MEN WAR REFUGEE BOARD DIRECTOR WILL DEMAND PUNISHMENT OF GERMANS FOR CRIMES AGAINST JEWS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31. (JTA) - Brigadier-General William A. O'Dwyer, newly appointed director of the War Refugee Board, said today that he intended to press for action by the United Nations War Cromes Commission on orimes committed by the Axis mations against their nationals.

During his first press conference since he took over the job, General O'Dwyer as asked if he intended to continue the efforts of his predecessor. John W. Pehle. to have this government issue a clear-out statement serving notice on the Germans that crimes against German Jews would be punished. O'Dwyer said firmly. "I certainly do." Be added that he felt that if people behind the enemy lines who commit mass murders are resided of what President Roosevelt has said about the punishment of war criminals, their potential and present victims would be in less danger.

"From what I've seen." O'Dwyer said, "the War Refugee Board has done a magnificent job, but there is still a good deal to be done. I must learn the details, and discover just exactly what the job to be done is." He denied that the fact that be will combine the unpaid rescue job with his \$20,000-a-year post as Kings County District Attorney means that the work of the War Refugee Board has slackened. "On the contrary," he said, "I intend to go at it with renewed vigor. He said that 500,000 survivors, primarily Jews, are still in desperate need of help within enemy lines.

Declaring that he did not know whether or not the War Refugee Board would continue to function after the collapse of Germany, O'Dwyer said he had ascepted the post until the job is done or I am otherwise requested to leave." Congressional. appropriations for the War Refugee Board extend only until June, 30.

Authorities in Liberated Germany Will Punish Nazis for Anti-Jewish Crimes

LONDON, Jan. 31. (JTA) - The British Government will do its utmost to insure the punishment of Mazis guilty of the mistreatment and murder of Germans, it was stated in Commons today by Under-Secretary of the Foreign Office Richard K. Laws

Mr. Law's statement was taken to mean that Britain would insist on punishment for crimes against Jews, Catholics and other persecuted persons inside Germany. He added that Britain planned to treat as war oriminals those responsible for the murder and persecution of anti-Masi Germans in concentration camps or elsewhere.

The Under-Secretary said that the punishment would be meted out "by the authorities in control in germany at the end of the war," adding that "I can leave it to you to guess who those authorities will bee

Lord Wright, who represents Australia on the War Crimes Commission, was elected chairmen of the body today. He had been serving as acting chairman since the resignation of Sir Cecil Hurst, British delegate, who resigned, reportedly, in protest against the Foreign Office's failure to support his demand for punishment of Axis crimes against their own nationals.

RANGIZMANN ANNOUNCES HE WILL ENDRAVOR TO ESTABLISH AN AMERICAN HECHALUTZ MOVEMENT

JERUSALEM, Jan. 31. (JTA) -- Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, today announced that he intends to establish in the United States a movement for sending young pioneers to Palestine.

"It is not enough for American Jewry to supply only the means for the upmilding of Palestine," he said. "I shall soon proceed to the United States and will emberor to establish there an American Hechalutz movement."

Dr. Weizmann made this announcement during a visit to the Mishmar Ha'Emek settlement of the Hashomer Hatzair. "The most important thing for us is another tree, mother dumam of land, and more people," he declared. "The total of all these will rive us a jewish State."

Visiting today the Jewish agricultural school at Pardess Chanah, Dr. Weiz-man stated, "As a chemist, I am engaged in creating chemical syntheses. As president of the World Zionist Organization, I will try to synthethize all groups within the limist novement."

CHIEF RABBIS OF PALESTINE RE-ELECTED FOR NEW TERM AT COLORFUL CEREMONY

JERUSALEM, Jan. 31. (JTA) — Chief Rabbi Isaac Herzog and Chief Rabbi Benlin Usiel were today re-elected heads of the palestine Rabbinate which is composed of eight rabbis. The other six elected were three Sepherdic rabbis and three rabbis of the Ashkenzi community.

The elections to the Rabbinate, which take place every eight years, were held at a colorful conclave of 42 rabbis and 38 laymen representing the Jewish Estimal Council of Palestine and the local jewish communities all over the country. The term of the present Rabbinate expired three years ago, but the Palestine Government, which recognizes the Rabbinate as the supreme jewish religious institution, extended its term of office taking into consideration that war conditions did not permit new elections.

District Commissioner Pollock, who was present today at the re-election of Chief Rabbis Herzog and Usiel, greeted them in behalf of the Palestine Government. Other greetings were dlivered by representatives of central Jewish bodies. Chief Rabbi Herzog, in his acceptance speech, appealed to all nations "to redress the wrongs committed against the Jewish people" and at least save the remnants of European Jews by abolishing the White Paper and by opening the gates of Palestine for their immigration. He also asked for the immediate establishment of a Jewish State. Chief Rabbi Tiel spoke of the activities conducted by the Chief Rabbinate and its aims for the future.

MUSH AMERCY WANTS NO ZOA DELEGATION; ASKED FOR DELEGATION OF ALL U.S. ZIONIST GROUPS

NEW YORK, June 31. (JTA) — The administrative committee of the American limist Emergency Council today issued a statement with reference to a report from Presentem that it has been suggested to the Jewish Agency executive that it invite Ir. Stephen S. Wise, Mrs. Rose Halprin and Dr. Israel Goldstein to come to Pelestine to determine a policy for the Zionist Organization of Americae

In the course of the past two or three months," the statement reads, the least Agency executive has made several requests to the Emergency Council to send a telegation representative of all groups to Palestine for a conference, in order to toxider matters of general Zionist importance. The Council is ready to accept this imitation if transportation will be available, The Council knows of no such proposal as mantioned in the report from Jerusalems. The invitation to send a representative delegation to Pelestine is one altogether independent of any controversy which may have arisen in Zionist ranks in this country.

MUSTINE READY FOR AMERICAN INVESTMENTS SAYS REPORT OF PALESTINE ECONOMIC CORPORATION

NEW YORE, Jan. 31. (JTA) — Development of Palestine along modern industrial and agricultural lines, "spurred and strengthened" by the wor, has rade that country a "going concern", ripe for investment capital, it is pointed out in the 18th annual report of the palestine Economic Corporation, released today. This investment capital an make it possible to provide jobs for new immigrants, the report adds.

The war, instead of halting Palestine's growth, actually has stimulated its success and made possible the maintenance of large numbers of new settlers, the report explains, "palestine has been able to absorb more than 210,000 immigrants in the gast ten years, and it is today the world's most successful modern example of colonization," it asserts.

"pelestine stands on its own feet economically," says Robert Stold, chairms of the board of directors, in an introductory statement to the corporation's 1,400 perices stockholders. Capital invested in the country with normal prudence may expect a return, he declares, adding that "the pelestine Economic Corporation, with its smile-sconomic program, has been one of the pioneer forces in bringing pelestine to its present immigrant-absorbing status. It now plans for expansion of its works"

The palestine Economic Corporation, which has capital reserves and surplus in emess of \$5,500,000, regards its task as merely begun, the report states, recalling that it was formed in 1926 "to afford an instrument through which American was and others who may be interested may give material aid on a strictly business basis to productive palestinian enterprises and thereby further the occupied development of the Holy Land and the resettlement there of an increasing number of Jews."

Describing how the Palestine Economic Corporation is intimately related to may aspects of Palestine's developing economy, the report says, "Through various modificates and affiliated companies, it has a hand in such diverse fields as the leads no operative movement, the financing and building of low-cost housing, the planed urban development of the pain area, the scientific exploitation of Palestine's mater resources, the development of the Dead Sea mineral resources, and the furnishing of electric power to the country. Directly or indirectly, these activities give our Corporation further participation in industry, banking, agriculture, transportation, social legislation and other fields."

FEMERAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES URGES FIGHT ON RACIAL FREJUDICE IN THE UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, Jan. 31. (JTA) — Designating the month of February as Brotherhood much to combat racial discrimination in the United States, the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ today issued & call to all churches to assist in the fight spaint racial projudice. The massage emphasized that "the insidious development of inti-Semitism" and other racial problems in this country "ory out for Christian treat-

To build a "nation and a world where there shall be no discrimination on the task of color, creed or national origin," the message cutlined twelve "musts" for christians;

1. We must realize that we have moral obligations to all men.

2. We must demonstrate in practice our belief in the intrinsic worth and disnity of every human being.

3. We must recognize that lines of division based upon color alone are mjust and tyrannical,

4. We must substitute pride in the human race for racial pride.

5. We must break away from the prejudices of convention and caste.
6. We must make sure that every public measure to improve the quality of life of our people shall apply equally to all citizens.

7. We must insure, in so far as legislation can, equal opportunity in

every kind of useful work for all persons of equal skill and energy.

8. We must make sure that the life of a person, his standing in the commity and ability to meet his needs is not made to depend upon race or color but only upon character and willingness to contribute his best.

9. We must oppose all charlatons and demagogues, giving no quarter to

those who would fan into flame racial animosities.

10. We must support with counsel, service and material resources all

constructive efforts for equal justice and opportunity for all-

11. We must sponsor study groups, forums, fellowship in worship and other interracial means through which men learn occoperation in meeting common needs and mutual interests.

12. We must make sure that in our churches those of every race and reople

shall be welcome to full membership and fellowship.

"goonomic, social and political factors undoubtedly play a large part in every onse of race conflict," the message says. "In the last enelysis the problem is moral and spiritual. The Church can, if it will, furnish leadership and spiritual motivation sufficient for this task. Brotherhood Month calls upon the Church to furnish those 'honest and friendly workmen' who will build a nation and a world where there shall be no discrimination on the basis of color, creed or national origin and ware every man shall strive for the good of others, loving his brother as himself."
