# LISH PRESIDENT ISSUES AMNESTY DECREE PARDONING ALL CONVICTED JEWISH SOLDIERS

IONDON, May 12, (JTA) -- Polish President Wladyslaw Raczkiewicz today issued a oree granting an amnesty to all 21 Jewish soldiers who were sentenced by a Polish ourt-mertial to terms of imprisonment varying from one to two years on charges of aving their units, because of anti-Semitism there, and attempting to enlist in the ritish Army.

At the same time it was announced that preparations were being made here to myoke the first meeting next week of the "council for the Salvation of the Jews of land," whose creation was announced yesterday by the Polish Government. The council ill be composed of three Jewish members; Emanuel Szerer, Jewish Socialist deputy in he Polish National Council, Anselm Reiss, a member of the Representation of Polish wry and Rabbi Babad of the Agudas Israel, and three non-Jewish members of the tional Council: Adam Ciolkosz, Socialist, Witold Kulerski, Peasant Party and tanislaw Sopicki, Christian Democrat.

The official announcement said that the new group will cooperate with and gand the activities of the Welfare Council for Polish Jews, which was established Poland two years ago with the assistance of the underground. The Polish Governnt will place considerable sums at the disposal of the new council, which, it said, s created to satisfy the demands of exiled Polish Jewish groups for participation efforts to assist their brethren at home. It is expected that funds will be rthcoming from non-Polish sources as well.

## NGARIAN GOVERNMENT ORDERS PURGE OF "JEWISH BOOKS" IN BOOK-STORES, LIBRARIES

ZURICH, May 12. (JTA) -- The Hungarian Government today issued an order to all blishers, book stores and libraries to surrender all books written by Jewish authors local groups collecting paper for salvage.

Another order provides for the payment of ten pengoes by Jews applying for a avel permit. Twenty additional pengoes are to be paid by the applicants if the rmit is granted.

Hungarian newspapers reaching here today report that a number of Hungarian n-jews have been arrested in Budapest for providing Jews with documents identifying as Christians. The same papers reveal that a large number of non-jews visited e ghetto in Ungvar on the first day that the Jews were confined there. The visitors ought with them food and other presents for the Jews. As a result, the local police sued strict regulations prohibiting non-Jews from entering the ghetto premises thout special permission.

A number of Christians refused to leave their dwellings in the ghetto in Kassa, 6 Hungarian papers report. They were warned by the local authorities that they uld be treated as Jews if they insisted on remaining in the ghetto. In a number of ovincial towns, Hungarian girls were arrested for strolling in the street with wish young men who were wearing the yellow badge.

## BOR DELEGATES AT I.L.O. CONFERENCE DEMAND "FREE PORTS" AND PALESTINE IMMIGRATION

PHILIDELPHIA, May 12. (JTA) -- Labor delegates from 24 countries attending the nference of the International Labor Organization here today issued a joint declaration calling upon the governments of the United Nations to take steps to keep "the tas of Palestine open for Jewish immigration" and to secure the establishment of ree Ports" in all democratic countries for the purpose of providing shelter to fuges who succeed in escaping from Mazi countries "until such time as they will able to go back as free men to their liberated native lands."

The declaration also asked the governments of the United Nations to recognize is remaining Jews of occupied Europe as prisoners of war and to repeat the warnings the Nazis and their satellites that they will be called to account for their crimes ainst Jews and other civilians. It sent greetings to the surviving Jews in Europe to continue to fight for a civilized world and human brotherhood," and saluted the mory of the heroes of the Warsaw ghetto "who have fallen in the cause of freedom d democracy."

## WISH PROFESSOR TORTURED TO DEATH BY GESTAPO IN ROME PRISON

ZURICH, May 12. (JTA) -- Dr. Davide Ginsbourg, a former professor of Russian terature at Turin University, has died as a result of tortures suffered at the hands the Gestapo in the Regina Coeli prison in Rome, it is reported today by the Swiss alian-language newspaper Squilla Italica. The paper says that Ginsbourg had been meaned to five years imprisonment by a special court for anti-Fessist activity.

The Popolo e Liberta, another Italian-language paper published in Switzerland, day carries details of the massacre of Jews at summer resorts along Lake Maggiore orly after the Mussolini puppet regime was set up in northern Italy. The paper ys that special detachments of trained "Jew-hunters" were sent to the Lake Maggiore gion to round up and murder wealthy Jews and steal their possessions.

In one place sixteen Jews, including children were taken from a hotel to the ke-side, where they were machine-gunned and their bodies thrown into the water. The several weeks afterward the bodies floated ashore along the lake front. Among as were those of 'two children clasping each other in their arms. The extermination had stayed 20 days, during which many Jews were deported. After their departure, bodies of scores of Jews were found in shallow graves in different localities.

# WITH ANAIVERSARY OF BIRO-BIDJAN MARKED IN RUSSIA; PRESS LAUDS JEWISH ACHIEVEMENTS

# RICAN JEWISH CONFERENCE WILL CONVENE IN CHICAGO; SESSION SET FOR SEPTEMBER

NEW YORK, May 12. (JTA) -- The American Jewish Conference will reconvene for second session in Chicago on September 2, it was decided today by the Interim mittee of the Conference, meeting here.

The 502 delegates will meet on the anniversary of the adjournment of the first sion which was held in New York last Fall and which adopted resolutions on the scue of the Jews of Europe, their post-war reconstruction and the implementation of sish rights to Palestine. The second session will continue through September 4.

#### PTURED NAZI'S DIARY GIVES EYE-WITNESS ACCOUNT OF EXTERMINATION OF JEWS IN POLAND

MOSCOW, May 12. (JTA) -- A diary taken from a captured Nazi non-commissioned ficer, excerpts of which were made public here today, discloses the ferocity with ich the Germans wiped out the Jewish communities of Poland.

The diary, which covers two months in the fall of 1942, gives eye-witness tails of the extermination of the Jews in the Cholm and Lublin regions. The author Obergefreiter Karl Johannes Drekkel, attached to the 51st Reserve Battalion. Some the excepts follow;

"October 1 - Anti-Jewish campaign intensified; 10,000 Jews shot ranging from every old down to infants. All of them were loaded into carts and taken to common eves.

"November 2 - Raid on Jews. Three to four thousand Jews killed daily. They're ven off to their last march in columns and put to death by gas and charges of high tage electricity.

"November 7 - Five-hundred more Jews killed. Bunches of hand grenades were own into the sections of the city they inhabit.

"November 12 - A general massacre of Jews occurred for four days running.

# ISIS IN JERUSALEM MUNICIPALITY STIRS HOSTILITY BETWEEN JEWS AND ARABS

JERUSALEM, May 12. (JTA) -- The crisis in the Jerusalem municipality precipited by the walk-out of the Jewish aldermen in protest against the anti-Jewish marks of the Jerusalem mayor, Mustapha Bey Khalidi, at a conference of Arab mayors, the subject of heated discussion in both the Jewish and Arab newspapers. The lestime administration has refrained from commenting.

The Jewish press points out that Jews constitute a majority of the population Jerusalem. An Arab occupying the delicate position of mayor of such a city must, serfore, be more tactful in his attitude towards the Jews, the newspapers emphasizes if he does not desire, or is unable to change his attitude, then he should Newwo spost," the Davar writes.
