# LL HUNGARIAN JEWS WILL BE IN GHETTOSBY END OF MAY, OFFICIAL ANNOUNCES

ZURICH, May 16. (JTA) -- All of Hungary's 800,000 Jews will be'in ghettos by seed of this month; it was stated in Budapest today by Lazlo Baky, Under-Secretary fatte in the Hungarian puppet government. The final result of the Hungarian treatmost Jews "will be a Jewish exodus from Hungary," Baky said. At the same time, ingarian newspapers reveal that many Jews have been arrested and jailed for attempting to flee to Slovakia or Rumania;

Twenty-two ghettos, in which 60,000 Jews will be confined; have already been tablished in the Pest area; according to a dispatch from the Mazi Transkontinent ess. The Hungarian MII agency, meanwhile, sent out a dispatch admitting that depet Jews have been forced to settle near war factories threatened by enemy reids.

Lazlo Endre; Rungarian Commissioner for Jewish Affairs, in a broadcast today viewing the anti-Jewish regulations which have been introduced, revealed that a revisional executive" has been named to head the Association of Hungarian Jews, to ich all Jews must belong. The association, under government direction, will be appelled to arrange the transfer of Jews to ghettos, furnish lists of Jews for portation and; in general, carry out all the anti-Jewish measures decreed by the thorities.

### Jews Shorn of Possessions, Says Commissioner for Jewish Affairs

Endre said after completing a tour of 34 cities to check on the "problem of the s." he found the situation "satisfactory." Jews have already been placed in too in many of these cities, and they have been shorn of their possessions, he d. Endre alleged that many Jews burned bank notes in preference to surrendering in funds to the pro-Nazi government.

The police, meanwhile, are continuing to arrest Jews found in the streets haut a yellow star on their clothing. In the future, such persons will be sentenced a short prison term and then interned. At the same time, Hungarian newspapers terly attack non-Jews who fraternize with persons wearing the yellow badges.

One paper complains that many Hungarians in the sub-Carpathian town of Ungvar librately ignored the order providing for the interment of all Jews there and hid m in their homes: Many Christians, the paper said, have been arrested for conceal-valuables belonging to Jews.

#### MMISSION TO PROBE ANTI-SEMITISM IN POLISH ARMY MEETS TODAY

LOMDON, May 16. (JTA) -- The first meeting of the commission appointed by the lish Mational Council to look into the mistreatment of Jews in the Polish armed ress will take place tomorrow, it was announced today on the heels of a bitter bate in the Council on the question of Polish anti-Semitism.

At an evening session of the body yesterday, Dr. Ignacy Schwarzbart, Jewish put, charged that despite his protests to army authorities, the anti-Semitic belication "Halka," which is published in England, has been distributed among Polish peops for the past four years.

At a meeting here last night, arranged by the Jewish Socialist Bund to mark he first anniversary of the death of Samuel Zygielbojm, Jewish deputy who committed pictide in protest against the failure of the democratic countries to aid the Jews in bland, Premier Stanislaw Mikolajczyk decried the disputes that have arisen between bles and Jews and voiced the belief that "the bond tied by the blood which has been hed in a common cause will be stronger than all differences and all disputes."

## ITED STATES GOVERNMENT SECURED TRANSFER OF JEWISH REFUGEES FROM FINLAND TO SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, May 16. (JTA) -- Intercession by the American Government with the edish and Finnish foreign offices was responsible for the transfer of 10C-odd Jewish fugees from Finland, it is reported today by the Stockholm newspaper Mya Dagligt lehanda. Many of the refugees have already arrived here. It is understood that ey will be permitted to remain in Sweden until they can secure permanent residence sewhere.

A prominent Finn who has just arrived here told the newspaper Dagens Nyheter day that Finnish Jews are in no danger and their treatment up to now has given no counds for fearing that they will be persecuted. The Finnish spokesman is quoted as ating that "Jews have been considered worthy citizens." He alleged that the German thorities have been told that Finland will not tolerate anti-Jewish laws.

# 00 AMERICAN EDUCATORS APPEAL TO ROOSEVELT FOR FREE IMMIGRATION INTO PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, May 16. (JTA) -- A petition signed by 1700 American university of a sort urging President Rossevelt to act in behalf of free entry of Jews into lestine, "so that the Jewish people may ultimately reconstitute Falestine as a free democratic Jewish Commonwealth," was submitted to the White House today, on the fth anniversary of the issuance of the British white Paper of 1839, which prohibits new Jewish immigration into Palestine. Faculty members of 250 schools of higher traing in 44 states, including 150 college presidents, have signed the petition.

## ALIAN FASCISTS CONFISCATE 700 FARMS BELONGING TO JEWS

ZURICH, May 16. (JTA) -- The puppet Italian fascist government has already miscated more than 700 Jewish-owned farms comprising about 75,000 acres of land, was reported today by the German radio.

#### POSING ARAB GROUPS UNITED IN DEFENSE OF JERUSALEM MAYOR'S ATTACK ON JEWS

JERUSALEM, May 16. (JTA) -- Several opposing Arab political groups in Falestine day united in defending the Arab imayor of Jerusalem, Mastafa Bey Khalidi, for his nti-Jewish remarks at a conference of Arab mayors at which stronger measures against wish immigration and land aquisition were demanded of the Palestine Government.

The Arab National Defense Party, led by the Nashashibi family, today issued a anifeto "to the noble Arab people" calling upon all Arabs to unite "for the defense four threatened homeland." The manifesto contains a pledge by the Defense Party to make sacrifices and to act in accordance with decisions and the interests of the country."

The hebrew press today continues to support the attitude of the Jewish aldermen ho demonstratively walked out of the Jerusalem municipal council in protest against he anti-Jewish remarks of the Arab mayor, and who have not returned since. The shrew newspaper Hatzofeh says that the Jews ought to learn a lesson from the conferment of the Arab mayors. "These mayors, the paper points out," were unanimous in heir resolutions denouncing the Jews as enemies of the Arab people. None of them roposed any agreement with the Jews on the basis of a bi-national Arab-Jewish state. hereas among us, even the extremists wish Arab-Jewish understanding, cooperation and riendship."

#### DOSEVELT ASSURES JEWISH SOCIAL WORKERS OF U. S. ROLE IN POST-WAR REHABILITATION

CLEVELAND, May 16. (JTA) -- President Roosevelt, in a message to the annual seting of the National Conference of Jewish Social welfare, which opens here toprow, pledged that "America will play its full part in the vast program of rehabilition of human life and the reconstruction of the institutions of civilized living."

"The trained and experienced social workers of our country will have the portunity to perform their important and historic function in the wast program that is ahead," the President said in his message, addressed to Louis Kraft, president the Conference.

Assistant Scoretary of State, Adolph A. Berle, will be one of the principal schera at the five-day annual meeting here which will be held at the Hotel Statler intly with the National Association of Jewish Center Workers and the National wumil for Jewish Education. More than 1,000 delegates and visitors are expected to rticipate.

The program planned for the meeting is based on the studies of a number of mmunities and the discussions will include an examination of common problems. The bjects will be related to economic changes in Jewish life, group work and recreation, cultural and religious activities, community relations, youth, vocational adstreamts and recent developments with regard to problems brought about by the war tuttion.

The National Conference of Jewish Social Welfare is the professional body of wish social workers with a membership of 650 individuals and 250 agencies in every ate of the union, and in Canada. The National Association of Jewish Center Workers of the National Council for Jewish Education are devoted to the specialized fields group work activities and Jewish Education. Louis Kraft, New York, is president the conference; Meyer E. Flohman of Los Angeles is president of the Center Workers oup; and Rabbi Samuel M. Blumenfield of Chicago, is president of the Educators.

#### TION ON "FREE PORT" PLAN WILL NEED BACKING OF CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS

WASHINGTON, May 16. (JTA) -- Authoritative circles today stated that whatever y be done about giving refugees from Europe temporary asylum on United States soil 11 require the backing of House and Senate leaders. This applies equally whether a action is taken by President Roosevelt or by Congress, it was emphasized. The attement was made in connection with the suggestion that the United States establish ree ports" as temporary haven for Jews who can still be rescued from occupied Europe.

In favor of executive action is the fact that the State Department still has, aissued, more than minety percent of the entrance visas authorized under the Immigration Law. Proponents of the "free ports" plan say that it would be entirely within the power of the Executive to issue those visas on a temporary basis. Official relss believe that there is no legal obstacle to executive action. However, affirtive action by Congress would place the matter beyond any question or doubt, they into out.

# Stalin Asked to Exchange Hungarian War Prisoners for Threatened Jews

NEW YORK, May 16. (JTA) -- The Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish People of ope today made public an appeal to Marshal Stalin, asking the Russian leader to recede to save the Jews of Hungary. The appeal suggests that Stalin agree to exage Hungarian prisoners of war for Jews in Hungary who are menaced by the Nazis, h Rohde, former U. S. minister to Norway, speaking at a press conference today, enged by the Committee, also suggested that Stalin issue a warning threatening the garians with severe punishment if they slaughter the Jews.
