ME THROUGHOUT THE WORLD GREET V-B DAY, REJOICE AT FINAL DESTRUCTION OF NAZISM

MEW YORK, May 7. (JTA) -- Jews throughout the world today joined their blice-citizens in all democratic countries in hailing the end of the war in Europe with final destruction of Nazism which took the lives of more than 5,000,000 Jews.

In Palestine, where almost every Jawish family has suffered directly from the kreen extermination of large sections of European Jewry, spontaneous demonstrahas sere organised in the streets of the larger cities and marchers peraded carryig the banners of the United Nations. Throngs filled the synagogues reciting spemil thanksgiving prayers issued by the Chief Rabbinate.

Similar, although somewhat quieter demonstrations marked V-B day in Jewish wantities which were only recently liberated from the Germans and in the large Jewin centers in the United States and other democratic countries.

In New York, Dr. John Slawson, executive vice-president of the American krish Committee, issued a statement declaring that "the remnants of the Jews of brose and the free Jewish communities everywhere share the joy of free men," but arming that "this victory will not be complete if humanity does not learn the most distribut lesson of the struggle - the setting of one group against another, one Etionslity against another, must lead to strife and world conflagrations.

Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Zionist Organization of America, mailing that two-thirds of European Jewry has been exterminated by the Germans, aid, in a statement issued in Washington, that "we hope that V-S day will open the no of the world to the reality and scope of the Jewish problem and to an underfamiling that the solution of this problem is on inextricable part of a world charter fer a just peace.

MISH LEADERS AT SAN FRANCISCO SAY V-E DAY SPURS NEED FOR REHABILITATION OF BIRCHE'S LIEWS

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7. (JTA) -- Expressing their elation over Germany's sur-Moder, leaders of central Jewish organizations who are here in connection with thein Francisco Conference emphasized today that the complete defeat of Nazism imposed special obligation on the Jews of the democratic countries to secure a speedy rebilding of Jewish life in devastated Europe and to enable immigration to Palestine of those surviving Jews who may wish to go there.

The Jewish leaders here feel that a great deal has been accomplished by souring the amendment of the Big Four recommending to the General Assembly the esballshment of a Commission on Human Rights to promote human rights and fundamental bredoms. This occumisation is going to play a very important role as far as Jewish Matter activities are concerned since it is through this commission that the Jewish biles will work in securing the speedy re-establishment of Jewish rights in all tophries and in protecting these rights for the future. .

American Jewish Conference Representatives Reject Bid for United Jewish Front

SAN FRANCISCO, May 7. (JTA) -- The American Jewish Conference, supported by the representatives of the World Jewish Congress and the Jewish Agency for Palestine, saterday rejected the proposal of the delegates of the Symagogue Council of America to mediate for the establishment of a united front among the various Jewish groups here.

At the same time, it was announced that the American Jewish Conference and the American Jewish Committee have submitted separate letters to Secretary of State Settinus expressing the hope that Jewish rights with regard to Palestine will not be werlooked in any formula which the security conference will adopt in connection with the rejected system for international trusteeships for mandated areas.

At a press conference yesterday, Henry Monsky revealed that the American which Conference representatives are carefully studying the British, American and other drafts on trusteeship plans and, within a few days, will make public their observations on the subject. Meanwhile, he said, the American Jewish Conference, in its letter to Mr. Stettinius, has advanced the following demands:

- 1 "Any plan for international trusteeships in succession to the existing makes system of the League of Nations should be sufficiently flexible and broad in sope to permit within its framework the solution of the Pelestine problem in according with the underlying intent and purpose of the Balfour Declaration and the Pelesting mandre.
- 2 "Nothing shall be included which would be inconsistent with or pre-judidal to the special rights of the Jewish people under the Balfour Declaration and the Abstine Mandate, and all such rights should be expressly reserved and safeguarded."

The representatives of the American Jewish Conference also requested that \$\frac{1}{2}\$. Stattinius errange a meeting for them with the members of the American delegation that they may discuss this problem. Such a meeting will probably be held the early part of this week.

The letter of the American Jewish Committee which was signed by Judge Joseph M. Proskauer, supports the demands of the American Jewish Conference. It reads a follows:

"The position of the American Jewish Committee about final solution of the hissins problem has been stated in our memorandum filed with you. Nevertheless, repriless of our general position as there stated, we are glad to express our accord with the requests of the interim committee of the American Jewish Conference that it is made affirmatively clear that no action of the San Francisco Conference will work to be prejudice of existing rights of the Jews in respect to Pelestine, or to the Peludice of the existing rights of Jews to immigrate to Pelestine."

MES 3,000 JEWISH SURVIVORS FOUND AT LABOR CAMP ANNEX OF DACHAU BY AMERICAN TROOPS
