APO PERMITS DANISH DIPLOMATS TO VISIT JEWS IN THEREZINSTADT: ALLOWS NO PARCELS

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 26, (JTA) — Two representatives of the Danish Ministry of ign Affairs have been allowed by the German authorities to visit the Czech fortcity of Theresinstadt where 1,600 Danish Jews are confined together with Jews food from Germany, Austria and Bohemia-Moravia.

The report of the Danish officials, made public in the press here today, states due to Demmark's special position - it is not considered as occupied country - Danish Jewish deportees are treated better than the other Jews in Theresinstadt. Gestapo, however, does not permit residents of Demmark to send parcels to Jews in esinatatte.

The Danish authorities are trying to maintain contact with the Danish Jews in rezinstadt, but they meet with strong Gestape opposition. Food parcels, therefore, not sent to the Danish Jews directly from Copenhagen but through the International Cross in Switzerland. Individually signed form letters from Theresinstadt confirmett these parcels.

It is now possible to state that 8,000 Jews from Denmark have succeeded in ching Swedens. They include foreign Jews living in Denmark prior to the Gestapo ds there. At present only few Jews are still hiding in Denmark, trying to escape ortation from the country. They are being sheltered by non-Jewish friends and it of them will probably reach Sweden within the next few weeks.

HER OF MURDERED JEWS IN FOLAND EXCEEDS REPORTED 2,000,000 FIGURE

JERUSALEM, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Two members of the Folish underground movement o have just reached Felestine told a Jewish labor conference today that the report at 2,000,000 Jews have been annihilated by the Germans in Fol

"When we, in the underground, learned of the announcement made in New York hat 2,000,000 Jews have perished in occupied Poland, we decided to make a reliable westigation," one of the arrivals reported. "Our survey established that the number f exterminated Jews is much larger than 2,000,000, since hundreds of thousands of two from other countries were brought by the Germans to Poland and annihilated there."

Many of those present at the meeting wept loudly as they listened to the eyestness reports of the underground representatives. It was announced at the meeting hat the Jewish National Council of Palestine today sent a cable to U. S. Secretary of State Cordell Hull emphasizing that there are still possibilities of resouing Jews rom occupied territories. Similar cables were sent to Winston Churchill and to the oviet Foreign Commisser Vyacheslav Molotov. The latter two were despatched through the Pelestine Governments.

The entire Jewish press here lauds President Roosevelt's establishment of the War Refugee Board, expressing the hope that the new body will act immediately to rescue the Jews of Europe.

FRENCH COMMISSIONER FOR JEWISH AFFAIRS CHARGED WITH EMBEZZLEMENT OF JEWISH FUNDS

LONDON, Jan. 26. (JTA) — Darquier de Pellepoix, notorious anti-Semite and prench Commissioner for Jewish Affairs, was recently arrested by the Vichy ities on the charge that he embezzled funds confiscated from Jews and entrusted under the anti-Jewish laws, it was learned here tSday. After several days of comment, he was released pending investigation.

TIME ARABS FAIL TO AGREE ON FORMATION OF DELEGATION TO ATTEND CAIRO UNITY TALKS

JERUSALEM, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Preliminary talks by Arab leaders in Palestine ng towards the formation of a united delegation to attend pan-Arab unity talks proceeding in Cairo have broken up without any decision being reached, according report appearing in the Hebrew daily "Hearets," today. The newspaper says that as decided that the Palestine Arabs would send observers to Cairo if they could agree on the composition of a delegation. It quotes "a reliable Arab source" as ing that some decision will be reached before Premier Nuri es Said of Iraq leaves for home.

The newspapers "Davar" and "Hatzofe" add that during the talks, the Arab notadiscussed a general "Arab-Jewish understanding on the various vexing problems in Pelestine. The arabs decided, according to these reports, that such negotias would have to be held with representatives of the leading institutions of the stine Jewish community and not with Dr. Judah L. Magnes or the "league for Arabsh Rapprochement."

A \$200,000 Arab Building Fund has been established in Jaffa to construct low-housing for Arab workers, it is reported here. In Haifa, another report states, b financiers and engineers are planning to set up a housing corporation for the purpose. The Government has announced that it will permit the erection of 600 mes by Arab and Jewish groups.

ATIONS BETWEEN JEWS AND BRITISH IN PALESTINE WORSE THAN EVER, SAYS BENTWICH

ETY PERCENT OF AMERICAN JEWS FAVOR ZIONISM, DR. GOLDMANN REPORTS IN LONDON

LONDON, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- America is now prepared to accept responsibility in Near East, Dr. Nahum Goldmann told the press here todays "We hope that Britain, rica and perhaps Russia will cooperate in the solution of the Near Eastern problem, bluding the Palestine problem," he said.

Hinety percent of American Jews are now favorably inclined toward Zionism, he serted. The majority of American non-Jews are also sympathetic to Jewish aspiration Palestine, he added.

"I em convinced that we still have the sympathies of many of Britain's leading atesmen," the member of the executive of the Jowish Agency declared. "I have reason believe that our demands will be recognized and will be met justly."

ORGANIZATIONS CALLED ON TO WORK TOGETHER FOR RESCUE OF JEWS IN EUROPE

NEW YORK, Man. 26. (JTA) -- A call to all Jewish organizations to "pool their es and resources in the common cause of saving human lives" was issued here toby Dean Alfange, co-chairman of the Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish of Europe at a dinner tendered to him by the Committee at the Hotel Commodore.

Secretary of the Interior Ickes, in a message to the gathering said that the rs and members of the Emergency Committee should feel gratified by the order of dent Roosevelt establishing a War Refugee Board to resoue Jews and other perseminorities in Europe.

Mr. Alfange emphasized that he speaks "as a Christian who believes in the of Christianity." He condemned anti-Semitism as a menace to America. "Those uplot and those who tolerate bigotry in any of its ugly forms are political at heart," he said. "They speak the language of fascism and use the weapons of rism. They are false to American history; traitors to American unity and enemies a American way of life. The recurrent waves of anti-Semitism and the tragic y of the United Nations to the plight of the defenseless Jews of Europe are by no the sole concern of the Jewish people. They are the vital concern of every to man and woman, of every liberal-minded person throughout the world."

Other speakers included Supreme Court Justice Ferdinand Pecora, who was toaster; Representative Emanuel Celler, Peter H. Bergson, a co-chairman of the Emergency ittee and Rabbi Louis I. Newman.

The pledge, originally suggested by Judge Proskauer in a radio address on ary 11, has already been approved by the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Roman olic Archbishop of New York. In announcing his support of the pledge, Bishop for said:

"The fourfold pledge which Judge Proskauer suggested in his radio address vered on January 11th is a basis on which all men of goodwill can make their conal influence count for justice and brotherhood. The proposal is altogether rable. If all the members of our Churches would act in the spirit of Judge kauer's commitment it would mean a better day for America and for the world. I very happy to associate myself with his suggestion that we all adopt this modern valent of the Hippocratic oaths"

Judge Proskauer expressed satisfaction at the endorsement of his pledge by ding representatives of the Protestant and Catholic churches. He stated today: "I delighted to see that, through the leadership of Archbishop Spellman and Bishop Er, the oath which I suggested as one means of combating the 'divide and conquer' ties of our axis enemies has now become a truly American inter-faith pledge."
