SSIA JOINS INTERGOVERNMENTAL COMMITTEE ON REFUGEES; PERMITS POLISH JEWS TO EMIGRATE

WASHINGTON, Jane 28. (JTA) - The work of the Intergovernmental Committee on fuges assumed new importance today when it was learned in diplomatic quarters here at Russia has agreed to join.

Russia's decision to become a member of the Committee opens new possibilities or refugee relief and resoue work. Its decision is expected to be announced officially on by headquarters of the Intergovernmental Committee in London.

(In London, Dr. Ignacy Schwarzbart, Jewish member of the Polish National Council, ald the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that the first group of Polish Jews in Russia to have relatives in Australia has been permitted by the Soviet authorities to emitate to Australia, after their relatives secured Australian visas for them. The cup, consisting of 23 persons, has already beached Persia. No details are available to whether the group consists of Jews born in the part of Poland not claimed by assia. Refugees born in the sections of pre-war Poland which are claimed by Russia re considered by the Soviet authorities to be Russian citizens.)

R REFUGEE BOARD ORDERS U. S. DIPLOMATS ABROAD TO SPEED IMMEDIATE RESCUE OF JEWS

WASHIEGON, Jan. 28. (JTA) -- The War Refugee Board which was established this seek by Fresident Roosevelt to save Jews and other persecuted minorities from Nazi ands, today announced that "all United States diplomatic and consular offices throughed the world have been instructed to do everything possible to effectuate this Government's war refugee policy as announced by the Fresident, bearing in mind the urgency f the problem."

The Board also announced that "foreign governments are being approached to asertain the extent to which they are prepared to cooperate." Immediate reports have sen requested by the Board from American officials abroad, including information as the permission granted to war refugees to enter each country, the encouragement and cooperation given to such entry, and the extent to which each country does not cooperate in permitting entry.

"Where refugees are refused entry at frontiers, the facts and reasons for such ction have been requested," the Board disclosed. "Recommendations as to a possible ine of action have been asked, with notation of special obstacles which may handicap escue operations and methods of overcoming such obstacles."

The instructions were despatched following the first meeting of the War Refugee card which took place on Wednesday, attended by Secretaries Hull, Stimson and Orgenthau. "All missions were advised that instructions have been issued by the resident to the Secretary of State, the Secretary of the Treasury and the Secretary of War to endeavor to effect immediately the resoue and relief of Jews in Europe and fother victims of Nazi terror," the announcement of the Board stated.

The instructions to U. S. diplomats abroad for details concerning countries which inder resoure of refugees may indicate a new policy of "tough talk" to neutrals that seek excuses to exclude refugees.

(Dr. Nahum Goldmann, chairman of the administrative committee of the World ewish Congress, stated in London today that "there is reason to hope that Jewish

perts, especially from Europe, will be attached to the office of the Director of the Refugee Boards. Addressing a press conference, Dr. Goldmann lauded the establishing of the War Refugee Board as indicating that "the U.S. Government is determined abandon routine methods for energetic resoue work.")

Hias Presents \$100,000 Check to War Refugee Board

The Washington office of the Hias today announced that it has received a check \$100,000 from its headquarters in New York for presentation to the War Refugee and together with a copy of a letter addressed to President Roosevelt by Abraham man, Hias president.

Expressing the profound appreciation of the Board of the Directors of the Hias President Rosevelt's executive order establishing the Board, the letter says; a accordance with Paragraph 4 of your executive order, the Board of Directors has a honor to inform you that it has resolved to place at the disposal of the War fugee Board the services of its offices and personnel at home and abroad, and to fer its participation in the cost of the undertaking. In accordance with this solution, it has this day forwarded to the War Refugee Board a contribution of \$0.000.

Jewish Refugee Is First Contributar to Board

The Treasury Department announced that the first contribution to the War Refugee and was a check for \$10 from a Jewish refugee on a small bank in the midwest, it was companied by the following letter:

"Today we learned for the first time that President Roosevelt has ordered tual measures for the rescue of those Jews and other people still under Hitler's el. My wife and myself are among the fortunate Jewish people, who after years of rescution and concentration camps found refuge and a real home in the blessed U.S.A. r only sorrow concerns the fate of our dear mother, 77, and our friends, who were ken 16 months ago, out of their homes to some unknown place.

"I am 61, and my wife is 52, so we are not able to make muuch money, expecially we were not used to hard physical work. That is why we are not able to send more an this \$10 -- which we ask you to accept as our contribution for this good cause. are living in this small Ohio town where we were received and accepted as equals ong friends we never met before. We will show our gratitude to this country by ing everything in our limited power."

WISH AGENCY OBTAINS RELEASE OF GREEK JEWISH REFUGEES INTERNED IN SYRIA

JERUSALEM, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- A group of Greek Jews who succeeded in fleeing to ria in a small boat will shortly arrive in Falestine, as a result of intervention by e Jewish Agency, it was learned today. The refugees have been interned at Haleb, in rie, since their arrival there.

Chief Rabbi Isaac Herzog is leaving for Turkey next week in connection with ans to rescue Jews in the Balkan countries, it is reported today. He will be acmpanied by Mordecai Eliash, legal adviser of the Jewish National Council.

The Hebrew press, as well as Jewish Agency circles, commentedunfavorably today the immigration schedule for the three months ending March 31, which was announced sterday. It is understood that the Agency will demand additional visus, besides the O provided in the schedule, on the basis that there are thousands of refugees in ain, Fortugal, Turkey and some occupied countries anxiously awaiting an opportunity emigrate to Palestine.

PANESE CONFERENCE DECIDES TO ELIMINATE JEWS FROM ECONOMIC LIFE OF OCCUPIED LANDS

LONDON, Jan. 28. (JTA) -- Japanese political and social workers held a conferce this month in Tokyo devoted to the question of the complete elimination of Jews on the economic life in all territories occupied by the Japanese army, the Jewish rontcle reports today.

The report quotes a Japanese newspaper as stating that the conference decided severe anti-Jewish measures "in reprisal for Jewish pro-Allied activities."

DERGROUND EYE-WITNESSES CONFIRM ALL FOLISH GHETTOS HAVE BEEN LIQUIDATED

TEL AVIV, Jan. 28. (JTA) -- Two representatives of the Jewish underground in land who reached Felestine this week told today how last September they witnessed s liquidation of the Tarnow ghetto during which the Germans flung aged persons and ildren from high buildings to their death on the pevements below.

Addressing a press conference, the Folish Jews confirmed that all of the ghettos rolled have been liquidated. Those Jews who have not been executed are either conned in labor camps or hiding out from the Gestapo, they said. In Imow, during the rst day of Nazi occupation, 3,000 Jews were executed, while in Stanislawow 8,000 re murdered during a three-hour massacre in the Jewish cemetery. One of the Stanislawow victims, a young girl, cried out just before she was shots. Our brethren in lestine and America will averge Jewish blood," the underground fighters disclosed.

They reported that the ghetto in Cracow was liquidated in March, 1943 when 0,000 Jews were slaughtered in Jerusalem Alley; and that the last remnants of the wish population of Vilna were wiped out some time in May of last year. In Bialy-tok, Zaglembie and other places bitter battles were fought between ghetto residents and German and fascist Ukrainian police who assisted in the executions.

Armed Resistance Spread Throughout Ghettos

IONDON, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Armed resistance spread throughout all the ghettos of cland before the Germans succeeded in liquidating them, and many Nazis were killed in itched battles before-Jewish resistance was crushed, it is disclosed in a report resided from reliable underground sources.

At Tarnow, the report reveals, 7,000 Jews, mainly workers, engaged in a fierce truggle with Nazi soldiers who were sent to liquidate the ghetto. During the battle any Jews were killed and the survivors were loaded into closed trucks whose floors as been sprinkled with chemicals which asphyxiated them. Those who survived the ourney are believed to have been executed when the trucks reached the Oswiecim "death amp."

In the town of Stryj, where only 250 persons were left in the ghetto when the ermans came to liquidate it, several German policemen were killed by the Jews who led to the neighboring woods. Most of them were subsequently killed by pursuing estapo detachments.

In an attempt to avert armed resistance, the Nazis adopted a new method, the report says. In Sosnowice, the Jews were told that they were going to be exhanged for Germans and would be sent to Chile. When all the ghetto dwellers had been assembled, and after they had been permitted to write letters to relatives abroad telling about the projected exchange, they were lined up and shot.

OO CHRISTIAN MINISTERS URGE ROCSEVELT TO SEEK ABOLITION OF WHITE PAPER

NEW YORK, Jan. 28. (JTA) - The Christian Council on Falestine, representing 00 ministers, today released for publication a resolution calling upon Freedom sevelt and Secretary Cordell Hull "to use all appropriate measures" with the Bri-h Government for an early withdrawal of the White Faper which would close the gates Falestine to Jewish immigration.

"We join with a large majority of the English people in confidently following noton Churchill who, in 1939, denounced the Chamberlain-MacDonald White Paper on lestine as a breach and repudiation of the Balfour Declaration," the resolution ads. "We range curselves also on the size of the Fernanent Mandates Commission of a League of Nations under whose political authority Great Britain administers Palesne; this Commission condemned that White Paper at the time of its promulgation as a indefensible and flagrant breach of international good faith." Beyond all offer maiderations we call for the abrogation of the White Paper on the grounds of justice derey and in the interests of our common humanity.

"We, therefore, urge President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Secretary of State rdell Hull to use all appropriate measures with the British Foreign Office to secure the earliest possible date the withdrawal of that White Paper which denies immigration into Palestine after March 31, 1944. We addently request all humanity-loving ople to demand liberal immigration into Falestine according to its absorptive capaty within the intent of the Balfour Declaration and the mandate of the League of those, and urge our Government to use its good offices to this end."

MAGOGUES TO PRAY FOR REFUGEES EN ROUTE TO PALESTINE; SCHWEITZER ESCORTING GROUP

NEW YORK, Jan. 28. (JTA) -- The Joint Distribution Committee today announced hat a circular letter has been sent to all Jewish congregations in the United States equesting that prayers be offered for the safe arrival of the 740 Jewish refugees now a route from Spain and Fortugal to Palestine on the first commercial trans-Meditermanean voyage since June, 1940. The letter was signed by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, vice-mairman of the J.D.C.

The office of the Hias-Ica Emigration Association today received a cable from its representative in Spain stating that the Portuguese ship Nyassa which is carrying these refugees to Palestine left Spain yesterday after taking on 560 Jewish refugees to have been in Spain for a long time awaiting emigration. About 180 Jewish refugees boarded the vessel in Lisbon several days ago. Mr. Raphael Spanien, the representative of the Hias-Ica Emigration Association in Spain, supervised the embarkation, the cable said.

The refugees are being escented by David J. Schweitzer, special envoy of the Has-Ica Emigration Association. The Joint Distribution Committee is bearing almost the entire transportation costs of \$460,000. This group will bring to over 12,500 the number of refugees whom the J.D.C. has helped to escape from Europe to the Western Hemisphere and Falestine since Pearl Harbor.

BILL TO BAR RACIAL PROPAGANDA FROM THE MAILS APPROVED BY HOUSE SUBCOMMITTEE

WASHINGTON, Jen. 28. (JTA) -- A special subcommittee of the House of Representatives yesterday approved a bill to bar hate literature from the mails. The bill gives the Postmaster General power to decide what constitutes objectional material. It provides a fine of \$1,000 and a year in jail for sending through the mails material tending to arouse hatred against any individual or group.
