HAT TRANSPORT OF SUFFILIES FOR JEWS IN LIEE CATED FOLAND REACHES LUBLIN CONDITTEE

IMPLIN, Feb. 11. (JTA) — The first transport of supplies for Jows in a liberted cland arrived here today from palestine. STAND TILL REMAIN ANTI-JEWISH EVEN AFTER FALL OF HITLER, SWEDISH FRESS WARMS

STOCKHOLM, Feb. 11. (JTA)— Swedish newspapers today devote much space to a discussion of the future of the Jews in a Europe which has been poisoned by Germanni-Semitic propaganda. Some of the newspapers worn against the return of Jews to the seth and point out that appointments of Jews to public offices in Germany after the writtle only imperial the "delicate work" of re-oducating the German people.

"The majority of the Germans will, as a result of the Nazi anti-jewish pagenda, not telerate the Jews for a long time, just as Germany's neighbors will for a long time not be able to telerate the Jermans," the Helsingborg Geresunds write: the Swensk Morgenbladet says that "Stalin's attitude to the Jewish problem in Europe will be of great significance," and points out that the Pritish and the Arabs will hardly agree to the establishment of a Jewish State in Falestine.

The Upsala Myatidning, expressing pessimism at the possibility of ro-educating the Germans after the fall of the Hitler regime, says that all those who believe that the German people will change their outlook when confronted with the Mani "death festuries" and mass-exterminations of immoent civilians will be disappointed. "The makes of persountion used by the Manis against Jews long before the outbrook of the mar were known to the majority of the German population, nevertheless none of them pressed against them," the paper points out.

WELD TRADE UNION CONFERENCE HEARS REPORT ON JEWS IN EUROFE AND PALESTINE

LONDON, Feb. 11. (JTA) — A review of the situation of the Jews in devasted purpe and in Palestine was given last night at the World Trade Union Conference by Berl Locker, delegate of the Palestine Jewish Federation of Labor.

Emphasizing that the Jews are the only people to whom the right of "freedon from fear" has been denied, the speaker described the extermination by the Germans of five million Jews and added that a million surviving Jews will neither be able to remain in their native lands, nor return there. He asked that the remnants of Euro-Jews Jews be enabled to enter Falestine, and urged that the Conference ask for the sholition of the Falestine immigration restrictions for Jews.

Reporting on the achievements of Jewish labor in Falestine, the speaker compared the stendard of living in Falestine with that of Egypt and pointed out that parish immigration to Falestine does not harm the Arabs. He stressed the cooperation which exists between the Ristadruth and the Arab Workers League in Falestine and concluded by saying that "Jowish labor expects help from international democracy."

U.S. JENS WILL SEND THOUSANDS OF CHALUTZIM TO FALESTINE AFTER THE WAR, JOSEPH REPORTS

TEL AVIV, Feb. 11. (JTA)— The Jews of the United States will send from 15,000 to 20,000 American chalutsim to Falestine annually as soon as the wer is over, it mas predicted today at a pross conference here by Bernard Joseph, legal advisor of the Jewish Agency for Falestine, who reported on his impressions of American Jewish life,

MAND OF TRUSTEES OF AMERICAN DENTAL ASSOCIATION OFFOSES RACIAL QUOTA

CHICAGO, Feb. 11. (JTA) - The board of trustees of the American Dontal issociation indicated yesterday that it was opposed to establishment of a quota system in dental schools which would discriminate against prospective students on the least of their race or religious.

After two days spent in considering the reports by Dr. Harlan H. Horner, had of the ADA's council on pental Education, which criticized the "racial imbalance" in cental schools and advocated limiting the number of Jewish students, the trustees issued the Collowing statement;

"The board of trustees of the American Dental Association is not authorized to speck for the American Dental Association as that authority rests with the base of delegates which is not in session at this time. The board of trustees is of the chinican that the membership of the dental profession and the association are appeared to a quote system which will discriminate against students on the basis of mee, religion or on the basis of crigin and indicate their adherence to the Aperican minisfe that all man, regardless of race, creed or color, are entitled to equal experimities and that their fitness to practice dentistry shall be determined solely by their capacities and attainments."

The statement followed similar regudiations issued by Dr. Walter H e Scherer, of Houston, Texas, A.D.A. president, and by the nine members of the Council a pental Education, a standing committee of the A. A. charged with grading the thirty-mine dental schools in the country on the basis of facilities, feculties and equipments.

Thire has been no indication as yet that the council on Dental Education plans to withdraw the recommendations it submitted to columbia University, New York makersity and the House Education Committee, as a result of the opposition which they have accused. Notther the statement of the truetees for that issued by the members of the scuncil directly condermed the Horner reports.

ARREY HITS HAITISH STAND THAT JEWISH REFUGEES CANNOT HE GIVEN "SPECIAL THRATHENT"

JENSAIRE, Feb. 11. (JTA) — A spokesman for the Jewish Agency today eriticized the raitish Government's stand, as set forth in the House of Lords Inst tok by viscount Cranborne, that Jews cannot be given special treatment in connection with the problem of assisting and rehabilitating refugees.

The spekesman asserted that rehabilitation in their countries of origin is not a preciscable solution for the overwhelming majority of Jews in Europa, and me solution is possible other than concentrating the surviving Jews in one country—Relatines. The information reaching here from liberated territories, he centimed, revals a poture of appelling distress among the Jews in liberated areas, which can be acred with only by large scale emigrations.

The Agency representative denied that them exists any agreement between the Pritish Government and the Jewish Agency in connection with the allocation of imigration certificates to gurepean Jows, as was indicated by Lord Granbornes. AMEDIAN GOVERNMENT IS ASKED TO URGE CHURCHILL TO PAKE FALESTINE A JENISH HOLELAND

OTTAIN, Feb. 11. (JTA) — The Canadian government has again been asked to use frime pinister Churchill and other leaders of the United Nations "to provide for its disinherited and tortured Jewish refugees of Europe a new freedom—a liberty of this and not of sufferance to enter their ancient homeland, covernment to then in the chinal provises as a National Home which would lead to independent statehoods".

The request was made in a memorandum submitted to Norman Robertson, Under seretary of State for External Affairs, on behalf of the Canadian Falestine Committee at Richist Organization of Canada. The delegation which submitted the memorandum included Herbort A. Mowat, executive secretary of the Canadian Falestine Committee, S. L. 1988, co-resident of the Zionist Organization of Canada and Norman Dowd, executive seretary of the Canadian Congress of Labor.

IS, GIFTS FOR WEIZHANN INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE IN FALESTINE REACH \$500,000 MARK

NEW YORK, Pebe 11. (JTA) — American gifts for the establishment in Falestine of the Welzernm Institute of Science have reached the \$500,000 mark, according to memouncement today by Edmund I. Kaufmann, president of the American Committee which femiliated the plans for the establishment of the Institute and adopted a \$2,000,000 gul for the realization of its program.

The plan was announced as a 70th birthday tribute to the renowned scientist and free ident of the World Zionist Organization and the Jewish Agency for Falestine.
