TRUSTEESHIP PLAN FOR MANDATES WILL BE DISCUSSED AT SAN FRANCISCO, STETTINIUS ANNOUNCES

WASHINGTON, April 3. (JTA) -- Proposals for territorial trusteeships as part of the world organization will be presented at San Francisco by the "Big Three" Yalta conferees, together with representatives of the Chinese and provisional French governments, according to an announcement today by Secretary of State Edward R. Stettinius Jr. at his press conference.

The trusteeship, said Stettinius, should be designed to permit the placing under it of the territories mandated after the last war - which would include Palestine - such territories taken from the enemy in this war as might be agreed upon at a later date and also such other territories as might voluntarily be placed under trusteeship. "No discussion was had at Yalta, or is contemplated, prior to, or at San Francisco, regarding Pacific territories," Mr. Stettinius said.

BLUE-AND-WHITE FLAG OF PALESTINE PRESENTED TO JEWISH BRIGADE AT MOVING CEREMONY IN ITALY

WITH THE EIGHTH ARMY IN ITALY, April 3. (JTA) -- Palestine's blue and white national flag was formally raised over Jewish Brigade Headquarters today in a simple, quiet ceremony.

The proceedings were so moving that many of the soldiers participating had tears streaking their dust caked faces. They watched the Star of David, which the Nazis had forced them to wear as a badge of shame, unfurled as a symbol of fighting honor. The ceremony took place in a grassy meadow, near a shell-pocked baronial mansion to the constant accompaniment of crashing distant cannon, which sounded like the ruffle of war drums.

The flag was presented to the Brigade by the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Moshe Shertok, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency, brought the flag from Palestine and presented it to Brigadier Ernest Benjamin, Brigade commander, while the troops, in a hollow square, stood stiffly at attention.

The flag was unfurled by the Brigade's oldest enlisted man, Sucher Spiegel, whose entire family, except for one uncle living in New Jersey, was massacred by the Nazis. Sgt. Major Spiegel is one of the finest soldiers this correspondent has ever met in any army. When the Brigade is in the line, he fights all 24 hours of the day. As Spiegel unfurled the flag it seemed that all the guns on the front opened up, almost drowning out the bugle's notes.

Shertok addressed the Brigade soldiers, who represented every unit of the outfit. He spoke in Hebrew. He said that at last Palestinians could see the flag for which they had always fought in their hearts. It represented not only their national homeland but "the blood of the 5,000,000 European Jews who had died without a chance to fight back." He told the Brigade that they were fighting for the opportunity to live a new, peaceful life.

GEN. MAURICE ROSE KILLED BY GERMANS AFTER CAPTURE, HIS AIDE REVEALS; BODY RECOVERED

PARIS, April 3. (JTA) -- Maj. Gen. Maurice Rose, whose death in action was announced by the War Department yesterday, was shot by a German tankman after he had already surrendered and was taking off his gun to hand-it over to his captors, it was learned here today. The killing occurred last Saturday.

En route to a portion of his Third Armored Division which had become cut off from the rest of the unit, Gen. Rose and his party ran into a German tank column. They attempted to escape, but were halted by a Nazi Tiger tank. The general and his aide got out of their jeep and surrendered. As Gen. Rose unbuckled his holster, he was shot. His aide and the jeep driver jumped into a ditch and eventually returned to their lines. Armored units which returned to the spot later found the general's body.

Gen. Rose's Father Says His Death Is Symbolic of Jews' Love for Liberty

DENVER, April 3. (JTA) -- Rabbi Samuel Rose, 89-year-old father of Maj. Gen. Rose, said today that his son's death was further evidence of "the Jewish people's love of liberty and freedom for all people."

The venerable rabbi, grief-stricken at the news of his son's death, said that "it is well that since this had to be, it happened in the week of Passover."

OFFICER TRAINING FOR JEWS ANNOUNCED BY RUMANIAN GOVERNMENT; MOBILIZATION POSTPONED

BUCHAREST, April 3. (JTA) -- The Rumanian Government announced today that mobilization of Jews for the armed forces, which has been postponed several times, has been deferred once again - to May 1. However, at the same time, it issued a statement pledging that this would be the last postponement and outlining the future procedure to be followed in connection with mobilization of Jews.

The statement specifies that Jews in the military classes of 1935 to 1940 who wish to become reserve officers should report to the military authorities on April 10. They will be sent to cadet schools and, after passing examinations there, will be made non-commissioned officers, and later commissioned officers, after they have undergone training with front line units. This is the same procedure followed with non-Jewish cadets. After May 1, all Jews in the military classes of 1920 to 1940 are liable to be called up.

COMMONWEALTH PARTY CONFERENCE BACKS JEWISH STATE; OPPOSES PARTITION OF PALESTINE

LONDON, April 3. (JTA) -- The Commonwealth Party conference meeting here, today called for abrogation of the White Paper immigration restrictions in Palestine and urged establishment of a Jewish state there in accordance with the mandate. The recommendations were contained in a report on international affairs adopted by the delegates.

The report originally contained an additional section on Palestine, suggesting that the country be partitioned. This was struck out after a debate during which speakers pointed out the war contribution of the Jews of Palestine and the benefits derived by the Arab peasantry from Jewish immigration. Tom Wintringham, prominent journalist and military analyst, on behalf of the national executive committee of the party, accepted an amendment eliminating the partition proposal.

JEWISH AGENCY TREASURER EN ROUTE TO UNITED STATES; TRADE DELEGATION GOING TO BRITAIN

JERUSALEM, April 3. (JTA) -- Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, left yesterday by plane for the United States where he will confer on financial and industrial matters and will also meet with Joint Distribution Committee leaders concerning coordination of refugee relief work.

It was announced today that a delegation of Palestine industrialists will leave on Thursday for London in response to an invitation from the Colonial Office and the Board of Trade. The delegation, consisting of seven representatives of various industrial and trade interests, will discuss with British industrial and trade circles the possibility of closer cooperation between the United Kingdom and Palestine.

The Board of Trade has indicated a desire to obtain a comprehensive picture of Palestine's requirements for the next four years, it is understood. While in London the delegation will endeavor to arrange mutually beneficial business relations with Britain for the post-war period. It will remain in England for about six weeks.

SILVER GROUP RESERVES JUDGEMENT ON ZOA MOVE TO REACH AGREEMENT BETWEEN SILVER AND WISE

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- The decision of the executive of the Zionist Organization of America to explore the possibilities of bringing about a reconciliation between the supporters of Dr. Abba Silver and those of Dr. Stephen S. Wise was termed today by the American Zionist Policy Committee, a pro-Silver group, a "welcome indication that the ZOA leadership is at last beginning to respond to the pressure of public opinion."

"Unfortunately," says a statement issued by the committee, "the tone and contents of the press release issued by the ZOA is not conducive to the creation of a more wholesome atmosphere looking towards liquidation of the controversy, for it is itself controversial in character. The peace gesture is vitiated by insinuations directed against Dr. Silver and his supporters. We particularly resent the baseless insinuation that Dr. Silver or his followers have at any time demanded the elimination of Dr. Stephen S. Wise, nor is it true that Dr. Silver has declined to confer, but on the contrary, he repeatedly indicated his readiness to meet with Dr. Wise.

"Under the circumstances, we must reserve judgment. The make-up of the committee to be appointed by Dr. Goldstein may give a further clue as to the intention of the ZOA leadership and indicate to what extent this is a genuine peace move or possibly only a bit of psychological warfare," the statement concludes.

U. S. AMBASSADOR IN BRAZIL WILL BE PRINCIPAL SPEAKER AT JEWISH MEETING IN RIO DE JANEIRO

RIO DE JANEIRO, April 3. (JTA) -- U. S. Ambassador Adolph A. Berle today received a Jewish delegation and expressed his willingness to be the principal speaker at a dinner which will take place here on April 18 at which it will be announced that the Jews of Brazil will raise \$100,000 for the Weizmann Scientific Institute in Palestine. The committee which is raising the fund is headed by Prof. Ignacio Azevedo Amaral, director of the Engineering Institute of Brazil.

JEWISH COUNCIL FOR RUSSIAN WAR RELIEF RAISES \$2,000,000 IN FOOD AND CLOTHING

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- The Jewish Council for Russian War Relief today reported that it raised more than \$2,000,000 in food and clothing during 1944.

DEFENDANTS IN SEDITION TRIAL BUSY SPREADING ANTI-JEWISH PROPAGANDA; ATTACK JEWISH BRIGADE

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- The New York Herald-Tribune reports today that several of the defendants in the abortive mass sedition trial are busily spreading anti-Jewish propaganda through a variety of printed and mimeographed "newspapers."

The Tribune says that Mrs. Elizabeth Dilling - author of the "Red Network", an alleged list of Communists which included high ranking officials and even Mrs. Roosevelt - is putting out a monthly publication, a recent issue of which describes President Roosevelt and Premier Stalin as "stooges of Jewry," and charges that efforts to punish collaborationists in Europe are Jewish-inspired.

Charles B. Hudson of Omaha, the paper discloses, issues a thrice-monthly mimeographed publication, called "America in Danger," which devotes most of its articles to anti-Semitism. The current issue, commenting on the Jewish Brigade, says it will never be used to fight Germany, but will be used in the Near East against the United States and Britain in a war by Russia against the "white race."

Another active "nationalist," who, the Tribune says, appears to be well financed, is Gerald L. K. Smith, whose monthly "The Cross and the Flag" attacks all our allies and all proposals for international collaboration. Other "nationalist" publishers listed in the story are Court Asher, of Muncie, Ind., who publishes the "X-Ray" which features attacks against Justice Frankfurter and "Jew bureaucrats of the New Deal;" William Kulgreen of Atascadero, Calif., and Leon de Aryan of San Diego, Calif.

ORT OPENS ITS 100th INSTITUTION; INVITED TO START OPERATIONS IN YUGOSLAVIA

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- The 100th institution of the ORT was inaugurated last week in Switzerland, it was announced here today by Dr. David Lvovitch, vice-president of the World ORT Union.

Dr. Lvovitch made the announcement on the basis of a cable from Dr. Bron Syngalowski, leader of the ORT Union in Europe, who also reported that at Sonnenberg, near Luzern, the ORT is establishing a training workshop for interned Russian girls at the suggestion of the Soviet Refugee Delegation and the YVEA. The cable disclosed that the Yugoslav Government in Belgrade has invited the ORT to begin operations in Yugoslavia.

UNITED JEWISH APPEAL LAUNCHES "MOST EXTENSIVE DRIVE" IN HISTORY OF NEW YORK JEWRY

NEW YORK, April 3. (JTA) -- The most extensive campaign in the history of the city's Jewish community was officially launched here today when Monroe Goldwater, chairman of the 1945 drive of the United Jewish Appeal of Greater New York, addressed a meeting at the Hotel Commodore of representatives of 350 community, professional and trade groups in the city, giving the go-ahead signal to more than 10,000 volunteer workers.

The 1945 campaign will seek to raise New York's share of the \$75,000,000 needed by the Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal, the National Jewish Welfare Board and the National Refugee Service. The meeting was also addressed by Louis Broide, executive campaign chairman.
