#### METINIUS SAYS HUMAN RIGHTS SAFEGUARDE REQUIRED BECAUSE OF FASCIST RACIAL PROPAGANDA

SAN FRANCISCO, May 15. (JTA) — Secretary of State Stettinius, speaking at press conference today, concerning the provision on human rights proposed by the me sponsoring governments of the UNCIO for inclusion in the charter of the intermitmal organization, said that this provision was partially necessitated by "recial majors that have been built up since the rise of Marism and Fascism by systematic majors hatred and prejudice."

He emphasized that the provision "is a far reaching step because it would play the members of the world organization to cooperate effectively in promoting man rights and fundamental freedoms for all individuals and peoples regardless of ms, language, religion or sex."

The United States Government, Mr. Stottinius said, will work "actively and tressly" towards the protection and promotion of these rights and freedoms. "We sat be sternally vigilant against assaults upon them," he added. "We must also sot dimentically to enlarge the scope of their protection and to nourish their growth. I long as rights and freedoms are denied to some, the rights and freedoms of all we in danger. Everything possible must be done to bring effective life to the Commission on Human Rights."

## Says Member Governments Of World Organization Must Implement Rights

Wr. Stettinius pointed out that the provisions on human rights proposed in the charter will not assure, by themselves, the realization of human rights and mammatal freedoms to all people. "The provisions are not made enforceable by any international machinery," he emphasized. The responsibility rests with the member thermal to carry them out. We can here make only a beginning, but I believe it is good am substantial beginning, he said. The Secretary of State pointed cut that whether the opportunity for the promotion of human rights is used effectively. That will depend upon the governments of the member nations, and upon the peoples to elect these governments to office.

The four sponsoring governments, he revealed, have agreed that an enumeration of individual and collective human rights and fundamental freedoms in the charbrould not be attempted at this conference.

"I believe," he said, "that when the international organization is establish, the Economic and Social Council, through the Commission on Human Rights, shall promptly undertake to prepere an international bill of rights which can be meeted by all the member nations as an integral pert of their own system of law, but as our Bill of Rights has been an integral pert of our system of laws.

He added that the amendments on human rights are closely linked with the seminants establishing equal rights and self-determination of peoples as one of the fundamental purposes of the international organization.

IONDON, May 15. (JTA) — Prime Minister Churchill today rejected a demand int device refugees now in Britain be immediately repatriated. # EN CONFERENCE RECOGNITION OF PALESTINE AS ARAB STATE THROUGH APPROVAL OF PAN-ARAB LEAGUE

SAN FRANCISCO, May 15. (JTA) — The first official step by Arab delegations have to proclaim Falestine as an Arab state was made today when the delegations of light, Syria, Saudi Arabia, Iraq and Lebanon submitted to the conference's Commission athe Security Council and to its Sub-Committee on Regional Arrangements the pact of the League of Arab Nations with its appendix which seeks to classify Falestine as one of the Arab countries participating in the League.

The step was made in connection with efforts of the Arab delegations to make the UNCIO's recognition of the Fan-Arab League as the regional power in the Malk East. In this connection, the Arab delegations, led by Egypt, are closely withing the campaign of the Latin American bloc to secure approval of regional erapsents, A joint dinner for the Arab and Latin American delegations was tendered by last night by a group calling itself "Races of America United."

Newish headers here take the attitude that by sesking to classify Palestime used and the construction of the League of Arab Nations ignores the special position of Palestine under the League of Nations mandate and the international coverant providing for establishment there of a Jewish national home. They also point out that it is significant that one of the first public acts of the Arab League has been to tend a communication to President Truman and Frime Minister Churchill demanding temination of the Palestine mandate and establishment of Palestine as an Arab state.

The Arab campaign on regional arrangements is meeting with opposition from any querters which argue that from the point of view of promoting regional security is mehinery of the Arab League is entirely worthless, Moreover, the military weak-mas of the Arab states, whether individually or as a group, make setting up of an imb bloc as a separate security organization, isolated from world system, a factor dissecurity rather than security, and one likely to invite rather than doter aggression.

It is also pointed out that among the members of the Arab League are nonminers of the United Nations such as Yemen and Trans-Jordan, and that while the purwe of the UNCIO is to create machinery for maintaining international peace and 111.1. EC

sourity, the irredentist aim of the Arab League is essentially disruptive and must twittely lead to friction and conflict.

Frime Minister Feter Fraser of New Zealand, who heads the Trusteeship Committee, told a press conference yesterday that Falestine will not be discussed here sime specific territories will not be dealt with. He gave assurances, however, that its status of Falestine, or any other mandate, would not be changed without consulting its territory's inhabitants. Zionist leaders, meanwhile, were given to understand that the trusteeship system will be formulated in such a way that Jewish rights in histine will not be prejudiced.

#### Arab Land Purchases In Falestine, Formation of Propaganda Bureau To Be Discussed

CAIRO, May 15. (JTA) — The question of Arab land purchases in Falestine will head the agenda of the meeting of the agricultural and economic commissions of the league of Arab Mations which is scheduled to be held here next month, Abdul hims Assam Bey, secretary general of the league and Minister for Arab Affairs in the Egyptian Government, said today.

Assam Bey stated that Moussa el Alami, who represents the Arabs of Palestine is the league, is coming to Cairo shortly to discuss the formation of an Arab propagate bureau, which would be financed jointly by all the Arab countries. He also disclosed that Yemen has signed the charter of the league completing the membership of all independent states.

### STABLISHMENT OF "HEEREW STATE" IN PALESTINE URGED IN RESOLUTION INTRODUCED IN HOUSE

WASHINGTON, May 15. (JTA) — A bi-partisan measure supporting establishment its "free Hebrew state" in Palestine and its recognition by the United States was to-day introduced in the House by Representative Andrew Somers, Democrat, and Augustus Samett, Republican, of New York. A similar resolution is expected to be introduced in the Senate in the near future.

The House resolution earries the support of thirty congressmen, a number of than plan to introduce similar resolutions. These sponsors include Democratic Representatives Helen Gahagan Douglas of California, Estes Kefauver of Tennessee, Thomas I, law of Massachusetts, Pat Cannon of Florida, and Republican Representative Homer lagell of Oregons

Support of the resolution was expressed by House majority leader John W. McCormack and minority leader Joseph Martin. "Permanent solution to this great challege to humanity is through statehood," McCormack declared, adding "the sconer this is done, the quicker this great human problem will be solved." He said that establishent of the Hebrew nation in Palestine will aid world-wide peace and strengthen may international security organizations

Stating that he will continue his past support for establishment of a Rebrew matter in Palestine, Representative Martin said #I have always believed that the Rebrew people should be given an opportunity to found in Palestipe a nation of their was where they can escape oppression and build a permanent home.

The Somers-Bennett resolution further provides that the United Nations create a special inter-governmental agency to effectuate repatriation of Hebrews in Europe to Palestine.

# MESSIONAL REPORT SAYS JEWS AMONG CHIEF VICTIMS OF ATROCITIES AT NAZI CAMPS

MASHINGTON, May 15. (JTA) — Jews, Russians and Poles were treated with pater severity than other nationalities in the concentration camps of Nazi Germany, sanding to "all the evidence available," Senator Alben Borkley of Kentucky, majority later of the Senate, told Congress today in presenting the report of the joint Senate of Emms committee which investigated Nazi atrocities at the request of General with 1, Eisenhower.

In the hour-long report which he read to an engrossed Senate, Barkley dedred "we are of the opinion that a colossal scheme of extermination was planned and grinte effect against all those in occupied countries who refused to accept the smiples of Mazism, or who opposed the saddling of the Nazi yoke on their countries." Is report states that the intelligentsia, college professors, generals, business later and professional men of occupied countries were seized and placed in the inputty camps "unless they agreed to spread the dootrines advocated by the Nazis."

The committee, consisting of six members of each house, visited three camps, behandly, Nordhausen and Dachau, which they described as typical of the more than a hadred concentration camps in Germany, and furnished an "accurate cross-section d the entire German political prisoner camp system and policy." Various agencies, including the United States Army, are collecting evidence to be used in punishment d the war criminals, the report states.

#### MENTA EEGINS TRIAL OF WAR CRIMINALS CHARGED WITH MURDER OF THOUSANDS OF JEWS

BUCHAREST, May 15. (JTA) — The trial of 26 war oriminals, many of them target with the deportation and murder of thousands of Jews, opened here yesterday Microthe Peoples Tribunal. Two public prosecutors are representing the state. Is defendents face the death penalty.

Among those on trial are Colonel Yosipescu, who is charged with responsibilly for the robbing and killing of more than 70,000 Jews who were deported to Transmatria, Senerals Estshitch and Trestioneems, who are accused of murdering 25,000 in Esse, and General Calotescu who deported 80,000 Bukovina Jews to Transnistia where not of them died.

The Bucharest radio announced today that the Jews of northern Transylvania, mich was recently returned to Rumania after having cocupied by Hungary for several pars, observed a day of mourning this week to mark the establishment of the first patter in Transylvania, and the beginning of the deportation of Jews. At ceremonies in the firmer ghetto districts, speakers praised the Groza government for having them steps to eliminate radial hatred, the broadcast said.

## MERIAN GIRLS COMPELLED BY U.S. ARMY DOCTORS TO CARE FOR DYING JEWISH REFUGEES

LIM, Austria, May 15. (JTA) — Well-fed, buxom Austrian girls are being used to care for the thousends of emsciated Jewish refugees who have flooded this divisions last week. The girls, most of whom expressed a disinclination to wait used sews, were ordered into the hospital by surgeons of the U. S. 65th Division, to are running it.

Rundreds of the refugees are dying daily, despite desperate efforts by beries doctors to save them. Six Hungarian Jewish refugee physicians have been milisted to assist the army doctors. However, the local doctors are not being asked to help, "I don't think they understand our kind of medicine," Major Solomon Rosenth grinly told a Jewish Telegraphic Agendy correspondent. When the refugees return, they will be sent homs.
