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EDEN SAYS JEWS CANNOT BE RESCUED FROM HUNGARY; HUNGARIAN JEWS TO LOSE ALL THEIR PROPERTY

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden told the House of Commons last night that he regrets not being able to report any progress in the efforts which are being made to rescue Jews from Hungary. He made this statement in reply to a question by a member as to whether Admiral Horthy's promise to permit Jews to leave Hungary if they secure visas for Palestine and neutral countries is now being carried out.

The German radio today reported that all the property of the Jews in Hungary will be taken over by the Hungarian state. "Jews will only be allowed to keep such articles, as furniture and other chattels, that are directly needed for everyday use and stocks of food and fuel enough to last a fortnight," the broadcast said.

The Budapest radio announced that Premier Ferenc Szalasi has ordered the Minister of the Interior to examine by November 15, the certificates of exemption from the anti-Jewish regulations granted certain categories of Jews, in order that they may either be confirmed or cancelled. Under the new decree only those Jews will be exempted who hold a gold or two silver medals for bravery on the battlefield, or an Iron Crown, or were at least seventy-five percent disabled, or are widows and orphans of persons killed in this war.

CAIRO OFFICIAL COMMUNIQUE SAYS MOYNE WAS ASSASSINATED BY JEWS; EXPLOSIVES DISCOVERED

CAIRO, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- An official communique issued here today in connection with the assassination of Lord Moyne, British Resident Minister for the Middle East, clears up a number of details but points out that the investigation has not been concluded. The text of the communique follows:

"It appears from the investigation that the murderers are two Jews from Palestine and that they came to Egypt for the special purpose of committing this crime. They belong to the Stern Gang and acted under orders of this organization.

"The key of the place where they have lived since their arrival in Egypt was found on one of them. Clothes and papers belonging to them were discovered in the flat. Yesterday the two accused frankly confessed all details of the murder and asked that they be allowed to write their confessions. This was granted. The investigation further revealed that one of the accused left a package wrapped in paper in the hands of a Jewish lady, asking her to keep it until she was asked for it. The package was seized and was found to contain explosives, a revolver and bullets. The investigation is continuing."

Although it has been announced that the assassins will be tried by a Egyptian court martial, there has been no indication yet as to when the trial will begin, or whether or not the press or public will be admitted.

LORD MOYNE URGED BRITAIN TO TAKE UP SOLUTION OF PALESTINE PROBLEM WITH ROOSEVELT

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- The groups responsible for the assassination of Lord Moyne and for the recurrent terror in Palestine must be hunted down ruthlessly, but the entire Jewish community must not be held responsible for the outrages, it is stated today in influential sections of the British press.

The Manchester Guardian, liberal daily which has been consistently pro-Zionist, carries an editorial in which it states that just prior to his death, Lord Moyne had recommended to the government that the whole Palestine problem be taken up immediately with President Roosevelt. The editorial emphasizes that "it would be unjust to condemn a nation for the acts of a few individuals, but it would be unwise to ignore the fever of which this is a symptom. The fact must be faced that the government policy in Palestine, and the way in which this policy has been carried out by the Palestine Administration has caused deep resentment among Jews.

"These bands," the editorial continues, "must be hunted down ruthlessly with the help of the Jewish Agency, but, at the same time, the government must take up once again the whole Palestine problem in consultation, we hope, with President Roosevelt. The United States has been displaying great interest in the question. The opening of Palestine to Jewish immigration and the establishment of a Commonwealth was a common plank of both party platforms during the elections. This is a matter of urgency; we cannot afford to stand still."

The London Times, which is often a spokesman for the Foreign Office, writes: "At this juncture, the ministers rightly look for unconditional Jewish aid and leadership, which is required in Palestine not only for repudiation of the activities of terrorists, but their final eradication." Referring to the promises of cooperation made by Jewish leaders, it continues: "If the menace to the Jewish name, and indeed to the Zionist movement itself, is to be averted, the rank and file must follow the lead given. Palestine, or any national cause, cannot prosper while it is compromised by the use of criminal violence. Under such conditions there cannot be any condonation of these sinister deeds by pleading the White Paper or other manifestations of official policy, or impolicy. Jews have been the principal victims of the Nazi doctrine of violence, and as such have won eager sympathy throughout the world, which can be lost this day, or at least contaminated, by these villainies."

The New Statesman and Nation, liberal weekly, stressing that the activities of the terrorists are viewed with abhorrence by the bulk of Palestine Jewry, adds: "This deplorable incident should serve to induce the government to state the explicit terms of what Palestine partition they intend to enforce, and then enforce it against these Jewish fanatics, as well as against Arab killers whose toll of murders is far greater than the Jewish. Palestine is drifting into a Sinn Fein (Irish resistance group) situation."

Chief Rabbi Joseph Hertz, calling the crime "detestable," issued a statement today urging men of goodwill not to condemn "an entire group for the loathsome infamies of a few outcasts."

BARON ROTHSCHILD RESTORED TO FULL CITIZENSHIP RIGHTS IN FRANCE; CAN CLAIM PROPERTY

PARIS, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Acting under the decree issued by the French Government abrogating the anti-Jewish laws of the Vichy regime, the State Council, which is the supreme court of administrative law in France, yesterday restored French citizenship to Baron Henri de Rothschild. His citizenship was revoked after the fall of France in 1940. The action of the State Council will automatically enable Baron de Rothschild to claim his possessions confiscated by the Vichy regime.

FRENCH ARMY REINSTATES FOURTEEN JEWISH GENERALS OUSTED BY VICHY

PARIS, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Fourteen Jewish generals have been returned to their posts in the French Army, the Ministry of War announced today. The officers were ousted after the adoption of the Vichy anti-Jewish laws.

Those reinstated are: Albert Bauman, Armand Aaron Bloch, Emile Gabriele Bloch, Pierre Boris, Jacob Elghezi, Ruben Job, Pierre Eliezer Lazard, Leopold Levy, Lucien Mayer Levy, Rene Nathan Levy, Ramond Elie Naquet-La Roque, Leon Rheims, Alphonse Weiler and Gustave Worma.

THREE JEWISH SCIENTISTS WIN NOBEL PRIZES; TWO OF THEM RESIDE IN UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Three Jewish scientists, two of them residing in the United States, have been awarded the Nobel Prize in recognition of their contribution to science, it was announced in Stockholm yesterday. The three are:

1. Dr. Isidore Isaac Rabi, of Columbia University, who was given the 1944 physics award for his research in the resonance method of registering the magnetic moments of atomic particles.
2. Dr. Otto Stern, a refugee from Germany now with the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh, who was awarded the 1943 physics prize for development of the molecular ray method of detecting the magnetic momentum of protons.
3. Prof. Georg Hevesy, of Stockholm, who was awarded the 1943 prize for chemistry, in recognition of his work in the use of isotopes as indicators in studying chemical processes.

Dr. Rabi, who was born in 1898 in Austria, was brought to the United States in his infancy. He attended the public schools of Manhattan and Brooklyn and was graduated from Cornell University with a chemistry degree in 1919. Two years later he re-entered Cornell as a graduate student in physics and later went to Columbia, where he received the Ph. D. degree in 1926 for work on the magnetic property of crystals. In 1927 he received the Barnard Fellowship from Columbia and a Fellowship from the International Education Board of the Rockefeller Foundation and spent the next two years studying in Munich, Copenhagen, Hamburg, Leipzig and Zurich.

Dr. Rabi returned to Columbia in 1929 as lecturer in theoretical physics and was appointed assistant professor in 1930 and associate professor in 1935. Since 1930 he has been engaged chiefly in the field of experimental work on the magnetic properties of atomic nuclei.

Dr. Stern, a one-time associate of Albert Einstein, came to this country in October, 1933, after having been driven out of Germany by Nazi oppression. He had resigned his post at the University of Hamburg when an associate, Dr. Immanuel Esterman, was dismissed by the Nazis. Dr. Stern and his colleague then joined the Carnegie Tech faculty. Dr. Stern is on leave from the faculty of Carnegie Institute and is engaged in research for the government. He became a citizen of the United States on March 8, 1939.

Professor Hevesy of Copenhagen University reported in 1935 that bone formation is an every-changing process in the body and not a happening occurring only during youth. Professor Hevesy and Dr. D. Coster, another Danish scientist, discovered a new element called hafnium.

The Minister of Sweden will award the prizes on Dec. 10, the anniversary of Alfred Nobel's death, at a reception and luncheon in New York to be held by the American-Scandinavian Foundation.

LIBERATED HOLLANDERS CHEER JEWS AND QUEEN AS THEY HAIL NEW FREEDOM

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Cheers for Queen Wilhelmina were followed by cheers for the Jews, when the rejoicing citizens of the Dutch town of Tilburg gathered in their market place to hail their liberation, it is reported here. Shouts of "Long live the Queen" were inter-mingled with cries of "Long live the Jews."

The first free Jewish religious services to be held in Tilburg since 1940 will take place tomorrow, when Sabbath services are conducted in the pillaged synagogue.

AMERICAN RED CROSS WILL TRANSMIT MESSAGES ON PALESTINE VISAS TO JEWS IN OCCUPIED LANDS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Messages regarding refugees visas or Palestine certificates for stateless persons in enemy or enemy-occupied countries may now be sent through the American Red Cross upon presentation of a special license issued by the Director of Censorship, granting permission to transmit such information by cablegram, Basil Connor, Red Cross chairman announced. The U. S. Bureau of Censorship has relaxed its regulations at the request of the Red Cross.

The Palestine certificate is a form issued by the British Passport Control Office to the Government of Palestine for persons who have been deprived of citizenship rights for political or racial reasons by the country in which they originated, and who have not established citizenship in another country.

Applicants for the special license to send a cablegram should be sent to the Director of Censorship in Washington. The letter should give complete information regarding the full name and address of the person to whom the message is to be sent, relationship and nationality of sender and addressee, and a statement of the reasons the sender wishes to send the cable and as complete information as possible concerning the addressee. The full name and address of the sender is required, his bank reference and the names and addresses of three persons in the community who have known the sender for the past five years. The exact text of the message to be sent should be included.

If the applicant desires to transmit funds, he should request a treasury license from a local bank, a federal reserve bank or from the American Express Company. When the licenses are granted, a copy of the letters of permit should be filed with the local Red Cross chapter together with the request for Red Cross cable service.

CURB ON BRITISH ANTI-SEMITES URGED IN HOUSE OF COMMONS

LONDON, Nov. 10. (JTA) -- Measures to curb the anti-Semitic activities of the recently formed "League of Ex-Servicemen and Women" were demanded in Commons today.

Citing speeches made at a meeting of the group in Hyde Park on Sunday, D. N. Pritt, Labor, asked Home Secretary Herbert Morrison what action the authorities planned to take. Replying, Morrison said that the activities of the league were being watched. He admitted that one of the Hyde Park speakers was a member of the outlawed British Union of Fascists.
