RAB LEADERS REPORTED TO HAVE AGREED ON ESTABLISHMENT OF SMALL JEWISH STATE

CAIRO, Mr. 14. (JTA) — Leaders of Arab countries have agreed to the establishment of a small jewish state in palestim, about the size of Lebanon, in the hope that this solution of the Palestime problem will be acceptable to Jows, it was reported today in connection with the opening here on Saturday of the pan-Arab congress.

This docision, coming shortly after the talks between President Roosevelt and pin simister Churchill and the rulers of Egypt and Saudi-Arabia, is taken here to indicate that the governments of Britain and the United States have been informed of this latest plane.

Lobanon covers 3,600 square miles as compared with the 10,429 square miles of plestime. The population of Lebanon is estimated to be about 700,000.

(Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden told the House of Commons today that the applications of Syria and Ichanon to attend the San Francisco Conference are "under consideration." The requests of these countries to become members of the United Nations are also being studied, he said.

ESS TEROUGHOUT WORLD MOURN DEATH OF MILLIONS KILLED BY GERMANS: N.Y. SYNLGOGUES CROWDED

NEW YORK, Mr. 14. (JTA) — A solome Day of Mourning for the Jows killed by the Germans in Europe was observed throughout the world today as tens of thousands of Jows in the United States, Falestins, England, Canada, France, the Latin-American countries and in North Africa crowded into symagogues, praying for the fallon and homering their memory by contributing to relief for those who survived Mazi annihilation. Special services were also held in Russia, arranged by the Moscow Jewish Community.

In New York, services were held at many of the city's 1,200 jewish congregations. Many jewish offices and business enterprises closed at moon for one hour while jerish workers in factories interrupted their work for fifteen minutes during which they listened to addresses on the German massacres of jews and on the great need for aid for surviving Jews.

The mourning was culminated at a large meeting at Manhattan Plaza at which rabbis and lay leaders broke the fast in an impressive ceremony. Each person who entered the meeting paid \$100 as a contribution to the rescue of Jows who are still in German-hold territory.

Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, chairman of the joint Distribution Committee Rational Compaign, issued a statement pointing out that in addition to the many millions of Jons massacrod by the Germans, there are a million Jons who have been liberated by the

amoning Allied armies and half a million who cling to life in Nazi concentration ~ tune hoping for deliverance. "It is our duty - a first duty - to see that not one of those shall lack all the help that we can give them," he said.

Polestine Streets Deserted As Jews Observe Day of Mourning for Bartyred Dead

JERUSALEH, Mar. 14. (JTA) -- All work, trade and traffic were suspended toby throughout the Jewish-populated sections of Palestine as the country's Jewish carunty joined with Jews throughout the world in observing a day of fasting and murning for the estimated 5,000,000 Jews murdered in Europe. -

A voluntary curfew was maintained between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 p.m. and all Jows remained in their homes with the exception of a number of persons granted masses by local Jewish authorities - such as doctors, murses, essential workers and muspaparione

Jewish institutions flew their flags at half-mast and black-bordered Hebrew auspapers devoted their entire issues to the tragedy of Europe's Jews. All papers featured a single demand: transfer to Palestine of the remnants of the decirated wish populations.

Special prayers were recited in the synagogues. Heart-breaking scenes occurred in the Old Symmgogue in Jerusalem as the entire congregation, headed by Chief Rabbi Herseg, scated themselves on the floor for ten minutes in the traditional attitude of courning. After worshippers returned home the streets of Jerusalen were deserted and gloonye

Broadcasting last night, on the ove of the observances, Dr. Herzog deplored the elecvages in the Zionist ranks, which, he said, threaten to "weaken our position et a time when the day of decision is rapidly approaching." He declared that the present tragedy of the Jewish people is greater than the destruction of the Temple and appealed to the nations of the world to right the 2,000-year-old wrong done the Jews by establishing a rational homeland for them in Palestines

Jews Throughout France And Algeria Mark Day Of Mourning

PARIS, Par. 14. (JTA) - Synagogues throughout France and Algeria were crowded today as worshippers marked the world-wide observance of a day of prayers for the massacred Jows of Europe. Grand Rabbi Isaye Schwartz presided over services in the Grand Synagogue here.

FEMAN UNIVERSITY WILL ESTABLISH SCHOOL OF ADM MISTRATION TO TRAIN CIVIL SERVAMS

IONDON, Here 14. (JTA) — The Rebrew University is planning the ostablishnut of a School of Administration to train sivil servents, it was disclosed here toby by Prof. Leon Roth, rector of the university addressing a meting in his honor attended by prominent Jewish and non-jewish sciencists and scholers.

Prof. Roth said that the midical school of the university, whose establishment is being financed by the Hadassah and the American Friends of the Hebrew University, should be ready to begin training physicians within two years.

MATIN-AMERICAN ZIONIST CONGRESS CRITICIZES DEMOCRACIES FOR FAILURE TO SAVE JEWS

iDMTEVIDES, Mer. 14. (JTA) -- The democratic world, "with some few honorable emeptions," was charged today with complicity in the murder of 5,000,000 Jews, in a resolution adopted by the Latin-American Ziomist Congress meeting here.

At the same time, the congress urged that, in order that as many of the survivers as possible may be saved, the United Mations assist in the rehabilitation of Jawish life in Europe and in the establishment of a Jawish State in Palestine withints historical borders.

Other resolutions demanded abolition of the British White Paper on Palestine, which it branded as contradictory to the promises made by Britain, and charged it was responsible for the failure to save thousends of Jews from Mesi-cocupied countries; urged creation of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine, with jurisdiction over immigration, colonization and fiscal matters in the hands of the Jewish Agency during a transitional period preceeding the establishment of the commonwealth; and supported the demand for Jewish representation at San Francisco and the peace conferences.

The congress expressed gratitude to the peoples and governments of Latinaurica for their symmethy with the Zionist cause and appealed to the American liberal tradition to support "the morally and politically justified claims of the Jewish people."

DISSIDENT GROUP OF ANGLO-JEWISH ASSOCILTION FETITIONS COLONIAL OFFICE ASKING JEWISH STATE

LOHDON, Mr. 14. (JTh) — Thirty-thrommbers of the Arglo-Jewish Association today amousoed that they have sent a memorandum to the Colonial Scor. tary expressing their disagreement with the memorandum submitted on January by the Association, which, they charge, ignores the primipal issues concerning the future of Pelestine. The association, while supporting unrestricted immigration into Pelestine, refrained from demaning oraction of a Jewish state.

The memorardum of the dissident members asserted that only a Jewish state can solve the problem of Jewish homelessness and urged establishment of such a state, which, they said, they hoped could become part of the British commonwealth of rations. It taked an end to the White Paper and the transfer of sontrol over imagration and sattlement to the Jewish Agemy. The accordance said that these views are hold of the problem of the problem of Jews throughout the world,

"Official burial" of the White Paper is urged today in the Manchester Guardian. Agreeing that while the ultimate solution of the palestine problem, "which must provide in some form or other for a Jewish state with full rights for the Arabs," cannot be expected until the end of the war with Germmy, the paper says that certain things can be done now, including lifting of immigration restrictions which would part the many homeless Jews in Europe to emigrate to Palestine.

HAVARD UNIVERSITY CHARGED WITH ANTI-JEWIS! BIAS; UNIVERSITY SPOKESMAN DENIES CHARGE

BOSTON, Mar. 14. (JTA) - The charge that Harvard University refused a scholarship to a young chemistry student because he was Jewish was denied here today by a spacesman of the university. The charge was made yesterday by Frof. Albert Sprague coolidge, a member of the university's chemistry department, testifying before a legislative committee studying proposals to bar racial and religious discrimination in lessachusetts.

"We know perfectly well that names ending in 'borg' and 'stein' have to be sipped by the board of selection of students for scholership," Professor Coolidge saids "The young candidate was unquestionably of superior intelligence. There was no estimate the being entitled to receive the scholarship. 'Discrimination in education,' he added, was depriving the scientific fields of outstanding students." He rewaled that there is an understanding between the university authorities and scholarship donors which prevents the giving of scholarships, in some cases, to Jews.

Answering Prof. Coolidge's charge, Assistant Dean Henry S. Dyer, who is charman of the Harvard Committee on Scholarships, declared: "As far as I cm concerned there is no tacit understanding between scholarship donors and the committee I amon. Fof, Coolidge will have to clarify his case."

EP, RANKIN ATTACKS N.Y. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION LAW; WANTS PROTECTION FOR "WHITE GENTILES"

WASHINGTON, Mar. 14. (JTA) -- Representative John E. Rankin, Massispi Democrat, peterday attacked Governor Dewey for signing the Ives-quinn bill barring racial discrimation in employment. The bill, he said, is "the greatest betrayal of the white perions of New York that state has ever known."

Addressing the House of Representatives, Rankin demanded that "white Gentiles should be protected from the persecutions they are now compelled to endure." Ho also called for defect of the bill for a permanent Fair Employment Practices Commission, on which a Senate sub-committee has been holding hearings.

5,000 PROTESTAIT MINISTERS APPEAL TO UNITED NATIONS FOR JEWISH IMMIGRATION TO PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, Mare 14. (JTA) - An appeal in behalf of 5,000 Protestant ministers, asking that the doors of Felestino be kept open for Jewish immigration, was presented today to the White House and the British and Soviet embassiose

The appeal, addressed to President Roosevelt, Frims Minister Churchill and Barshal Joseph Stalin, states that "there can be m just peace for the world until there is a just peace for the jews."

JEWISH THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY HOLDS MEMORIAL MEETING FOR DR. CYRUS ADLER

NEW YORE, Mars 14, (JTA) — A memorial anniversary service for Dr. Cyrus Adler, former president of the Jewish Theological Seminary, who died on April 7, 1940, was held at the seminary yesterday.

"The five years have not produced a leader capable of serving us as he did," Drais Finkelstoin, president of the seminary, declared. "This anniversary of Dra Adler' doubt finds the Jowish people bereaved as mover before. If in the midst of our deep correct the loss of one-fourth of our people in the immunorable Libbius of Europe and the destruction of hundreds of our sensituaries we receal our loss in the death of one man, it is because his death at its particular time made the general distress more difficult to bear and our problems more difficult to solves"
