EVELT ESTABLISHES REFUGEE RESCUE BOARD; JEWISH LEADERS HAIL MEASURE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- Jewish leaders today hailed the Executive Order ad by President Roosevelt yesterday late in the afternoon, under which the Presiset up a War Refugee Board consisting of Secretary Stimson, Secretary Hull and etary Morgenthau, to take action for the immediate rescue from the Nazis of as Jews and other persecuted minorities of Europe as possible.

The order was issued parallel with a statement from the White House emphasizing "it was urgent that action be taken at once to forestall the plan of the Mazis xterminate all the Jews and other persecuted minorities in Europe." The Presists order said that the functions of the new board "shall include, without limitate, the development of plans and programs and the inauguration of effective measures (a) the resous; transportation, maintenance and relief of the victims of enemy ression, and (b) the establishment of havens of temporary refuge for much victims."

Diplomatic Status Be Given To Special Attaches Abroad

President Roosevelt also instructed the State Department to appoint "special aches with diplomatic status" on the recommendations of the board, and that these libe "stationed abroad in places where it is likely that assistance can be rendered mar refugees." The President also directed that "the board and the State, Treasury war Departments are authorized to accept the services or contributions of any rate persons, private organizations, State agencies or agencies of foreign governts in carrying out the purposes of this order."

The board, the President announced, will have a full-time executive director to ange for the prompt execution of the plans and programs developed and the measures tiated to effect the rescues. Mr. Roosevelt added that he expected to obtain the peration of all members of the United Nations and other foreign governments "in rying out this difficult but important task."

In establishing the new board, which will function directly under him, the sident declared in the executive order that "it is the policy of this government to eall measures within its power to rescue the victims of enemy oppression who are imminent danger of death, and otherwise to afford such victims all possible relief assistance consistent with the successful prosecution of the war." He added that board will be charged with direct responsibility to him in seeing that the anmosed policy is carried out.

In delegating Henry L. Stimson, Secretary of War; Cordell Hull, Secretary of te, and Henry Morgenthau, jr., to take concrete action to save what he termed vilian victims of enemy savagery," the Passident said that they will cooperate in a work with the Intergovernmental Refugee Committee, which in recent months has been ribund, the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration and other interest international organizations.

The Full Text of President Roosevelt's Executive Order

The full text of the Executive Order issued by President Roosevelt establishing War Refugee Board reads as follows: "Whereas it is the policy of this Government take all measures within its power to rescue the victims of enemy oppression who

n imminent danger of death and otherwise to afford such victims all possible reand assistance consistent with the successful prosecution of the war.

"Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution the attatutes of the United States as President of the United States and as ander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy, and in order to effectuate with all possible the rescue and relief of such victims of enemy oppression, it is hereby ordered blows;

"1. There is established in the Executive Office of the President, a war refuboard. The Board shall consist of the Secretary of State, the Secretary of the sury and the Secretary of War. The board may request the heads of other agencies epartments to participate in its deliberations whenever matters specially affectsuch agencies or departments are under consideration.

"2. The board shall be charged with the responsibility for seeing that the coy of the Government, as stated in the preamble, is carried out. The functions he board shall include, without limitation, the development of plans and programs the inauguration of effective measures for the rescue, transportation and maintenand relief of the victims of enemy oppression, and the establishment of havens emporary refuge for such wictims. To this end the board through appropriate mels, shall take the necessary steps to enlist the cooperation of foreign governments and obtain their participation in the execution of such plans and programs.

Board Authorized to Obtain Shipping Facilities

"3. It shall be the duty of the State, Treasury and War Departments within their pective spheres, to execute at the request of the board, the plans and programs so cloped and the measures so inaugurated. It shall be the duty of the heads of all noies and departments to supply or obtain for the board such information and to extend to the board such supplies, shipping and other specified assistance and facilities, the board may require in carrying out the provisions of this order. The State artment shall appoint special attaches with diplomatic status, on the recommendan of the board, to be stationed abroad in places where it is likely that assistance be rendered to war refugees, the duties and responsibilities of such attaches to defined by the board in consultation with the State Departments.

"4. The board and the Stato, Treasury and War Departments are authorized to ept the services or contributions of any private persons, private organizations, te agencies, or agencies of foreign governments in carrying out the purposes of sorder. The board shall cooperate with all existing and future international anizations concerned with the problems of refugee rescue, maintenance, transportam, relief, rehabilitation and resettlement.

"5. To the extent possible the board shall utilize the personnel, supplies, coilities and services of the State, Treasury and War Departments. In addition the utd, within the limits of funds which may be made available, may employ necessary resonnel without regard for the Civil Service laws and regulations and the classifition act of 1923 as amended, and make provisions for supplies, facilities and servision sector who shall serve as its principle executive officer. It shall be the duty of a executive director to arrange for the prompt execution of the plans and programs veloped and the measures inaugurated by the board, to supervise the activities of a special attaches and to submit frequent reports to the board on the steps taken in the rescue and relief of war refugees.

"6. The board shall be directly responsible to the President in carrying out e policy of this Government, as stated in the preamble, and the board shall report

im at frequent intervals concerning the steps taken for the rescue and relief of refugees and shall make such recommendations as the board may deem appropriate for her action to overcome any difficulties encountered in the rescue and relief of refugees."

Jewish Organizations Acclaim Roosevelt's Establishment of a Refugee Board

NEW YORK, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- The American Jewish Conference today issued a tement expressing "profound appreciation to President Roosevelt "for his executive or establishing a War Refugee Board. The Conference promised to "make every possicontribution to facilitate the work of the new agency."

"The action taken by our President promises life to people who were otherwise and to destruction and will be welcomed by millions of Americans who have been bly concerned with this pressing problem." the statement said.

At an all-day session of the Zionist Administrative Council attended ty 150 resentatives from all parts of the country, Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the six Organization of America, termed the establishment by Frendent Roosevelt of War Relugee Board an "important initial step in the direction of saving the remis of European Jews who are threatened with extemination in the path of retreating hordas."

ISH GROUPS ARE BUYING LAND IN SYRIA AND LEBANON; LEBANESE PREMIER DISAPPROVES

LO-JEWISH ASSOCIATION REAFFIRMS STAND AGAINST COOPERATION WITH JEWISH CONGRESS

LONDON, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- The Council of the Anglo-Jewish Association at its ting today resiffirmed its attitude with regard to the planned collaboration of the rd of Deputies of British Jews with the World Jewish Congress.

The Council emphasized that under no circumstances will the Anglo-Jewish assotion be involved in any arrangement where international Jewish organizations, such the World Jewish Congress, are equally involved. The statement is interpreted to in that the Anglo-Jewish Association will refrain from cooperating with the Board of uties on questions concerning Jews abroad as long as the Board continues its alliwith the World Jewish Congress.

The statement expresses the hope that the Board of Deputies will reconsider its ision to form a liaison committee of its representatives and representatives of the 1d Jewish Congress, to exchange information and unify the plans of action with red to Jews in Europe. The statement in its conclusion lays emphasis on the Angloish association's determination to make the contribution of the Anglo-Jewish munity in the forthcoming peace-settlement discussion as effective as possible.

PERMITS AMERICAN ORTHODOX GROUP TO SEND FOOD PARCELS TO RABBIS DUTY-FREE

NEW YORK, Jan. 23. (JTA) -- A first shipment of 1,200 parcels of kosher food, lish rabbis and yeshiwah students now in Russia, was delivered last week by the Raatzalah, an orthodox Jewish relief committee, to the Russian War Relief for ortation to the U.S.S.R., it was announced here today.

The committee plans to send a similar quantity of kosher food each month for tranded rabbis and yeshivah students, the announcement states. An arrangement send, according to which the receipients are to pay no custom duty, has been red by the Soviet Government.
