S IN NORTH AFRICA SPLIT ON POLITICAL ISSUES; SOME SUPPORT SEPARATION FROM FRANCE

ALGIERS, Jan. 21. (JTA) - Jews in North Africa are now divided into two camps the result of a separatist movement sponsored by Moslem extreme nationalistic groups, of which demands that France grant Algeria a dominion status, while others advote the formation of a Western Arab Federation composed of Algeria, Tunisia and rocco.

The proposal that the three French colonies be merged into an imperial Federaon will be brought before the forthcoming session of the French Parliament-in-Exile Brassaville, it was stated today. Jewish leaders of France, now in Algeria, oppose y separist tendencies which would weaken the position of the French Committee of tional Liberation. Algerian Jews, on the other hand, seem to favor those Moslem ements who work towards achieving a dominion status for Algeria.

Some anti-Jewish regulations issued by the Vichy regime are still being applied local officials in Morocco and in other parts of Western Africa despite the decion of the French Committee of National Liberation annuling the Vichy anti-Semitic
gislation. This gives the colonial Jews ground for alliance with the nationalist
slems. The situation is even more complicated by the fact that Jews in Morocco and
a Tunicia, unlike the Jews of Algeria, do not benefit from any of the decisions of
an de Gaulle's French Committee because they are considered subjects of the Sultan
and the Bey in these territories which are French protectorates.

Moslems Approve Restoration of Cremius Decree; Prejudice Still Noticeable

On the whole, the Jewish situation in North Africa has greatly improved since he re-establishment of the Cremieux Decree under which Algerian Jews are regarded as rench citizens. The Oulemas, are religious leaders, the Marabouts, government-prointed religious chiefs, and all the Moslem-elected officials, have approved of the estoration of the Cremieux Decree. Anti-Jewish prejudices is still, however, notic-ble in army circles in Morocco.

In the regions where the anti-Jewish propaganda was conducted by German agents and by Vichy officials prior to the liberation of these territories by the Allaed rmies, a more satisfactory situation has developed since the arrest and internment of local leaders of the anti-Semitic Doriot Party and of the so-called Petain Legionaries. This is especially apparent in Oran and in Sidi-Belabbes.

All Jews in North Africa, native as well as French, are united in the opinion that the French Committee of Eational Liberation is working effectively to combat anti-Jewish prejudice. The leaders of the French Jews here who oppose separatist tendencial and urge all-out support of the de-Gaulle regime include Dr. Henri Abouker, president of the Committee for Social Studies, and Bernard Lechache, president of the Committee to Combat Racialism.

OO JEWS FROM OCCUPIED POLAND GIVEN SHELTER IN HUNGARY; MANY HELD IN CAMPS

GENEVA, Jan. 21. (Jft) -- Approximately 10,000 Polish Jews have succeeded in thing Hungary during the last few months, according to information reaching Jewish mistions in Switzerland today. About 2,500 of them were originally given shelter sudapest, but by the end of last month only three hundred of them were living in Hungarian capital. The remainder were interned in camps by a special government or.

Jewish refugees, who are not sent to camps are permitted to reside wherever y choose and may engage in any kind of work, the report stated. Many Hungarian s are taking the refugees into their homes to save them from being interned.

Jewish organizations in Hungary, the report added, are facing a gigantic task maintaining the refugees. The fugitives come over the frontiers in rags, many of a barefoot, and all of them penniless. A campaign for winter clothing for them now been completed by Hungarian Jewish communal institutions, but only fifteen cent of the refugees could be provided for with the clothing collected.

ISH GUERILLA UNIT IN POLAND AVENGES "LIQUIDATED" GHETTOS; KILLS OFFICIALS

LONDON, Jan. 21. (JTA) — A unique Jewish guerilla unit, numbering more than young Jews who escaped from the liquidated ghettos in various sections of occupied and, is now terrorising Germans in the Lublin district, it was reported here today Jewish léaders from Poland.

The unit is known all over Poland as "Ghetto Guerillas" and publishes its own ndestine newspaper under the title "The Ghetto Guerillas". The members of the unit centrate chiefly on the killing of German officials responsible for massacres of s. Their publication claims that they have succeeded in "liquidating" many Germans participated in the liquidation of the ghettos of Lublin and Otwock. The unit was anized by Warsaw Jewish youths who escaped after the Battle of Warsaw Ghetto. They e later joined by Jewish youths from Bialystok, Lublin, Vilna and Lods.

The Polish clandestine publication Recypospolita Polska received here, today outs that the Polish underground movement has put to death a Warsaw Pole, Boguslaw a Pilnik, for denouncing Jews to the Gestapo. Pilnik delivered hiding Jews to the man authorities after first defrauding them under false promises of their money i valuables.

SCISTS CONFIGUATE JEWISH FURNITURE IN ITALY; RAIDS ON JEWS RESUMED IN FRANCE

BERN, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- The Turin newspaper IA Stampa received here today rerts that Fascist authorities are confiscating all furniture in Jewish homes in man-controlled Italy. An order issued by the Italian Fascist authorities says that furniture is to be turned over for use in public offices or military establishments.

Reports from Madrid reaching here state that a new hunt on Jews has been arted in France following orders issued by M. Darnand, new Yichy Director for Public der. More than 300 Jews were rounded up in Lyons on Monday and sent to an unknown stination. Another 200 Jews including women and children were arrested in Lyons on eaday. Raids on Jews have also been resumed in other French cities.

JERUSALEM, Jan. 21. (JTA) - Chief Rabbi Herzog of Falestine today issued a tement denying any ties with the Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish People of ope, the organization in New York, which announced yesterday that it is citing Stephen S. Wise before a tribanal of orthodox rabbis on the charge of seeking to termine its rescue efforts. The statement of the Chief Rabbi reads:

"My only contact with the Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish People of rope has been to use their address for delivery to Senator Johnson in Washington of message to the American people with reference to the rescue of Jews of Europe address of the committee was used by me under the impression that they are a body presenting all sections of American Jewry. Besides this I have had no contact whatever with this committee. IBERTY SHIP NAMED AFTER JEWISH LABOR LEADER, LAUNCHED; THREE OTHERS TO FOLLOW

BALTIMORE, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- A Liberty ship named after the late Benjamin chlesinger, American Jewish labor leader, was launched today at the Bethlehem Fair-ield Shipyards. Another, named after Morris Hilquit, Jewish Socialist leader, will be launched tomorrow.

The two ships were named after the .! labor leaders in recognition of the conribution to the war effort by the International Ladies Garment Workers Union with which the two labor leaders were associated. Two more ships carrying the names of forris Zigman and Meyer London, also prominently connected with the ILGWU, will be launched next weeks.

ARAB WORKERS IN PALESTINE APPLY FOR PERMIT TO PUBLISH A DAILY LABOR PAPER

JERUSALEM, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- The Arab workers organization of Palestine today applied to the Palestine authorities for permission to publish an Arab daily labor newspaper.

WISH INTERNEES ARE "ROTTING AWAY" AT MAURITIUS, ZIONIST EMERGENCY COUNCIL CHARGES

NEW YORK, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- More than 1,500 Jews are completing their third ar of intermment on the Island of Muuritius, in the Indian Ocean, after having been clared illegal immigrants to Falestine by the British government in 1941, the Amerin Zionist Emergency Council, charged today.

"Although British officials have done all they can to make the living quarters bitable, approximately 70% of the refugees are suffering from malaria and avitamisis," Henry L. Shapiro, an executive of the Council said. "The men live in an anent prison while the women and children occupy barracks. Family life has been wiped to These unfortunate people are just rotting away. What makes it worse is that say actually landed in Palestine and were deported because they had escaped from the sis without stopping for visas."

K COURT MARTIAL OF U. S. OFFICER WHO BOASTED OF MISTREATMENT OF JEWS

.WASHINGTON, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- Letters showing how an army lieutenant let his ti-Jewish prejudices influence his treatment of soldiers today brought a demand to cretary of War Henry L. Stimson for a court martial and investigation.

The name of the lieutenant is withheld pending official action, but Rep. Marantonio of New York made public photostatic copies of two letters, addressed to his olonel, in which the lieutenant expressed bitterly anti-Semitic sentiments.

The first letter, dated Aug. 8, 1943, included the following statement: "It is he first unit I ever saw that didn't have a bunch of Jewish officers in it. We do ot have a one. Thank God for it."

The second, dated Sept. 2, 1945, began with an expression of thanks, for the colonel's help toward a promotion, and continued: "I don't know whether or not I entioned it in my previous letter, but there isn't a single 'kike' officer in the roup and I am happy for it. We have a few enlisted men of Jewksh persuasion but lay can be handled. In fect, my personnel Sergeent Major is one. I read the riot ot to him and then gave him a 14-day furlough in which to think it over. If he comes ack unchanged he will simply have to be reassigned and stripped of his stripes."

Marcantonio asked Stimson to ascertain the identity and present status of the sergeant Major, saying that the Army "is endangered as long as men can, for no reason ther than a Hitler-like religious and racial prejudice, discriminate against soldiers under their command."

LUCIUS N. LITTAUER GIVEN HONORARY DEGREE BY N. Y. UNIVERSITY ON 85TH BIRTHDAY

NEW YORK, Jan. 21. (JTA) -- Lucius Nathan Littauer, Jewish philanthropist, celebrated his eighty-fifth birthday yesterday by receiving the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from New York University. The degree was conferred by Dr. Harry Woodburn Chase, chancellor of the university, in a degree only in the amphitheater of the psychiatric division of Bellevue Hospital.

The N. Y. U. degree made the third such honor for Mr. Littauer. Harvard made him a Doctor of Humane Letters in 1927, and Hamilton College gave him a Doctor of Laws degree in 1940.
