41st STREET, NEW YORK 17, N. Y. INGARIAN GOVERNMENT OFFERED PLAN TO EXCHANGE JEWS FOR WAR PRISONERS

ZURICH, May 23. (JTA) -- Hungarian newspapers reaching here today report that mish leaders in Budapest have proposed to the Hungarian Government a plan of alriating the situation of the Jews in Hungary by exchanging thousands of them for mgarian war prisoners held by the Allies, as well as for Hungarians residing in lied countries.

The Budapest Jewish leaders, according to the Hungarian press, have also sugsted that the government permit the emigration of Jews who could be admitted to utral countries on the basis that they would be supported there by their relatives foreign lands.

The Nazi Transkontinent press reports today that the pro-German Sztojay governnt has established a "political police force" to carry out the anti-Jewish decrees. special "detective group" of the force has been entrusted with preventing circumvenon of the laws requiring the confiscation of Jewish property. As one of their first eps, the "detectives" seized 20 cases of art treasures from the family of the noted wish industrialist Baron Alphonse Weiss, including, it is reported, 83 kilograms of ld, jewelry and diamonds.

The director-general of the Budapest Art Museum, meanwhile, announced that as result of the confiscation of many rare paintings from Jews, including works of Greco, Velasquez, Goya, Rembrandt, Van Dyke, Gaugin and Rubens, the museum now has finest collection of Spanish paintings outside of Madrid.

Hungary Charged with Using Jewish Women for "Amusement" of German Soldiers

CAIRO, May 23. (JTA) -- The Yugoslav Government-in-Exile today released a ort charging the Hungarian authorities with sending large groups of young Jewish en to eastern Europe "for the amusement of German soldiers on the Eastern front." er transports of Jewish women are being sent from Hungary to Germany for forced or, the report said.

The information was received by the Yugoslav Government from its intelligence mts in Hungary. "Jews in parts of Yugoslavia under Hungarian occupation have been into special Jewish camps," the report continued. "Such camps are to be found in edin, Subotica, and Backa Palanka. In these last two towns, which are on Yugoslav ritory, the camps are near the railway station. From these two camps some Jews been sent to work in Serbia of which 46 have been liberated by a unit of General milovich's army. It is now believed that about five thousand Jews from Hungary per have been deported to work outside of Hungary. All Jewish property in Hungary been confiscated. Heads of families have been allowed to take with them at the t one thousand pengoes in cash."

ESTIED POLISH JEWISH SOLDIERS RELEASED FROM DETENTION

LONDON, May 23. (JTA) -- Twenty Jewish soldiers amnestied by Polish President skiewicz were released from their detention cells today. They had been convicted leaving their units because of anti-Semitism to join the British Army.

RE JEWS FROM RUMANIA REACH PALESTIME; EIGHTY JEWS ARRIVE FROM OCCUPIED GREECE

JERUSALEM, May 23. (JTA) -- A transport of 317 Jews arrived here today from mania by way of Turkey where they disembarked from the S. S. Maritza several days g. A group of 80 Greek Jews also arrived here today after a long danger-fraught cursy. The Rumanian Jews were given Palestine visas in Turkey, but the Jews from rece received Palestine immigration certificates from the Jewish Agency after they solded Palestine.

A report on the rescue activities conducted by the Jewish Agency was given ere today at a convention of the Mizrachi organization. The convention considered, mong other things, a proposal to send a delegation of prominent rabbis to the United tates and England to present the case of Jewish Pelestine before non-Jewish clergy-en and "persuade the religious world that Pelestine belongs to the Jews by Divine romise which can be fulfilled at the present moment."

LGIERS RADIO BROADCASUS WARNING TO JEWS IN FRANCE TO GO INTO HIDING

LONDON, May 23. (JTA) -- The Algiers radio today broadcast a warning to all Jews a roulouse, Limoges and other cities in France warning them to go into hiding on sureday. "We learn that the French police, with the aid of German soldiers, is planning a huge round-up of Jews on Thursday. It is essential that you take precautions as not to be caught when the raid takes place," the warning said.

The Vichy radio today announced that "200,000 Jews still remain in France." indicated that many of them may either be sent to Germany for slave labor, or will used by the German military authorities for constructing fortifications in France d Belgium in connection with the expected Allied invasion.

WISH LAWYER ATTACKS JEWS AT SEDITION TRIAL; GLAIMS INSTIGATED BY "PROFESSIONAL JEWS"

WASHINGTON, May 25. (JTA) -- Henry H. Klein, New York Jewish lawyer, who is rving as defense attorney for Eugene N. Sanctuary, one of the 29 defendants charged day that the mass-sedition trial was "instigated by so-called professional jews who has a business of preying on other Jews by searing them into the belief that their res and their property are in danger through threatened pogroms in the United States!

Ricin said that he had taken over Sanctuary's defense "in order to awaken the wish people of the United States to the tremendous wrong that is being done them by madful of self-important Jewish political madmen." He referred to Dr. Stephen S. se as a "political rabbi."

Joseph H. Bibrey, attorney for Frank K. Ferenz, said, "My client has indulged anti-Semitism, but that is not a sin. We all have a little of it."

TED LABOR SLATE FOR ELECTIONS TO PALESTINE JEWISH ASSEMBLY DEMANDED

TEL AVIV, May 23. (JTA) -- A resolution urging all labor groups to present a ted slate in the forthcoming elections to the Assenth Hamivoharim, the Jewish ideal Assembly of Palestine, was adopted here last night at the closing session of comention of the opposition group of the Palestine Labor Party.

Should this proposal be rejected by the Labor Party, the convention decided the opposition will run its own candidates, under the name "Movement for Labor ty." This will actually amount to a formal split in the ranks of the Labor Party.

Prior to adjourning, the convention, which was attended by more than 350 deless from all parts of Palestine, elected a council of 93 memors to work out a itical program for the group. It also elected a secretariat of 25 members which lades four Histodruth leaders.

MERICAN LABOR LEADERS FORBID LEAGUE FOR FREE PALESTINE TO USE THEIR NAMES

WASHINGTON, May 23. (JTA) -- William Green, president of the American Federaion of Labor and a number of other leaders of the American labor movement today
mounced that they have forbidden the American League for a Free Palestine to use
her names as members of the sponsoring committee of the organization which was
stablished by the same group which last week announced the creation of the "Hebrew

The announcement, made by Max Zaritsky, Jewish labor leader, also attacked the metrew Committee of National Liberation" as being led "by a handful of unidentified mividuals." The League was charged by Mr. Zaritsky with "high-handed, unethical recedure" in what he termed "the unwarranted use of my signature" by that organization.

STRALIAN GOVERNMENT URGED BY LABOR LEADERS TO ADMIT JEWS AFTER WAR

SYDNEY, Australia, May 23. (JTA) -- The Australian Government was urged today study the possibilities of allowing persecuted Jews to immigrate after the war, in resolution adopted by a conference of trade-unionists convened by the Australian moil for Jewish Rights.

The conference demanded a curb on social and economic discrimination against s and urged action to combat anti-Semitic activities. It also asked the opening Falestine to Jewish refugees. Dr. V. C. Filcher, Coadjutor Bishop of Sydney, told meeting that millions of Jews are fighting in the Allied armies and that their tribution must be recognized.

Supporting a plea by Dr. Pilcher for Jewish immigration after hostilities have sed, labor leader Colin Tannock said that Jews will be welcomed after the war, warned that they must not do anything to destroy the economic safeguards built up the trade union novement.

F JUSTICE STONE RECEIVES DEGREE FROM YESHIVA COLLEGE; BELKIN INSTALLED

NEW YORK, May 23. (JTA) -- Chief Justice Harlan Fiske Stone received the rary degree of Doctor of Laws today at the inauguration of Rabbi Samuel Belkin as ident of Yeshiva College. The degree of Doctor of Divinity was bestowed, at the time, upon Rabbi Isaac Rubinstein of Vilna, who was a member of the Folish senate 26 years.

Rabbi Belkin, who is only 35 years old, succeeds the late Dr. Bernard Revel, founded and was first president of the college. Before his election to the dency Rabbi Belkin served as dean and professor of Talmud and Frofessor of Helmitto Literature in the Bernard Revel Graduatt School, a department of the college.

OSEVELT CONGRATULATES DR. GOLDSTEIN OF 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF RABBINICAL SERVICE

MEW YORK, May 23. (JTA) -- President Roosevelt headed the long list of notables re and abroad whose messages of tribute to Rabbi Israel Goldstein, president of the cost Organization of America and of the Synagogue Council of America, for his sercest to world Jewry and to international inter-religious and inter-racial good will, re read tonight at the testimonial dinner in his honor culminating the celebration his 25th anniversary as rabbi of Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, second oldest Jewish impregation in New York.

A gift of \$60,000 raised by his friends in honor of the occasion was turned ler to the congregation by Dr. Goldstein. It will be used for the expansion of the ugregational activities, as part of an Israel Goldstein Anniversary Fund which, it hoped, will reach \$100,000. It was announced that Dr. Goldstein had declined to cept any personal gift from the congregation.

The dinner was held in the banquet hall of the congregation's community center to the Rt. Rev. Charles K. Gilbert, Suffragen Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal ocese of New York, Dr. Stephen S.
