MET ROPOSALS ON TRUSTEESHIFS INDICATE INTEREST IN PALESTIME PROBLEM, ZIONISTS FEBL

SAN FRANCISCO, May 13. (JTA) -- An indication that the Soviet Union does mintend to remain indifferent to Palestine was seen here today by experts of the with Agency who are studying the text of the Soviet proposals on international rateships submitted during the week-end to the United Nations Conference on Intertional Organization.

These proposals refer, among other things, to territories under Mandate of the League of Nations, of which Pelestine is the only remaining one, and demand the trusteeship council include a Soviet member. Jewish Agency representatives here will seek clarification from the Soviet Exption concerning the section of the Soviet proposals which provides that one of be basic objectives of the trusteeship system should be progressive development of imbitants in the trusteed territories toward self-government "and self-determinstim with active perticipation of peoples of these territories, having the aim to amolite the achievement by them of full national independence. In the case of Palesto this provision may work to the advantage of the arabs and may endanger the Jewish mittion, if not properly defined.

Soviets Back U. S. Stend on Annual Reports by Trustees.

The Soviet proposals support the United States recommendations that states white territories in trust must submit their annual reports to the General Assembly the projected international organization and not to the Economic and Social Council, the British propose. They also specify that the trusteeship council should be Exercid to accept petitions and institute investigations with regard to the adminisretion of entrusted territories - a provision which was also suggested by the United hetes and which is opposed by Britain. In this respect the United States and Soviet Mestions are welcomed by Zionist leaders here, since they provide a machinery for he design Agency to submit petitions regarding Palestine, as is the case under the league of Nations mendate.
