#### EN SURVEY ESTABLISHES ONLY 30,000 JEWS SURVIVED IN POLAND; 500 JEMISH CHILDREN REMAIN

MOSCOW, Hare 19. (JTA) — A survey of the Jewish situation in liberated Poland made public here today reveals that there are only 30,000 Polish Jews in all of Poland jbut 500 of them are children. Most of the survivors range in ages between 25 and 40

The survey, prepared by Berl Mrk, a member of the praceidium of the Central Central Central Grants of Jewish Organizations in Polands says that the surviving Jews can be classified into four categories: Jews who emerged from their hidding places in caves and in the woods - their health is seriously undermined and they are incapable of physical or mental labors 2. Jews who have been liberated from concentration camps in Ossicain, Plotrokow, Grestochown and East Prussia. These are mostly women who need midsal treatments since their bodies are mutilated from medical experiments made upon then by German doctors; 5. Jews hiberated from the Lods Chetto. The majority of them are skilled workers; 4. Jews who secured false identity documents. Their nerves are stattered because of the prolonged disguisce

The survey also mentions jewish partisans and speaks of them as a section of Folish Jowry which is physically and mentally healthy and which "forms the backbone for the restitution of Jewish life in liberated Folanda" The surviving Jews are concentrated in Praha, the suburb of Warsaw and in the cities of Lublin, Lods, Bialystock, Statochowa, Piotroków, Raden, Przemysł, Krasne, Minsk-Mazowieck and a number of small townships.

Apart from the 30,000 jews in Poland proper, there are jews who have returned there from Soviet Russia, the survey discloses. These are primarily specialists and soldiers who served in the Polish Army which was formed in the USSR. They are now participating in the rehabilitation of Jewish life in Poland.

#### Urgent Relief is Major problem; Government Grants 14,000,000 Zlotys

The survey shows that the principal problems which the surviving Jows face the urgent need of relief, the acute shortage of medical aid, and lack of employment, local Jewish committees are functioning in all cities where Jews are concentrated. These committees are affiliated with the Central Relief Committee for the truck. The Polish Provisional Government is actively supporting the work of the central Jonish relief committee, and has granted 14,000,000 slotys credit to Jouish ortical states. The government also helped in the re-opening of four homes for Jouish children in Inblin, Bihlystock, Otsok and Promyel. #### 200 JENS ENERGE FROM COLOGNE'S RUINS; ALL OF CITY'S SYNLOGUES RAZED

COLOGHE, Mar. 19. (JTA) — Two-hundred Jews have emerged from the ruins of, cologue and appealed to the Allied Military Government for food cards, the correspondent of the Jewish relegrephte Agency was told today by AMG officials. Nost of these are married to non-Jews, or are the children of "mixed marriages". Because they were in hiding for several months to avoid being shipped into the interior of Germany, they had been compolled to forego food cards.

One of them, Moritz Neihaus, took this correspondent on a tour of the ruined symgogues of the city. All of them had been burned by the Maris and the Allied bashings finished the job. Part of the walls and the "mikvah" romain of the Orthodox symgogue and large talmud torah on Stapern Strasse. The Largest Orthodox syngogue, an Glocken Strasse, is undistinguishable from the rest of the rubble. The walls of the grandiose Reform Syngogue on Rund Strasse are still intact, but the roof has eved in. The basement of the building had been used as an air-raid shalter for "syngos" Of the spiritual leaders of these syngogues, two - Rabbis Kober and Rosental - succeeded in escaping to the United States, while the third - Rabbi Stein - ms deported to poland.

There are a few other Jews in cologne besides the 200 who have applied for food cards. Two were found among the 80 prisoners released from Gestape headquarters and 12 foreign Jews have passed through the wooden barracks on the outside of Cologne which ere being used as a sorting place for displaced persons. These barracks, incidentally, had housed political prisoners and a number of "mischlings" who were captured in recent months.

In an old pile of clothes in this camp were found ghostly remnants of the Jewish population of Cologne. Sgt. Henry Silberman of New York, who was cleaning up the barracks, came across a torah scroll and several block-and-white striped "tsitsoth."

## JAPANESE LEGATION FINANCED ANTI-JEWISH PROPAGANDA IN BULGARIA, OFFICIAL CHARGES

SOFIA, Mar. 18. (JTA) — The Japanese legation in Sofia had huge funds at its disposal for anti-Semitic propaganda, it was revealed here today by Monahem Fayonoff, this Secretary of the Ministry of Propaganda, testifying at the trial of former officials charged with persecution of Jews.

Fayonoff said that anti-jewish activities in Bulgaria were inspired by the Gestapo and wore strongly apposed by the majority of the Bulgarian people. Similar testimany was given by minister of Propaganda Dimo Kasasoff and Minister of Social Affairs Grigor Techmodjeffs.

Relief authorities here have begun distribution to needy Jews of 1,000 pairs of shoes received from Pelestine. Both local Jews and refugees require extensive assistance. Bix young refugees from Hungary appealed today to the British mission here for permission to join the Jewish Brigade.

#### RITISH JEWS TO SEND DELEGATION TO U.S. TO COORDINATE JEWISH ACTIVITIES AT SAN FRANCISCO

IODON, Mare 19. (JTA) — The Board of Deputies of British Jews will send a selegation to the United States to coordinate its activities with those of Jewish gaps in America in connection with any representations that may be made to the San Francisco conference of the United Nations, Prof. Selig Brodetsky, president of the Seri announced today.

Brodetsky said that he had discussed with high officials of the British Foreign Office the question of war orises against Jews, and that a memorandum on this subject is being propered by the Board of Deputies for submission to the British Germmente. The Board, he added, is also propering a statement on reparations in kind to Jews under the decisions taken by the "Big Three" at the Yelta Conference. This statement will be submitted to the appropriate authorities, he declared. He revealed that the foreign committee of the Board is considering steps to establish "firm contact" with the Jews of Soviet Russia.

#### E. WISE INDICATES THAT JEWISH DEMANDS MAY BE PRESENTED TO THE SAN FRANCISCO CONFERENCE

NEW YORK, Mar. 19. (JTA) — Dr. Stephen S. Wise, addressing a meeting yesterby of rescued Jews who recently reached this country, indicated that there are hopes that Jewish demands may be presented "in a proper wey" to the Security Conference of the United Nations in San Francisco. He lauded President Recevelt as a great friend of the Jewish people and the Jewish National Home. The meeting was arranged by the World Jewish Congress.

## Senators Demand San Francisco conference Act On Palestine Problem

NEW YORK, Mar. 19. (JTA) -- A demand that the United Nations conference at San Francisco consider the fate of mandated territories - and specifically the fate of Falestine - was made here last night by Son. Ralph 0. Brewster of Maine, addressing a diner sponsored by the New Zionist Organization to mark the 30th anniversary of the Jewish Legion, which fought for Britain in World War 1.

Declaring that he favored the creation of a jewish state in Palestine, Senator Frewster said.
