AU PRANCISCO EXPECTED TO TAKE FIRST STEP TOWARDS INTERNATIONAL DECISION ON PALESTINE

SAN FRANCISCO. April 25. (JTA) -- The United Nations Security Conference which opened today at the opens house here will go down in Jewish history as having then the first step towards an eventual international decision on the fate of Palesthe by appointing a special body, to be known as "Committee Number Four." to deal with the question of international trusteeships for mandated areas including Palestine.

The appointment of such a body will in no way contradict the announcement mic yesterday by British Deputy Prime Minister Clement R. Attlee. that no specific reference to Palestine will be made at the conference even in connection with the intemetional trusteeship plan.

Thile it can be expected that neither the British delegation, nor the Amerim, will mention Palestine during the discussions on international trusteeship, the het remains that "Committee Number Four" which the general assembly of the conference all establish will definitely have Palestine in mind when preparing recommendations in the machinery to deal with the practical details of international trusteeships.

It is difficult to predict whether Zionist observers or pro-Zionist consulthats of American Jowish bodies will have an opportunity to influence the decisions of Comittee Number Four." The general belief prevailing here is that Dr. Chaim Weizmm is the only person whose presence would contribute much to the prestige of the Zionist cause since he, and he alone, is accepted by many members of the deleptions of various nations as the person able to counteract any move which may be made the Arab delegations, including a possible effort to have an Arab representative a the body which will be set up by the conference to deal with the international trusteeship plan.

American Jewish Conference Plans Vigorous Campaign on Palestine

Leaders of the American Jewish Conference here intend to tackle the problem by equiting a Pro-Palestine campaign jointly with the World Jewish Congress, the Jowish Casy and representatives of the Board of Deputies of British Jews who are expected to arrive this week as private observers. This campaign will begin with a press confrence arranged by the four groups, jointly for representatives of the American press and radio, to whom the arguments for establishment of Palestine as a Jewish Commonwaith will be presented. This will be followed by contacting of diplomats from varias actions who may have a voice in the choice of members for "Committee Rambor lar."

Some observers here think that such an open press campaign may backfire, remilting in strong anti-Zionist statements from the Arab dolegations who are attracting pest attention in the press because of their colorful appearance, but who have, so h, abstrained from making my statements regarding Palestine. Such a possibility

It is known that the Arab delegations here were much impressed by Attlee's management that the British delegation came to San Francisco with no recommendations integer regarding the future of Parastine. This is being interpreted as an indication that the British government may domain that some form of quisities be held in Palestine before any decision is taken by the United Nations if the part to a change in the status of the Palestine mandate.

Attlee 's Statement' Came as Surprise to Zionist Leaders

If Attlee's statement is the final word on the attitude of the British temment towards the Palestine question, it can only mean that Britain is determined thee Palestine for itself under sole British trusteeship instead of under interstant trusteeship and, perhaps, may permit the United States to have a share in alstime to the same extent as under the present mandate.

The key to the situation, therefore, remains in the hands of the projected temthee Number Four.* Will this committee be dominated by Britain with regard to the hlestine question, or will it make its own decisions - that is the question which being asked here on the opening day of the Security Conference. Future sessions we contain a clue to the answer.

CHIDLY DELEGATION AT SAN FRANCISCO WILL SUPPORT AID FOR JEWS, OFFICIAL SAYS

MOTRELL, April 25. (JTA) -- The Canadian representatives in San Francisco fill the all possible aid to the Jewish people, Acting Secretary of State Brooke (but has assured a delegation representing the Canadian Jewish Congress and the imits Organization of Canada.

The delegation submitted two briefs. The one from the Canadian Jowish Sonpess dealt with restitution of soized properties and the restoration of status of its Jose of Europe, protection of the stateless, and a Bill of Rights for the protection of life and liberty for all the people of the world. That submitted by the Canains Jimist Organization dealt with Palestine. The Congress' memorandum also recogined the importance of the idea of Palestine as a Jowish homeland.

The delegation was headed by Samuel Bronfman, the national president of the fages. He was accompanied by F. I. Spielman of Montreal, the national treasurer, and Saul Hyes, national executive director of the Congress, and by Rabbi Oscar Fasman of Othan, Edward E. Galbar of Toronto, and Mrs. Anna Raginsky of Montreal, the national president of the Hadessah Organization of Canada.

THE HOSTEGIAN JEWS AT BUCHENWALD BELIEVED ONLY SURVIVORS OF OVER 1,200 DEPORTEES

IOHOM, April 25. (JTA) -- A Swedish correspondent who has just returned from hehemald told the Jowish Telegraphic Agency today that he mot there five Norwegian is, who believe that they are the sole survivors of the more than 1,200 who were deputed from Horway in November, 1942.

The survivors - Samuel Steinman of Oslo; Assor Hirsch, Asriel Hirsch and Julm Attiel of Trondheim, and Lee Ettinger of Molde - who range in age between 22 and N, said that immediately after the deportations, the Jows were divided into two gays. Those unable to work were murdered, while the able-bodied ones were kept at which until the approach of the Russians.

They were then loaded onto open trucks and sent to Buchenwald. Many died en nate from exposure in the mid-winter cold. One of the five survivors told the correspondent that he was slated for extermination, but was saved by the arrival of the All-lied troops. The Norwegian Government is arranging to bring them to England pending to liberation of Norway.

It was reported today that Eliesor Gruenbaum, a son of Isaac Gruenbaum of the with Agency executive, is among the survivors found at Buchenwald.

WE 11,500 RUMINIAN JEWS ALREIDY REPLIERLITED FROM TRANSMISTRIA; 350 FROM OSWIECIM

BUCHLREST, April 25. (JLA) -- More than 11,500 Rumanian Jows have already been matriated from the sections of the Soviet Ukraine to which they were deported during the forman demination of Rumania, it was disclosed here today.

It was also announced that an additional 350 Transylvanian Jows who were among to sevirors at the Oswiccim death camp in Poland have returned home on trains promisely by the Rumanian Government. Another train is an route from Gracow bearing other sevirors.

ANTI-JEWISH LAWS STILL IN FORCE IN SALONICA, SHERTOK REPORTS AFTER VISIT TO GREECE

TEL AVIV, April 25. (JTA) -- German anti-Jowish laws, providing for the exproplation of Jowish-owned property, are still in force in Salonica, Moshe Shertok, political chief of the Jewish Agency, revealed at a press conference here today.

Shertck said, however, that in an interview with Fremier Petres Voulgaris he as premised that the government would look into the matter. The Agency's political ked disclosed that he had also urged the Greek premier to facilitate the emigration tallotine of Jows, especially children, and to exempt from military service youths reciving agricultural training in preparation for emigrating to Falestine.

During a visit with Archbishop Damsakinos, Shertok said, he thraked the prelate for his defense of Jows during the occupation, and Damsakinos revealed that he ad not been molested by the Nazis until he voiced his opposition to anti-Jewish measures.

While in Rome, following his visit to the Jewish Brigade, Shertok was received by the Pope, to whom he expressed Palestine Jewry's appreciation of the assistance given Jews by the Church.

Shortok said that he knew "of no happier community" than the Jewish Brigade, "lithough they are fighting and being killed," he continued, "they know that before then are the graves of 5,000,000 murdered Jews and behind them are the eyes of the United Mations and world Jewry,"

FORLD JESSISH CONGRESS LAUNCHES BOOK COLLECTION FOR EUROPEAN JEWS

MEN YORK, April 25. (JTA) -- To assist in the cultural and spiritual rehabilition of Jews in the wor-torn countries, the World Jewish Congress has launched a empaign for the collection of books and religious articles to be shipped abroad, it was announced by Dr. Stophon S. Wise, president of the congress.

In urging American Jewry to contribute for this purpose, bocks in any field and in any language, particularly in Hebrew and Yiddish, Dr. Wise said that these would rarly make up for the loss of hundreds of thousands of volumes which have disappeared in the destruction of Jewish communities throughout the war zones. Dr. Albert Einstein is honorary chairman of a special committee for the book collection.
