HESIA NOTIFIES JEWISH REFUGEES TO PREPARE FOR REPATRIATION TO POLAND AND BALLICS

JERUSALEM, Mar. 7. (JTA) — Jewish refugees from Poland, Lithuenia and letis who are now in Usbekistan have been notified by the Soviet authorities to preper for repatriation to their former homes, it was learned here today from cables needed by relatives of the refugees. The cables, sent from Tashkent, disclose that the soviet order stated that the repatriation of the refugees will take place in the very mear future.

It was estimated here today that there are between 150,000 and 200,000 Polish less in Uzbekistan who may be rapatriated to Poland. The number of Baltic Jews is comparatively small, since few succeeded in escaping into Russia prior to the German evapation of the Baltic countries. It is assumed here that these Polish Jews who are considered Soviet citizens because they were born in Polish territory now claimed by Passa will not be included among the repatriates.

Mishmar, Hebrew daily newspaper, today reports that the Jewish Communist Raty in Polestine has sent a letter to the Histadruth, the Falestine Federation of Earlsh Labor, expressing regret at the attitude taken by members of the party during the Arab dusturbanees, when they justified Arab terror against Jews, The letter also regrets the party's former opposition to Jewish immigration into Polestine and points at that the Jewish Communists in Polestine are supporting the resolution adopted last much by the World Trade Union Conference in London advocating the development of the Jewish Mational Home in Polestine.

In connection with the letter, the Hashomer Hatsair, left wing of the Histadnth, today demanded that the Jewish Communist Party be re-admitted to the Histadruth from which it was expelled in 1936 for taking a pro-Arab and anti-Jewish stand during the Arab riots.

ELIMANN LEAVES PALESTINE; WARNS AGAINST BOTH PESSIMISM AND "EXAGGERATED OPTIMISM"

JERUSAIEM, More 7s (TEA) — Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jowish agency, left Palestine today for Cairo. Prior to his departure he addressed a session of the Small Zionist Actions Committee on the political situation warning against pessimism, but at the same time emphasizing that "there is no ground for exaggerated optimism."

Declaring that he presumes that "Britain has begun thinking about our problem, although who has not yet reached any decision." Dr. Woismann said: "I bolieve we are going toward better days. I am convinced that you - at least the younger people - will live to see a Jewish State; we deserve it. We have done much for it."

Dr, Welsmann oriticised the fact that the Jews were not invited as a people to the United Eatlons' conference at San Francisco. "I hope that our situation will be clearer before the opening of the San Francisco Conference," he said, "within another six months we shall be able to make considerable progress." He stated that after spending several days in the Eddle East, he will proceed to London and from there to the United States. Moshe Shertok, head of the political department of the Jowish Agency also left today for Cairo and will remain there for two weeks.

### UNIS OF LIBERATED EUROFE LOOK TO U.S. JEWRY FOR AID, RUMANIAN LEADER SAYS

BUCHAREST, Mar. 7. (JTA) — The Jows of Rumania, Rungary, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria and Carpatho-Russia look to Jewish groups in the United States for urgently needed assistance, Me Saratianu, president of the Rumanian section of the Has-Joa Emigration issuication and vice-president of the Union of Rumanian Jows, said today in an interview with the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

pointing out that the Jewish nommunity of Bucharest is now the largest in grope, Mr. Saratianu said that it has received appeals for aid from many liberated wish communities. He declared that 10,000 Jews will shortly be arriving from fransistrin from which they are being repatriated by the Soviet authorities and all of them require help. In addition delegations from Budapest and liberated sections of nuceslavia have arrived here seeking clothes, medicines and food.

He appealed to the Joint Distribution Committee, and through it to American Jewn, for expansion of relief activities in Rumania and also urged the Union of Rumnian Jows in America to intensify its efforts in behalf of the Jews here.

Mr. Screticam said that immigration has been hampered by the war, but many less are assisting the end of hostilities to emigrate to Palestine or other overseas countries. "Many of them have American affidavits and certificates," he continued, and are expecting the Hias-Ica and the Jewish Agency to organize emigration when circumstances permits."

### SERDISH NEWSPLIPER WARNS OF POST-WAR MENACE OF LINTI-SEMITISM; LISKS OPEN FIGHT ON IT

STOCKHOLM, Mar. 7. (JTA) — Asserting that the personation of the Jews is the most terrible of the many crimes committed by the Nazis, the newspaper Morgon Tidningon warned today that legislation against anti-Semitism is not sufficient, but must be supplemented by an active popular fight against race hatred.

It points out that anti-Semitism will not end with the defeat of the Nazis, and that sweeping away the poison of anti-Semitism after the war will take time. Referring to the proposed legislation to outlaw anti-Semitism in Sweden, it says that it is embarrassing that such measures are necessary here, but even so, they will be of small help unless the public gets behind them.

## GRIGG IEAVES PAIESTING AFTER MEEK-LONG VISIT; CONFERRED WITH JEWISH, ARAB LEADERS

JERUSAIEM, Mar. 7. (JTA) — Sir Edward Grigg, British Minister of State in the Middle East, left Palestine today after a visit of a week's duration during which he conferred with Jewish and Arab Teaders.

This was his second visit to Palestino since he arrived in Cairo early in Jamary to assume the post left vacant by the assassination of Lord Moyne. Sir Edward promonaded through the streets of Jerusalem before leaving, indicating that police feel that the terrorist menace has been checked for the time being.

#### MARKS OF ALLIED NATIONS ASKED TO WARN GERMANY AGAINST SEGREPATION OF JEWISH WAR RISONERS

IONDON, Mar. 6. (JTA) — Dr. Ignacy Schwarzbart, Jewish member of the Polish Eticnal Council, today appealed to leaders of the Allied Nations to take offective masures against Germany's segregation in separate camps of Jews among Polish war Tioners.

Confirmation of such segregation reached Dr. Schwarzbart from the Internationa; Red Cross. Emphasizing that the segregated Jewish soldiers face the danger of anni-Histon, Dr. Schwarzbart asked that the Allied Nations exchange them for German pissoners. The British section of the World Jewish Congress submitted a similar appeal to the Foreign Office here. (In New York, the Emergency Committee to Save the Jesish People of Europe cabled to Gen. Eisenhower asking for a warning of stern realisation against German prisoners held by the Allies.)

## SUMA CONFERENCE CRITICIZED BY REP. CELLER FOR IGNORING THE PALESTINE QUESTION

WASHINGTON, Mar. 7. (JTA) - Rep. Emanuel Celler, New York Democrat, today withinked the Crimea Conference for "lightly shunting aside the status of Palestine."

WASHINGTON, Mar. 7. (JTA) — Almost 2,500,000 pounds of used clothing collected in the churches and synagogues of America have either been shipped or are scheduled for early shipment from this country to the men, women and children of Western Europe, Herbert H. Lehman, Director General of UNERA announced today. Some nine million pounds of usable clothing are scheduled for shipment to Poland, Italy, Czechoslovakia, the Balkan countries and to UNERA refugee centers in North Africa, he stateds'

#### BAN ON RACIAL DISCRIMINATION IN AMERICAN REPUBLICS VOTED AT CHAPULTER'C CONFERENCE

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 7. (JTA) -- The abolition of racial discrimination in the American republics was urged in a resolution adopted yesterday by the Inter-American Organization Committee of the Chapuk. Conference.

The resolution, which was introduced by the delegation from Haiti, and modified by the United States, Colombian and Brazilian delegations, recommended reaffirmation of the "principles recognized by all the American Governments of equality of rights and opportunities for all men, regardless of race and religions." It urged that the Covernments of the nations represented at the conference "prevent with all the means in their power all that may provoke discrimination among individuals because of racial and religious reasons."

#### SUPPORT FOR JEWISH PALESTINE VOICED BY LATIN-AMERICAN DELEGATES TO MEXICO CITY PARLEY

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 7. (JTA) — Support for a Jewish national homeland in Palestine was expressed here by prominent Latin-Americans at a dinner tendered delegates to the Inter-American Conference by the Mexican pro-palestine Committee.

Julio Accepte. Foreign Minister of couta Mica Coclared "Israel's dream of returning mome will be fulfilled." Cuban delegate Senator Chibas assured the gathering that the resolution introduced by the Cuban delegation, wrging support of a Jewish Pelestine, will be adopted by the conference. Indelecto Priete, who was minister of war in the Spanish Loyalist Government, paid tribute to Jewish contributions to civilization through the ages.

Other speakers included Alejandro Carrillo, head of the Mexican delegation at the World Trade Union Conference in London; Caban delegate Gustave Guiterrez and Mexican delegate Antonio Manero. Delegates from Chile, Colombia, Nicaragua and prominent Jowish leaders were also present.

## A. BLOOMENSON GIVES \$100,000 GIFT TO JEWISH NATIONAL FUND FOR NEW PAIRSTINE COLONY

NEW YORK, Mar. 7. (JTA) — A gift of \$100,000 has been given to the Jowish Mational Fund by Mr. Abraham Bloomenson of Duluth, Minn., it was announced here to-day by Judge Morris Rothenberg, president of the J.N.F. of America. The money will be spent for the establishment of a new colony where priority will be given to demobilized Jowish soldiers and their familios.

## MATIONAL JEWISH HOSPITAL OF DENVER ELECTS 101 TRUSTERS; THIRTY-FOUR ARE NEWYORKERS

DENVER, Colos, Mars 7s (JTA) — Thirty-four New Yorkers are included among the 101 trustees elected by the National Jewish Hospital at Denver, it was announced here teday by this non-sectorian medical center for the free care of tuberculous. The institution cares for approximately 1,000 persons annually, and 40 per cent of the patients come from Greater New Yorks.
