WIET STILL UNDECIDED ON TRUSTEESHIPS, MOLOTOV INDICATES; BACKS "HUMAN RIGHTS" PIAN

SAN FRANCISCO, May 8. (JTA) -- The Soviet Government has not yet made up its might regard to the question of international trusteeships for mandated territories, including Palestine, it was indicated by Foreign Commissar Molotov addressing a press actresse.

Emphasizing that while the Soviet delegation has reached a complete undermulig with Britain and the United States regarding all amendments to the Dumbarton his proposals which will be submitted to the plenary session of the United Nations knewnce, no commitments have yet been made by it regarding the proposed trusteeship man over colonies and mandated areas.

Mr. Molotov used the British term, "territorial trusteeship," rather than the mrisan term "international trusteeship," when he spoke of the Soviet attitude toward is proposed trusteeship plane. He said the Soviet delegation is still studying the Mitth and American drafts which differ very much, both with regard to such mandated mritises as Falestime as well as territories not under League of Nations mandate.

All that Molotov disclosed was that "the USSR will actively participate in manderation of the trusteeship problem in its entirety," which was interpreted by what was than when the Soviet attitude will be formulated it will elso cover terribles under Mandate "A" of the League of Nations, of which Palestime is the only remining one.

Jewish leaders here are impressed by the fact that Molotov emphasised that a Soriet delegation was strongly behind the proposal for establishment by the general weakly of the interactional security organization of a Commission for Eumen Rights wi Fundamental Freedoms, but Zionist leaders are watching with suspicion the proposals by regional arrangements which are now under discussion by the Big Four, since it is burn that the Arab delegations are working hard to have the Fan-Arab league recognised in the source as a regional unit for the antire Middle East within the new world mitten.

Should the Arab request be granted, Falestine would fall within their "relow security" supervision. Greeting the end of bloodshed in Europe, Henry Monsky, president of B'nal Prith, in a V-E Day statement, called upon American Jewry to remain mobilized until the essation of hostilities in the Facific and to remember the tragedy of European buy and not to relex its efforts until Jewish rights are recognized by the peacembers.

Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national compaign chairman of the Joint Distribution (maittee, pointed out that "while the civilized world rejoices today in victory over the forces of tyronny and oppression we in America face an urgent responsibility to unce as far as possible the destruction Hitler wrought. For hundreds of thousands of liter's victims there can be no complete victory until that is done. During the last with at least 500,000 Jews have come out of concentration camps with tortured starved iddes but with hope for new life. Another million have been living in terror and liding in German-occupied lands. These million and a half who survive need help despettly. Large numbers herely alive will die unless American aid comes promptly.

Ers. Moses P. Epstein, national president of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist branisation of America, in a statement sent to 150,000 members of the group, called upu Jewish women "to mobilize anew to assure the complete extirpation of the remaining forces of evil. We must not cease our labors until there is world-wide resurgence of freedom for all papoples, among whom the Jews have waited longest and in greatest taxell for victory, the statement read.

Work Ceases in Palestine as Jews Celebrate End of The War in Europe

MRUSAIEM, May 8. (JTA) -- Work in all but essential industries stopped today in Jerusalem in accordance with a V-E day proclamation by the Jewish National formula. Between four and seven p.m. all urban traffic came to a halt, and this evening public prayers were said in all synagogues.

Schools were open, but regular classes were suspended while teachers explained to their pupils the significance of the cocasion. Flags flew from public and minte buildings and lighted Mogen Davids and memorahs shone forth from the roofs of the higher structures. A procession headed by leaders of the Jewish community, followed by servicement and members of civil defense units bearing placards recalling the millions of exterminated Jess and other appropriate slogans marched through the treats of Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and other places.

The Palestine Symphony Orehestra was giving a consert last night, under the book of British guest conductor Louis Cohen, when word of the German surrender was
