NGARY CONSCRIPTS JEWISH WOMEN FOR FORCED LABOR; GESTAPO ENFORCES ANTI-JEWISH LAWS

GENEYA, May 8. (JTA) -- All Jewish women in Hungary between 17 and 30 years of must report for manual labor, under a new decree issued by the Hungarian Governnt, the Nazi Transocean news agency reported today.

Other reports reaching here from Hungary during the week-end reveal that the stapo, distrusting the efficiency of Hungarian officials, has assigned its own ents to enforce anti-Jewish measures in a number of Hungarian towns. This step was en on the pretext that "special security" measures were required in these localis because of the presence of German troops.

A proposal that Jews be exchanged for Hungarians residing in the United States in Latin American countries is published in the Budapest newspaper Esti Ujsag. paper says that this proposal was made in Stockholm.

Jewish organizations in Switzerland today received reports stating that the ition of the Jews in Hungary is going from bad to worse and that mass-arrests of Ithy Jews are taking place all over the country following the "liquidation" of ir enterprises. Many Hungarian Jews are attempting to reach Turkey through Rumania Bulgaria, one report said adding that a number of Jews have been arrested by anian frontier officials on the Rumaman-Hungarian frontier. Those arrested were ivered to the Gestapo and their fate remains unknown, the report declared.

Jews Arrested in Transylvania; More Anti-Jewish Orders Issued

The Budapest radio today announced that the German "security police" have ested 78 leading Jews in Kiloszvar (Kluj.) capital of Transylvania. No reason for arrests is given. The broadcast also reported that a number of Jews in Kiloszvar arrested during the week-end for not wearing yellow badges. Others have been d from fifty dollars to thirty days imprisonment for failing to display their low badge more conspiciously.

A new anti-Jewish decree announced over Hungarian radio stations today prohibits to produce or process any goods which are sold under government monopoly. Licenseld by Jews engaged in these industries are automatically revoked, the announcement . The broadcast also reported that two Hungarian non-Jews have been arrested in pest on the charge that they "were trying to help Jews conceal their property."

Budapest newspapers reaching here report that while "liquidating" many Jewishd enterprises, the Bungarian Government decided that leather factories owned by must continue their operations because of war conditions. "Production controllers" been appointed for all these factories in order to see that their production is decreased.

FRICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR ASKS ROOSEVELT TO ESTABLISH "FREE PORTS" FOR REFUGEES

PHILADELPHIA, May 8. (JTA) -- The demand for the establishment in the United ates of "free ports" for refugees, to where they would be admitted for the duration, s supported today in an appeal addressed to President Rossevelt by William Green, esident of the American Federation of Labor, who is now attending the International bor Conference here.

"I urge you, Mr. President, in my own name and in the name of all the members of e.A.F. of L. to cause the creation of free ports in the country for refugee victims the cruel war - now, before it is too late," Mr. Green's appeal to the President ated. "Such action on your part, I believe, will clear the way for similar action atter parts of the Allied and neutral world."

MANIA ORDERS YELLOW BADGES FOR JEWS IN MOLDAVIA; ARRESTS EMIGRATION LEADER

ZURICH, May 8. (JTA) -- Jews in the Moldavian section of Rumania, who have on exempt from wearing yellow badges, were ordered to don the yellow Mogen Dovid is week, the official German news agency DNB reports today from Bucharest.

Laughlin, who is being led for contempt of court, said that the petition was signed by 500,000 persons.

ISH REFUGEE INVENTOR OF "WONDER DRUG" RISKED LIFE TO TEST ITS EFFECTIVENESS

LOMDON, May 8. (JTA) -- Dr. Hans Enoch, German-Jewish refugee scientist who is discoverer of the "wonder drug" vivicillin, risked his life to test the efficacy the new drug, it was revealed here today. Unwilling to ask any person to volunteer what might have proved a fatal experiment, Dr. Enoch injected a deadly virus into melf and then used vivicillin in an attempt to combat it. The vivicillin worked the virus was destroyed.

FREME COURT JUSTICE MURPHY CALLS ON CHRISTIANS TO COMBAT ANTI-SEMITISM IN U. S.

NEW YORK, May 8. (JTA) -- A call to Christians to unite their efforts to comtanti-Semitism because anti-Semitism "is not only contrary to the teachings of correct but contrary to the teachings of Christ," was sounded today supreme urt Justice Frank Murphy, outstanding Catholic layman, in an address before the terfaith unity session of the national war service convention of B'nai B'rith at rangie Hall here.

Speaking as chairman of the National Committee Against Persecution of the Jews, stice Murphy said the committee "was organized solely by Christians. It is mainined and its activities are conducted solely by Christians, who also finance it mpletely." Assorting that the committee "will be militantly opposed to anti-Semitism cause of the dangers that it presents to American ideals and to Christian principles, stice Murphy declared:

"We shall do so in the American way. We shall not try to deprive those who may ifter with us of their right to free speech and press. But we shall energetically ad relentlessly oppose by every means at our command their victous and insidious roganda through a campaign of enlightenment and education in which we shall expose tragic error of their teachings. We shall be on guard from ocean to ocean -- by and by night; we shall carry on the campaign in the market place and in the forum order that the freedom for which our fathers fought and for which our children are lighting shall not perish from the new world."

Monsky Outlines Five-Point Program of Action

Henry Monsky, national president of B'nai B'rith, who introduced Justice arphy, proposed the following five-point program of action to bring home to the serious people the "viciousness and the dangers of subversive propaganda by hate-ingers!"

1. "Let us arm them with the weapon of understanding; 2. "Let us tell them se truth about this menace; 3. "Let us teach them how to recognize the symptoms of its dread social malady; 4. "Let us tear aside the veil of deception, usually in the form of a super-patriotic slogan or a high-sounding statement of purpose so freently used to cover up this nefarious purpose; 5. "Let us show the contributions each of the diversified cultural, religious and racial groups to the composite librar and welfare of America."

"An American citizen, true to the heritage of his country," Justice Murphy conmued, "cannot be anti-Semitic. He cannot persecute, or support the unequal or
scriminatory enforcement of law against any person whose ideas, practices or beliefs
dielkes or loathes. He cannot deny to any such person the right to speak freely
dfully, the right to pursue unmolested his profession and calling and the right to
actice his religion in an orderly manner."

Calling anti-Semitism "not only un-American" but "anti-Christian," Justice rphy asserted that it is impossible to understand how a man can hate or persecute Jews and at the same time pretend to keep allegiance with the principles of

ristianity, which teaches that all human beings are neighbors -- whatever their oe, color or beliefs. "To love one neighbor and not another, to hate and persecute r Jewish neighbors, is simply un-Christians" he said.

Mrs. Roosevelt Addresses Gathering; Receives Plaque

Other speakers at the inter-faith session were Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, who ad a message from President Roosevelt; and Senator Alfred Ms Cohen, honorery presint of B'nai B'rith, who dedicated on behalf of B'nai B'rith a service flag in honor over 22,000 members of B'nai B'rith and its youth affiliates who are in the armed roes and in memory of 177 members who have been killed in the war or are missing in tion.

Mrs. Roosevelt received from a delegation of B'nai B'rith Women a plaque to be mg in the recreation room furnished by the B'nai B'rith Women of Washington, D. C. d the B'nai B'rith National War Service Committee as part of B'nai B'rith's national revice program. This recreation room, the 825th of its kind equipped by B'nai rith for the army and navy in 42 states, is for the men attached to the White House tracks.

Addressing the convention, last night, Sigmund Livingston, founder and chairman the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, declared that the attitude concerning e Jew of a considerable segment of the American public, "is the direct result of the rman pre-war propaganda which, in the expenditure of money and in volume, exceeds y effort along these lines in all of history." He charged that Nazi propaganda contituted in effect an invasion of America, and emphasized that while the American ganizations which adopted the Nazi propaganda line had disbanded "at least outwardly ter Fearl Harbor, the propaganda was continued underground by native converts."

DHIST EMERGENCY COUNCIL WARNS AGAINST "AMERICAN LEAGUE FOR FREE PALESTINE"

NEW YORK, May 8. (JTA) -- The American Zionist Emergency Council, speaking for a major Zionist bodies in the United States, today issued "a warning to the Zionists America" against the activities of the newly-created American League for a Free lestine. In a statement circulated to all groups represented in the Council, it was arged that the League is attempting "to destroy Zionism and the Jewish Agency for lestine, the recognized spokesman of the Jewish people in all matters concerning the war of Pelestine."

Declaring that "full-page advertisements will not rebuild the Jewish National se," the Council(s statement scored the tactics of the League and labeled its maders "a small group of persons, who, within recent years, acting in accordance in the opportunistic impulses of the moment and exploiting the miseries which have allen our people abroad, have established one paper organization after anothers" "paper organizations" listed by the Council are the Friends of a Jewish Palestine, Committee for a Jewish Army, the Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish People of ope and the League for a Pree Palestine. "None of these organizations or committee: a had any official relationship, direct or indirect, with any responsible body in ricen Jewish life," the statement saids
