## ANTI-SEMITISM IN ARGENTINA MOUNTS; JEWISH HOMES RAIDED; GHETTO FOR JEWS URGED

SANTIAGO, Chile, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- Raids on Jewish homes in Buenos Aires are now being conducted by the recently formed political police headed by the notorious anti-semite Leopoldo Lugones who is responsible only to President Ramirez, it was reported here today by Jews fleeing from Argentina as a result of the intensified anti-Jewish activities of the Ramirez regime.

The raids are coupled with increased demands by the pro-Nazi press in Argentina that the government follow up the recent anti-Jewish orders by taking stronger action against the 360,000 Jews in the country. Clarinada, a vicious anti-Semitic publication modeled after the "Sturmer" in Germany, demands that the Jews of Argentina either be deported or isolated in ghettos.

The same publication, which enjoys the support of high government officials, also demands that the Yiddish newspapers in Argentina again be suppressed. It carries lists of Jews, including their addresses, urging drastic action against them. It also publishes long lists of non-Jewish democrats terming them enemies of the present Argentine regime who must be dealt with without delay.

The Jews arriving from Argentina report that the raids on Jewish houses in Buenos Aires are made without warrants, mostly at night. The Jews in Argentina are accused of siding with the United States and Britain and are charged in the pro-Nazi press with trying to destroy Argentina's neutrality.

## CONVOCATION OF PAN-ARAB CONGRESS TO FOLLOW TALKS WITH PALESTINE ARABS IN CAIRO

LONDON, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- The talks between representatives of various Arab countries which are now taking place in Cairo will culminate in the convocation of a pan-Arab congress after the Egyptian premier, Nahas Pasha, concludes his parleys with delegations from Palestine and Lebanon, the Reuter news agency reported today from Cairo.

Leaders of the Jewish Agency here are watching with great interest the developments in Cairo. The fact that the British Foreign Office, which is understood to favor the pan-Arab talks, has not consulted the Jewish Agency here concerning the latter's reaction to these conferences, which involve the ultimate fate of Palestine, is taken to mean that the Jews may be faced with a situation which will require an even more intensified fight than that against the White Paper.

The opinion of political observers here is that the present talks in Cairo may lead to the re-establishment of a Greater Syria which before World War I consisted of Syria, Lebanon, Palestine and Transjordan. This federation may later form a part of a confederation of the larger Arab countries including Egypt, Iraq and Saudi Arabia.

ONLY ONE JEW LEFT ALIVE BY THE GERMANS IN KIEV, RUSSIAN ARMY DISCOVERS

The lone survivor said that more than 40,000 Jews were massacred by the German troops soon after their occupation of the city in 1941. Those massacred were mostly women and children and aged, since all able-bodied men and many young Jewish women retreated with the Russian armies.

The Jew took Russian military officials to the places where the Nazis mowed down the 40,000 with machine-guns and threw them into ditches, which served as collective graves. These graves will now be opened in order that experts of the special Soviet committee to register German atrocities against the civilian population may be able to establish the guilt of the Germans.

AMERICAN COMPANIES OFFERED CONCESSIONS TO OPPOSE JEWISH STATE IN PALESTINE

LONDON, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- American interests are being offered important concessions in Saudi Arabia by King Ibn Saud on condition that they oppose the creation of a Jewish State in Palestine, the London newspaper Reynolds News reported yesterday. The paper added that "there is enough oil in the Dead Sea area in Palestine to disrupt all the plans of the oil companies operating in the Middle East."

Exploiting the recent visit to Palestine of Ivan Maisky, Soviet Deputy Commissar for Foreign Affairs, the Berlin radio today reported that the Jews in Palestine believe that "after the war, the Soviet Government will most energetically insist on the immediate solution of the Jewish problem." The same broadcast was also beamed from Berlin to the United States in English.

787 YEMENITE JEWS REACH PALESTINE; DR. JOSEPH LEAVES FOR THE UNITED STATES

JERUSALEM, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- The largest group of Yemenite Jews ever to reach Palestine arrived here today. In the contingent were 787 men, women and children. They came by special train from Egypt and were met by representatives of the Jewish Agency at the Athlit station in Palestine. Temporary lodgings have been arranged for them at the Athlit clearance camp.

Dr. Bernard Joseph, legal adviser to the Jewish Agency for Palestine, left today for the United States. He intends to spend most of his time in Washington in connection with the Zionist office which is now functioning there under the supervision of Dr. Nahum Goldman.

POLISH WORKER EXECUTED BY GESTAPO FOR ASSISTING JEWS

LONDON, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- All the workers in a Nazi factory near Skarzysk, in Poland, were forced recently to witness the execution of an employee named Nowak who had extended assistance to Jews, it is reported today by underground sources.

Nowak went to the gallows shouting: "Long live Poland," the report said. When the gallows rope broke, dropping Nowak to the ground, he was shot dead by a Gestapo official, it adds.

JEWISH GROUPS MEET TO SPEED REFUGEE IMMIGRATION TO CANADA

MONTREAL, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- The Canadian Government's recently announced decision to admit a number of refugees now in Portugal and Spain was a direct result of intervention by the Canadian Jewish Congress, it was stated here last night by Saul Hays at a conference of several hundred delegates of various Jewish labor, religious and communal groups called by the United Jewish Refugee and War Relief Agencies to discuss refugee relief measures.

The meeting enthusiastically endorsed the petition campaign of the non-Jewish National Committee on Refugees, which is seeking to obtain 500,000 signatures to a petition requesting the government to open Canada to immigration now and after the war. The delegates promised to get thousands of Jewish signatures. Michael Garber, K.C., chairman of the U.J.R. in Eastern Canada, stated that the Congress had much successful experience in settling refugees in Canada. He also stressed that the refugee problem was of interest to both Jews and non-Jews. Among the signatories to the petition is the Most Rev. James G. McGuigan, Catholic Archbishop of Toronto, who affixed his signature last week, it was disclosed today.

AMERICAN JEWISH PILOT AWARDED EIGHT DECORATIONS; NAVY DECORATES JEWISH CAPTAIN

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- Capt. Edwin L. Gluck of Pittsburgh, pilot of a Liberator bomber, is the recipient of eight decorations, the Jewish Welfare Board announced today. He holds the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal, and six Oak Leaf Clusters, and has taken part in aerial assaults on Rome, Neustadt, Taranto, and the historic bombardment of the Ploesti oil fields.

Volunteering for a particularly hazardous mission against enemy installations in the European area last March, Captain Gluck was cited by his commanding general when he successfully carried out his assignment. Joining the Air Force ten days after Pearl Harbor, Gluck qualified as a pilot and was dispatched overseas for bombing duty.

T/Sgt. Harry Goldstein of the Bronx has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal and three Oak Leaf Clusters, the J.W.B. also reports. An aerial engineer and turret gunner, Sergeant Goldstein has accounted for several Nazi craft.

Capt. Leonard Kaplan, U.S.N., of Baltimore, Md., a Naval engineer, has been decorated with the Legion of Merit for achieving "outstanding feats of salvage and repair" at the Naval Operating Base at Iceland last year, the J.W.B. discloses. Captain Kaplan, who has been in the Naval service for twenty years, was in charge of the construction of the USS North Carolina two years ago. He has been on station duty at several posts in the United States as well as in the Philippines, where he spent three years.

RETIRING JEWISH LORD MAYOR OF LONDON MADE A BARON

LONDON, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- Sir Samuel Joseph, retiring Lord Mayor of London, has been elevated to the peerage by the King, it was announced today. Sir Samuel was made a Baron.

Commenting on Sir Samuel's tenure of office, the Times stated that he met the special wartime situations with "resourcefulness resulting from his long experience in humanitarian activities." Sir Samuel was the first Jew to become Lord Mayor since about 1900.

PRO-PALESTINE GROUP FORMED IN NEW ZEALAND; ASKS ABOGATION OF WHITE PAPER

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- A Pro-Palestine Committee, including leading clergymen and public figures, was established here today at a meeting called for that purpose. The meeting adopted a resolution asking full implementation of the Balfour Declaration and decided to launch a petition campaign asking abrogation of the White Paper.

Among the members of the new group are: Bishop Holland, head of the Anglican Church in New Zealand; Catholic Archbishop O'Shea; Minister for Rehabilitation Major Skinner, and Sir Thomas Hunter, the mayor of Wellington.

DR. MOSES EISENSTADT, FORMER CHIEF RABBI OF RUSSIAN JEWS, DEAD

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.(JTA)-- Dr. Moses Eisenstadt, noted Zionist, and chief rabbi of the orthodox Russian Jewish community in Paris until the German occupation of France, died here last night at the age of 73.

Before the Russian Revolution, Dr. Eisenstadt served in St. Petersburg for many years. After the revolution, he went to Paris, where he remained until April, 1941, when he came to the United States. He received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Berlin after studying at rabbinical colleges.
