#### UTION ASKING JEWISH COMMONWEALTH INTRODUCED IN HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- A resolution urging the United States to take ropriate measures" leading to the establishment of a Jewish Commonwealth in Paleswas introduced in the House of Representatives today with the support of leaders oth political parties.

The resolution, which was referred to the House Foreign Affairs Committee, does specify what measures should be taken, but favors "free entry of Jews" into Palesand advocates "full opportunity for colonization" by Jews in Palestine. Sponsored he American Zionist Emergency Council and by the American Jewish Conference, the lution was introduced by Representative Jewes A. Wright (Penn. Dem.) and Ranulf ton (Comm. Rep.)

#### Full Text of The Resolution

The full text of the resolution reads:

"Thereas the Congress of the United States on June 20, 1922, unanimously reved, 'that the United States of America favors the establishment in Palestine of a ional home for the Jewish people, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of Christian and all other -jewish communities in Palestine, and that the holy places and religious buildings sites in Palestine shall be adequately protected, and

"Thereas, the ruthless persecution of the Jewish people in Europe has clearly onstrated the need for a Jewish homeland as a haven for the large numbers who have one homeless as a result of this persecution.

"Therefore be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the United States America that the United States shall use its good offices and take appropriate sures to the end that the doors of Palestine shall be opened for free entry of Jews to that country, end that there shall be full opportunity for colonisation, so that Jewish people may ultimately reconstitute Palestine as a free and democratic is the Commonwealth."

## Congress Leaders Support Proposal

Rep. John W. McCormack, majority leader, in a statement to the press declared, he resolution expresses the policy of our country in the light of the stern realises of the present hour, and voices the desire of the American people that the Jews owere the first victims of Meai terror shall be given the chence to enter their tional homeland, to settle and work there in farm and in factory and to join with one Jews who have preceded them to continue to build a free and democratic Jewish monomements.

Rep. Joseph W. Martin, Republican floor leader from Massachusetts, in a statement also given to the press, stated; "The Palestine resolution meets with my hearty proval. This resolution is a reaffirmation of the established policy of the United ates in favor of a Jewish Mational Home in harmony with the new and terrible realism with which the Jews of Europe are faced today."

#### OF WAR REFUGEE BOARD DEFENDS ON PALESTINE IMMIGRATION, DR. SILVER SAYS

NEW YORK, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- A statement lauding the resolution which was ined today in the House of Representatives, urging the United States to take es which would aid in the establishment of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine, sued here by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American Zionist Emergency 1.

"The palestine Resolution introduced in Congress is a great act in behalf of a cause in a great and historic hour," the statement read. "All men of good will here -- Jews and non-Jews alike -- will applaud and endorse the spirit of statesip and noble humanity which motivated the introduction of this Resolution."

Dr. Silver emphasized that the British White Paper which would close the doors lestine to future Jewish immigration "is not only a regulation of an internation-ligation to which the United States subscribed, but it will interfere in a most trous manner with the rescue program of the War Refugee Board which the President e United States has recently established. Palestine is the most likely and ly-available haven and shelter for these millions whom it is hoped to save from mination," he added. "The work of the War Refugee Board will be doomed to failure re all previous efforts on the part of intergovernmental agencies if Palestine is excluded from consideration as the major place for large-scale Jewish immigration.

# STINE GOVERNMENT ISSUES LAST IMMIGRATION SCHEDULE BEFORE WHITE PAPER GOES INTO EFFEC.

JERUSALEM, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The last immigration schedule to be issued by the stine Government before the terms of the MacDonald White Paper of 1939 go into ct was made public here today. It will permit the entry of 900 Jewish "principal grants" and their wives and children under eighteen in the three-month period ng March 31, 1944, the date from which Jewish immigration into Falestine will be ed under the White Paper.

The schedule issued today calls for the admission of a total of 2,900 principal grants, 100 of whom will be non-Jews. However, from the 2,800 Jewish total the rument has subtracted 1,900 viaas for Jews who have entered the country illegally expril, 1939, and who were never charged against the 75,000 total allowed by the te paper.

Although, about 30,000 of these 76,000 visas still have not been issued owing war-time difficulties, the British Government announced last year that they would made available at any time after March 31, 1944 when it is possible for Jewish igrants to leave Europe for Palestine. It is not expected, however, that these xpended visas will be issued at three-month intervals as has been the proceedure up now.

The present system was based upon the absorptive capacity of the country, and three-month allotment of visas was termed the "Labor Immigration Schedule." In future, however, all visas will come from the unexpended 30,000, and will be isden Jews are released from occupied territory to come to Palestine, rather than the bests of the need for labor within the country.

The term of office of Sir Harold MacMichael, Palestine High Commissioner, has en extended for six months, it was officially announced today. Sir Harold's term ignally expired in March, 1943, and was extended at that time for one year. He has en in office since 1957.

### HURCH PEACE UNION CONDEMNS ANTI-SEMITISM; ASKS FOR LARGER REFUGEE IMMIGRATION TO U.S.

NEW YORK, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- Resolutions favoring "a large increase" in refugee migration to the United States within the present quota law and calling for the ithdrawal of the British White Paper were unanimously adopted by the Church Peace nion at the annual meeting of its Board of Trustees this week, it was announced today.

A resolution condemning anti-Semitism in the United States was also adopted at he meeting. "The Church Peace Union," the resolution reads "again express its deep oncern because of the growth of anti-Semitism in the United States, not only because is anti-Christian and inhuman, but also because it has become and is the entering edge of fascism, reactionism, and other subversive movements. It is used as a weapon o overthrow the civilization based upon the Bible and substitute for it a brutal againsm."

The resolution opposing the British White Paper reads: "The Church Peace mion calls for the withdrawal of the White Paper denying immigration into Palestine for March 31, 1944. It erdently requests all humanity-loving people to demand iberal immigration into Falestine according to its absorptive capacity within the mtent of the Balfour Declaration and the Mandate of the League of Nations, and urges are Government to use its good offices to this end."

## NSTITUTE FOR PALESTINE RESEARCH ESTABLISHED BY ZIONIST EMERGENCY COUNCIL

NEW YORK, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- An Institute for Palestine Research, headed by r. I. B. Berkson, noted educator and author, has been established by the American ionist Emergency Council, it was announced today by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman f the executive committee of the Council. The Institute has been created to collect and organize data relative to the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palesine and to Zionist matters generally.

Dr. Berkson, who will direct this activity, has made notable contributions to ducation both here and in the Middle East for many years. From 1931 th 1935 he was member of the executive of the Jewish Agency in Palestine. He is the author of many ooks. Assisting Dr. Berkson in this work is Dr. Benjamin Shwadren, who will specialze on matters involving the policy of the League of Nations and Great Britain. Dr. Escirryb, formerly Director of the Economic Research Institute of the Jewish Agency in alestine, will concentrate on material relating to the development of the Jewish lational Home.
