HINGARIAN PRESS DEMANDS JEWS BE FORBIDDEN TO SMOKE; "AUXILIARY SERVICE" FOR JEWS

ZURICH. June 16. (JTA) -- A decree barring Jews in Hungary from smoking cigarttes and cigars - similar to restrictions in force in Germany and in the occupied countries - is demanded by the Hungarian press, the German radio reports today.

"Hungarian newspapers believe that the shortage of cigarettes and tobacco could effectively be remedied by prohibiting Jews from entering tobacco stores and by forbidding them to smoke," the broadcast said.

Budapest papers report that the mobilization of Jews in Hungary for "auxiliary military service" is being carried out with great speed. All Jews between 18 and 48 wars of age must report for service. Exemptions are made only for disabled soldiers of the last war, for rabbis and yeshiva students and for Jews employed in essential mr industries and in defense work. Doctors, engineers, pharmacists and veterinary surgeons are also being excused in various localities where they are needed. Jews failing to report for service will be punished by five years imprisonment or courtmartialled.

The association of cinema owners in Hungary has appealed to the government to modify its order banning Jews from visiting moving-picture houses. The association minted out that its: cinema houses are practically empty as a result of this ban. he appeal suggests that certain sections in these houses be reserved for Jews.

Revision of "Jewish" Trials since 1914 Demanded in Hungary

WASHINGTON, June 16. (JTA) -- Quoting Hungarian newspapers, the Office of War information today reported that "sweeping anti-Jewish measures, recently termed by the 1. S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee as 'cold-blooded murder,' continue in Hungary."

The report said that the Hungarian newspaper Magyersag demands an "official revision" of all trials since 1914 in which the plaintiff, his lawyer, the injured party or principal witnesses were Jewish. These cases should be entrusted to the people's courts which shall have the right to fix damages without right of appeal. "Inus," the paper says, "the peoples' feelings of offended justice will be satisfied."

Another article in Magyarsag discloses that the mayor of Magykoros, in central Ringary, has compiled a list which contains the names of all persons who intervene on behalf of Jews. The names of these persons will be published from time to time, the paper states. It complains that "streets named after Jews continue to offend the populase" and demands that "the situation be remedied immediately" and all streets be re-named "after great anti-Semitic leaders."

The Magyarsag also has attacked the Office for the Protection of Minor Children. according to the article, Jewish fathers and mothers, in an effort to secure their Property, have signed it over to their children. The Budapest newspaper accuses the office of cooperating with the parents.

MUISH JEW IN PALESTINE SENTENCED BY POLISH COURT-MARTIAL ALTHOUGH NEVER IN ARMED FORCES

JERUSALEM, June 16. (JTA) -- Polish military authorities here have sentenced a historia device in years imprisonment on charges of "desertion" although he was nover a maker of the Polish armed forces, it was disclosed today when his attorney filed a mit of habous corpus in Jerusalem district court.

The imprisoned man, Chaim Novik, was among the Polish refugees in southern steria. In 1941, he volunteered for the Polish Army then being formed in the U.S.S.R. In some undisclosed manner Novik succeeded in leaving Russia with the Polish my that was evacuated to the Middle East, and eventually reached Palestine.

Shortly after his arrival here, he was arrested and sentenced by the Chief Egistrate in Haifa to a short term in prison on charges of entering the country illegally. At the conclusion of his sentence, the Polish authorities formally demaded his extradition, and he was turned over to them. A Polish court-martial metanced Novik to six year's penal servitude for "desertion," refusing to recognize the certificate of exemption granted him in Russia.

A court order issued today calls on the commander of the Polish forces here to spear on July 4, to show cause why Novik should not be released.

MINISH LABOR PARTY OPPOSES PARTITION OF PALESTINE; WANTS ARABS TRANSFERRED

LONDON, June 16. (JTA) -- The British Labor Party is opposed to "diminution of its area of Jewish development in Palestine" by partitioning, Arthur Greenwood, Labor Party leader, states in an article appearing in the current issue of "Jewish Labor," its organ of the Poale Zion movement.

JOHNSH EDUCATION IN AMERICA FACES MANY PROBLEMS, COMMUNAL LEADERS ARE TOLD

MEW YORK, June 16. (JTA) -- Problems of Jewish education in the United States were discussed here last night by a number of distinguished speakers at a dinner undered by the Jewish Education Committee to Samuel S. Schmeierson, president of the grow. The dinner, which was held in the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, was attended by 1,700 present active in Jewish communal affairs in this city.

Mr. Schneierson, addressing the gathering, pointed out that "Jewish education, the basic training of Jewish children which should be the very foundation of the structure of our community, continues to be a problem. In this field, we still have men work to do to reach the level of development which has marked the growth of our community as a whole.

"To hasten that process of development is the greatest task facing us today," in Schneierson continued. "Our failure or success in this field will determine matter our children grow up to be fearful Jews, with a chip on their shoulder, have on the defensive, or whether our children will grow to be intelligent Jews with a sense of inner security which will shield them against the repeated barrages of hat that have blemished these past decades."

pr. David de Sola Pool, principal speaker at the dinner, pointed out that the respectivity for the survival and transmission of Jewish life and Jewish values in this country rests upon Jewish leadership and on no one else. "It is a paramount minescapable duty," he said, "If we fail, in one or two generations our synagogues will be empty shells and our great philanthropies will be hypertrophied organizations. For them we shall find ourselves differentiated from our neighbors not by religion or stitutive outural heritage, but only by anti-Semitism on the outside and what is alled race on the inside, a dishonored segregation without purpose, without meaning minimum out." Other speakers included George Z. Medalie, Edgar J. Nathan, Harry helebovitz, and Dr. Alexander Dushkin.

CONVENTION OF FEDERATION OF POLISH JEWS OPENS TODAY WITH APPEAL TO ROOSEVELT

NEW YORK, June 16. (JTA) -- An appeal to President Roosevelt "to continue with the served program of rescue and to increase efforts to save those who can still be saved," will be made tomorrow at the opening session of the three-day convention of the serion Pederation of Polish Jews, which is being attended by 400 delegates from all parts of the United States and Canada. The meeting, held at the Hotel Pennsylvania hre, will formulate demands in connection with the post-war rehabilitation of Polish Navy.

The text of the appeal, made public today, also urges President Rossovelt "to make more havens of safety for those who can manage to escape from the Nazi claws mit to demand the removal of the ban against unrestricted immigration of Jews into Mestine."

A message to the surviving Jews in Poland calls for courage and preparation is the day of liberation. "We pledge you that we shall not rest until a life of ineton, security and happiness shall become a reality in a new Poland whose constitution shall guarantee to you full national rights, freedom from anti-Semitism and the full flowering of your own creative life," the message says.
