNAGOGUES; CHIEF RABBI BROADCASTS TO AMERICA

LONDON, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- Jewish leaders here today expressed satisfaction over the fact that the British Broadcasting Corporation, which is controlled by the British Government, has granted time to Chief Rabbi Dr. J.H. Hertz for a Tisha B'Ab broadcast commemorating the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem. The broadcast was also carried over the North American service of the B.B.C.

All synagogues in London were crowded during the Tisha B'Ab services. The Chief Rabbi in his broadcast described the sufferings of the Jews in Nazi-Europe and termed the Jewish battle in Warsaw against the Nazis "an epic struggle in world history," likening it to the Maccabean heroism of old. He expressed the conviction that "one day tyranny will cease and a lasting peace will be established."

SIR MONTAGUE BURTON DONATES \$60,000 FOR HEBREW CHAIR AT ENGLISH UNIVERSITY

LONDON, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- Sir Montague Burton, noted Jewish philanthropist, today announced a grant of \$60,000 for the establishment of a permanent chair for Modern Hebrew at Leeds University. This is the first chair of its kind established in a British University.

PALESTINE PAPER HAILS ARRIVAL OF J.D.C. REPRESENTATIVE; HOPES FOR CLOSE COOPERATION

TEL AVIV, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- The arrival in Palestine of Dr. Joseph Schwartz, J.D.C. representative, is acclaimed today in Davar, largest Hebrew newspaper in the country.

"We hope that this visit opens a new chapter of cooperation between the world's largest Jewish relief organization and the Jews in Palestine," the paper writes.

Mr. Shabbatai Levy, Jewish mayor of Haifa, announced that in order to insure public Sabbath observance in the Jewish district of Haifa, traffic in the Herzl street zone will be diverted to other roads on Saturdays.

40,000 MEN IN ARMED SERVICES ENTERTAINED BY JEWISH INSTITUTE SINCE WAR OUTBREAK

LONDON, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- More than 40,000 men and women in the armed services, including many Americans, have been entertained by the Jewish Institute in Glasgow since the outbreak of the war, it was reported here today.

The British Council of Churches dispatched a memorandum to the Federal Council of Churches in America stating that "no world settlement which does not give reasonable security and freedom to religious minorities, especially to the Jewish people, can claim that it has succeeded." The substance of the memorandum will be incorporated in a symposium being prepared by the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ.

PALESTINE RABBINICAL LEADERS APPEAL FOR \$100,000 FOR RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.(JTA)-- The American Keren Hayishuv, a fund for religious Jewish activities in Palestine established by the Agudath Israel, today received a cable from rabbinical leaders of Jerusalem stating that the sum of \$100,000 is urgently needed for the maintenance of numerous orthodox institutions in Palestine, where several Jewish settlements were established and are maintained by the Agudath Israel Youth Council of America.
