WE MILLION JEWS "ELIMINATED" IN EUROPE BY GERMANY, NAZI NEWSPAPERS ESTIMATE

ZURICH, May 263 (JTA) -- German newspapers reaching here today carry a survey the number of Jews in Nazi-occupied Europe showing that approximately five million ws have been "eliminated" by the Germans in all German-controlled areas of the ropean continent.

A statement preceding the survey says that "there is no longer any Jewish oblem existing in the German Reich and even in other sections of Europe." The Jews we suffered "heavy losses" in Poland, the statement emphasizes, adding that "such wish centers as Warsaw and Lublin have been completely neutralized."

"By action taken up till the present time, five million Jews have been elimited in various countries of Europe," the statement reads. "There are still about 0,000 Jews to be dealt with in Hungary."

Hungarian newspapers arriving here today report that by the end of this month t a single Jew will be left in the city of Budapest. Under an order issued on y 22, the city must be made "judenrein" within eight days with all Jews removed to the ghettos in the suburb known as "Little Budapest."

Budapest newspapers report that many Jews are intentionally damaging their uses prior to leaving for the ghetto. SSIAN ADMINISTRATION IN BESSARABIA RETURNS TO JEWS PROPERTY CONFISCATED BY RUMANIANS

STOCKHOLM, May 26. (JTA) -- Jewish property in Bessarabia which was confiscated the Rumanian authorities has been returned to its owners by the Soviet administraon in the section of Bessarabia taken by the Red Army, it was reported today from charest by the Transocean news agency, a Nazi propaganda bureau.

The report, apparently aimed at picturing the Red Army as defenders of the Jews. so states that all anti-Jewish laws issued by the Rumanian Government were annulled Bessarabia immediately after the entrance of the Russian units. "Not only have ndreds of stores and workshops been transferred to Jews in Bessarabia, but Red Army Michals are even temporerily helping Jewish storekeepers to recover their merchan-se from the local Rumanians," the German report says.

The Bucharest radio today reported that three prominent Jews in the Rumanian ty of Timisoara have been sentenced to six months imprisonment "for carrying on ro-Allied propaganda."

Bichowski was one of 40 Jews who were brought here by the lish Ministry of National Defense to take a course in public welfare and education.

JERUSALEM, May 26. (JTA) -- Arab mayors in Palestine today announced that they il hold another conference early next month to demand stricter laws against immigrated of Jews to Palestine and the acquisition of land by Jewish residents. The antecement followed the disclosure that the Palestine Arab Party yesterday sent a ble to President Roosevelt appealing for his support of the Arab anti-Jewish demands.

### OSENWALD, WOLSEY ATTACK POLITICAL ZIONISM IN CINCINNATI; NEUMANN, HELLER REPLY

CINCINNATI, May 26. (JTA) -- Political Zionism was opposed and defended here lesing J. Rosswald and Rabbi Louis Wolsey, founder of the American Council for the American Council for lesist Emergency Council on the other.

Jews of America are at a vital moment in their history, wherein each must eithe if he or she is for or against Jewish statchood, Mr. Rosenwald and Rabbi Wolsey his several hundred (inneinnations at the Hotel Alms, speaking under the auspices of merican Council for Judaism. Both speakers charged that the official Zionist liey today holds that Jews are homeless everywhere save in palestine. Both speakers jested that idea and insisted that Jews are Jews by religion and are citizens of the ricular land in which they reside.

"I have tried repeatedly to persuade Zionists to debate with me the issue of litical Zionism, the idea of Jewish statehood," Rabbi Wolsey said. "But to no avail. ey refuse to debate the matter." An American of very high position told Dr. Wolsey at he fears continuance of the current Zionist pressure can only result in increase arti-Semitic manifestations, he said. A Briton of very high position was equally tapken with regard to the same matter, he added.

Stating that "the Zionists consider utilization of Palestine, as a haven of fixed, as of only secondary importance as compared with establishment of a Palestine manumelth," Mr. Rosemweld said that "the American Council for Judaism believes that a basis of unity among Jews is religion; Jews consider themselves nationals of those utries in which they live and those lands their homelands; numerous localities must found throughout the world where resettlement can be effected under favorable auspiss and Palestine should continue to be one of the places for resettlement; any hopelature for Jews in Palestine depends upon establishment of a democracy in which we, Woslems and Christians shall be justly represented in the effort to establish a mish mational state in Palestine or elsewhere is a prospect that has been and will deletarious to the welfare of the Jews in Palestine and throughout the world; all llosphies that stress the racialism, nationalism and homelessness of the Jews are judies to their interests."

Mr. Reserwald questioned whether or not the present standard of living smong win Falestine could be maintained if all outside aid were withdrawn. "The impressan has gained ground, though utberly erroneous, that the overwhelming majority of win this country are national Zionists. It is our belief that nothing could be ther from the fact. It therefore seems to us that there is a definite place in the twee for such an organization as the American Council for Judeism, he declared.

Addressing a mass-meeting at Wise Center called by the Committee on Unity for leatine, Mr. Neumann said that the Council for Judaism takes a self-contradictory litionwhen it declares opposition to the White Paper and, at the same time, declares elf-cpyded to a Jewish commonwealth. To stand for the principle of unrestricted tration, he stressed, is to lay the foundation for a commonwealth led by a Jewish crity. He set forth his position on the immigration versus Jewish commonwealth issue this manner. "If I had the choice between accepting from the United Nations, on one hand, a political formulation that when the Jews constitute a majority in Palithe they may form a Jewish commonwealth, and I was offered on the other hand, the latter place 1,000,000 Jews and we will see about the political future of Palestine."

# EF TORK LABOR COUNCIL ASKS AMERICAN AND BRITISH GOVERNMENTS FOR NEW PALESTINE POLICY

MEW YORK, May 26. (JTA) -- The Central Trades and Labor Council of the City of sw York, representing 700 trade unions and almost a million American Federation of the members, adopted a resolution today urging the American and Eritish Governments to bring about the immediate unequivocal repeal of the entire White Paper policy," mich prohibits further Jewish immigration into Palestine.

The resolution demanded a new policy for Palestine, "consistent with the tragic seds of the Jewish people and the magnificent contribution made by the Jewish workers felestine to the war effort of the United Mations." The measure also urged that be jewish people be given "equal status among the free nations of the world in the terrational planning for postwar settlement and rehabilitation."

## WISH GROUPS PRESENT CONGRATULATIONS TO BENES ON 60TH BIRTHDAY

## EWAY'S INDEPENDENCE MARKED BY REFUGEE SCHOLARS IN SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, May 26. (JTA) -- Addressing a festival here marking the anniversary independence, Prof. Hugo Valentin, well known Jewish scholar of Upsala iversity, voiced the conviction that Norwegians would celebrate their next indecidence day within the borders of their own country. Similar sentiments were expressibly Prof. J. Worm-Mueller, a refugee scholar from Norway. Prof. Valentin is the thor of "Anti-Semitism," which was published in the United States several years ago.

## MISH FUBLICATION SOCIETY DELIVERS MILLION COPIES OF PRAYER BOOKS FOR SERVICEMEN

NOW YORK, May 26. (JTA) -- The Jewish Publication Society of America has comted the delivery of over 1,000,000 copies of prayer books ordered by the Mational wish Welfare Board for the use of men and women of the Jewish faith in the armed ress of the United States, it was announced here today. Now in its fifty-seventh my, the Society has printed 200,000 chridged prayer books for jewish servicemen in Mater 1.

Besides these prayer books, the Jewish Publication Society has printed for the B 562,790 copies of a High Holy Day Prayer Book and, early in 1944 delivered 137,000 goddahs for Passover.
