ASE OF JEWISH SOLDIERS IN POLISH ARMY SUBMITTED TO PRESIDENT: ASK REVERSAL OF VERDICT

LONDON, May 4. (JTA) -- The case of the twenty-one Jewish soldiers sentenced to mprisonment by a Polish court-martial for attempting to leave their units because of nti-Semitism and to join the British Army, was presented here today to Polish Presimum Waldyslaw Raczkiewicz by Dr. Ignacy Schwarzbart, one of the two Jewish members of the Polish National Council.

The President discussed for a full hour with Dr. Schwarzbart the position of the Jews in the Polish armed forces. At the same time the Polish National Council bleased today the text of the statements made by Dr. Scharzbart and by Dr. Emanuel terer, the two Jewish representatives, at a closed session of the Council two days to.

Both statements emphasized that the Polish people as a whole are not being cused of anti-Semitism, but that no attention has been paid by the Polish authorises to Jewish complaints about the mistreatment of Jews in the Polish Army. Both arged the military command with failing to deal with the problem energetically. By also urged the Jewish soldiers to remain in the Polish armed forces.

Dr. Schwarzbart, in his statement, demanded that the commanding officer reverse is sentences imposed by the court-martial. He also insisted that the Polish officers demanded have been practicing anti-sentiam be court-martialed. He urged that the plication, in official Polish documents, that the Jewish soldiers were tried for esertion be corrected and appealed to the Polish Government to eradicate anti-mittan in the army by intensified education.

Dr. Szerer also demended that the sentences against the Jewish soldiers be multid. He emphasized that he disagreed with the steps taken by the persounced wish soldiers, but added that they had not committed any crime since the Polish vernment had previously facilitated the transfer of 200 Jewish soldiers from the lish armed forces to the British.

WISH AGENCY LEADER RETURNS FROM VISIT TO LIBERATED ITALY; PRAISES JEWISH SOLDIERS

CAIRO, May 4. (JTA) -- Palestine Jewish military units in Italy have won high raise from British authorities for effective performance of all tasks assigned them, twas reported here today by Moshe Shertok, chief of the political department of the wish Agency, who has just completed an eleven-day tour of the Allied-held section f the country.

Discussing the position of the Jewish refugees in Italy, Shertok disclosed that bout one-third of the several thousand refugees in the liberated areas are still ving in camps. The remainder are scattered according to where work is available, he camps, he said, are well run although some of them are placed in unhealthy locators. What work the refugees obtain is usually of a temporary nature, Shertok tressed, and most of them are anxiously awaiting steps to provide them with permanent becomedations elsewhere.

The Agency political head said it was gratifying to see the Palestine Jewish bldiers, who are easily distinguishable by the distinctive insignia they wear. They we established close contact with Jewish men in the American forces and with the fugees, he stated, and have raised considerable amounts of money within their own mis to assist destitute refugees and have mided them in other ways.

O GERMAN-JEWISH REFUGEES IN BRITAIN HAILED FOR DEVELOPING NEW "WONDER DRUG"

LONDON, May 4. (JTA) -- Drs. Kurt Wallersteiner and Hans Enoch, whose developnt of a new anti-infection drug known as vivicillin has been halled by British dical and governmental circles, are Jewish refugees from Germany, it was learned re today.

Dr. Wallersteiner told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that both he and Dr. Enoch d been disappointed that in all the reports of their work on Twicillin no mention as made of the fact that they are Jewish refugees. The drug, which is similar to micillin, has been found effective in treating different types of serious war sualties as well as civilian ailments. It can be produced quickly and inexpensively.

Dr. Wallersteiner arrived in England in 1936 and is still "stateless" although is technical manager of the Watford Chemical Co. AR REFUGEE BOARD PLANS TO MOVE 5,000 JEWISH CHILDREN OUT OF RUMANIA

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- The War Refugee Board is determined to rescue 5,000 swish children from Rumania, it was revealed here today by Ira A. Hirschmann, who scently returned from Turkey where he was the Board's special representative.

Speaking before a group of editors at the Lotus Club, Mr. Hirschmann lauded he Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Agency for Palestine and the U. S. Amassador in Turkey, Laurence Steinhardt, for the efforts which they are making to are as many Balkan Jews as possible. He emphasized that the Joint Distribution ommittee enjoys a very fine reputation abroad for its efficient relief activities. e also commended the International Red Cross for cooperating with him in the rescue f Jews from Rumania.

The Rumanian Government, Mr. Hirschmann said, promised to place no difficulties n the way of Jews desiring to leave the country. So far three ships carrying Jewish assengers have succeeded in leaving Rumania and reaching Turkey. The passengers ere permitted to land on Turkish soil, in transit to Palestine, as a result of fforts made by Ambassador Steinhardt.

New York Times Supports Plan for "Free Ports" in America for Refugees

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- Support for the plan to establish "free ports" in the nited States for refugees in order to save as many Jews from occupied Europe as ossible, is given today by the New York Times in an editorial which urges that the ar Refugee Board be the agency to carry out this plan.

"When the idea of free ports in this country for war refugees was brought pin Washington recently there seemed to be two possible objections to it, one good at one bad," the editorial says. "The first objection was that it would be inhuman establish what might be regarded as concentration camps for refugees we were not alling to admit. The second was that some of these refugees might eventually get not the country, beyond the restrictions of the quota law. A study of the situation addictes that neither argument is valid. A refugee brought, say, to Ellis Island at there confortably housed and fed and treated with consideration, would be in eaven compared with the same person in Germany or Rumania. As for the danger of integes escaping into the United States from their places of detention, this is refly a menace to the safety of the Republic. We take this risk with our captive lemies. Why not with our luckless friends?

"The War Refugee Board, as its director, John W. Pehle, has indicated, would be logical agency to carry out the 'free port' plan. Perhaps Army camps, vacated as se peak of training asses, could be used. After the war some of the refugees might fely return to their countries of origin. Other might find homes in other countries sere immigrants might be needed and welcomed. Still others could in time be admitted gularly to the United States. The plan has nothing to do with unrestricted and controlled immigration. It is simply a proposal to save the lives of innocent popule," the editorial concludes.

NAI B'RITH NATIONAL WAR SERVICE CONVENTION OPENS IN NEW YORK TOMORROW

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- The national war service convention of the B'nai rith will open at the Hotel New Yorker here on Saturday with 240 delegates from 41 tes and four Canadian provinces in attendance. The meeting will discuss ways and ans of intensifying the organization's contributions to the war effort. The open-g session on Saturday night will be addressed by Henry Monsky, B'nai B'rith president.

EWISH NATIONAL COUNCIL PROCLAIMS "AARONSOHN MONTH" TO HONOR JEWISH HERO

JERUSALEM, May 4. (JTA) -- The Jewish National Council of Palestine today reclaimed the month of May as a "Aeronsohn Month" in commemoration of the 25th nniversary of the death of Aeron Aeronsohn, agronomist and political leader, who in he last world war organized a Jewish intelligence service in Palestine which helped agland to defeat the Central Powers in the Middle East.

Aaronsohn died in May 1919 in a plane orash while flying over the English hannel. He agreed to do intelligence work for the British on the condition that electine be given to the Jews after the war. His sister, Sarah, joined him in this ork and succeeded in securing important documents from German and Turkish officers hich she delivered in 1917 to British military headquarters. She was later arrested y the Turks and tortured for several days until she committed suicide.

Aaronsohn visited the United States in 1909 upon the invitation of the Departent of Agriculture. He was born in Rumania in 1876 and came to Palestine with his
arents in 1882. His father was one of the founders of Zikhron Yakov, one of the
idest settlements in Palestine.

SHUA RAVNITZKY, VETERAN JEWISH WRITER, DIES IN TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, May 4. (JTA) -- Joshua Ravnitzky, veteran Jewish writer, who first blished the works of Chaim-Nachman Bialik, died here last night from a brain emorrhage he suffered while attending a memorial gathering of friends of the Jewish riter Sholem Aleichem in the house of the latter's son-in-law, I. D. Berkovitch.

Ravnitzky was 85 years old. He came to Palestine from Russia after the revoluton. He collaborated with Bialik on a number of works, especially on the six-wolume lefer Heagadah" which is a collection of Jewish legends and aphorisms based on the laud. He will be buried today at the Old Cemetary in Tel Aviv next to the grave of alik.

MAN L. MEITES, PUBLISHER OF CHICAGO JEWISH CHRONICLE, DIES AT 67

CHICAGO, May 4. (JTA) -- Hyman L. Meites, publisher of the Chicago Jewish ronicle and superintendent of the Chicago Bureau of Water since 1931, died yesterday a heart allment in Passavant Memorial Hospital. He was 67 years old.

Born in Odessa, Russia, he came to the United States in 1891. In 1919 he foundthe Lawndale Press, which later was merged into The Chronicle. He organized the wish Historical Society of Illinois in 1918 and published a history of Jews in loago. He possessed the first membership certificate of the Knights of Zion, ted October 20, 1897, which made him the first officially recognized Zionist in 8 United States.
