SINGER AGED. SICKLY JEWS ONLY SURVIVORS OF LEIPZIG'S 15,000, JTA CORRESPONDENT FINDS

LEIPZIG. April 22. (JL.) -- Fifteen sick and aged men and one sickly woman tre the sole survivors of Leipzig's 15,000 Jews of whom only about 5,000 succeeded in sireting before 1939. They are all quartered in a single house on Blumelstrasse.

A Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent visiting the "Jewish House." also fand many non-Jewish wives and husbands of Jews, whose spouses - about 250 of thom we deported eight weeks ago, together with children renging in ago from four years.

The tremendous fur center in Leipzig, which was largely operated by Jewish aplayers and employees, was taken over by the Nazis, but has been almost completely istroyed by allied bombings. Likewise, publishing enterprises here, several of which -like the famous Fisher Verlag - were seized from Jows, have been three-quarters dostroyed.

The eldest of the 15 surviving Jews is Richard Frank, a former knitgoods muchoturer, whose son-in-law Ernest Hyman lives at 345 Broad St., in Red Bank, N. J. the women is agod Hildegarde Fink.

BOLOGN., April 22. (JTA) -- Virtually the entire Jewish population of Bologna, hish was captured yesterday by Fifth and Eighth army troops, was wiped out a little were year ago, a Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent was told today.

Dr. Patella said that a few Jows may have found refuge in Catholic institutions, but he was not sure.

A typical, although almost unbelievable, story of how these youngsters were and from the Germans was told to a Jowish Telegraphie Agency correspondent by listacl Slaffstein, who formerly lived in a small village in the province of Sandaiers in Feland. For almost four years he has been hidding his son, Josai, in one communication camp after another to provent him being killed by the Nazis.

When he was first expressed, Slaffstein said, his wife was sent to a double cap, but he was spared because he was an export leather worker and was needed by the formers. He bribed a Nazi officer with the entire stock of his small business to allow him to take his baby to the concentration camp with him. For a year-and-a-half that he sport in this small camp, Slaffstein seved the child by paying a weekly bribe to the camp cammandant, a 55-year-old major from Leipzig. The bribe, consisting usually at eaffer, ten ar eigars, was collected by the 500 Jows in the camp.

SHIDREN OF ALL JESS DEPORTED FROM FRANCE MADE WARDS OF NATION UNDER NEW DECREE

MARIS, April 22. (JTA) - All miror children, irrespective of nationality, mass parents or guardians were deported from France for political or racial reasons, has been placed under the provisional guardianship of the Office of Matilated Veterms, Mar Victims and Mards of the Mation, under a decree issued here yesterday. Scaltiel asserted that the Ministry of Departees has refused permission for the emigration of any children regardless of their nationality. He said that the case of each child is now being examined individually by the Ministry.

WISH AGRICULTURAL CAPITAL IN PALESTINE MORE THAN DOUBLED SINCE WAR: 54 NEW COLONIES

JERUSALEM, April 22. (JTA) -- The capital invested in Palestine agriculture has risen from \$16,000,000 at the outbreak of the war to \$40,000,000 today, it was disclosed at the closing session of the annual conference of the Jowish Agricultural Worker Organization. It was also reported that 54 new agricultural settlements have been abblished since the war.

The conference voted to send a delegation to High Commissioner Lord Gort to rotest the obstacles placed in the way of Jewish agricultural development by the the high Rep. It also urged that special attention be paid to arranging for the settlement in fun colonies of demobilized soldiers and children arriving from liberated brogon countries.

The Jewish National Fund headquarters here today announced that world receipts is the first six months of the Jewish calendar year totalled nearly \$4,000,000, repmating an increase of 26 percent over the similar period last year.
