MEN ARRICY PROTESTS CIRCULATION AMONG UNCIO DELEGATES OF ARAB CLAIMS UPON PALESTINE

SAN FRANCISCO, May 18. (JTA) -- The Jewish Agency for Palestine today filed immendum with the UNCIO secretariat, protesting against the circulation among the EN delgates of the appendix to the charter of the pan-Arab league which claims with lestine is an Arab state and should be included in the league, and that the line has the authority to designate an Arab representative for Palestine.

The Jewish Agency memorandum points out that Yemen and Transjordan, which members of the United Mations, are signatories to the League pact, and says the test that the secretariat should have refused official circulation to be appendix. It also asserts that the inclusion of Palestine in the pan-Arab body is atter of foreign relations which is within the authority of the mandatory power, as comerning which the Agency is entitled to advise and cooperate. It asks, finally, this memorandum be circulated as an official UNCIO document to all the delegates.

MESTINE NEWSPAPERS DEMAND IMMEDIATE LIFTING OF RIGOROUS PRESS CENSORSHIP

JERUSALEM, May 18. (JTA) - A demand that the rigorous Falestine censorship shelished in view of the end of the war in Europe was voiced today in two Falestine suppers.

The English-language Palestime Post and the Hebrew daily Hatzofe carry editries stating that since most of the emergency defense regulations have been retried, there is no justification for continuance of the censorship, which, they charge, term the freedom of the press.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency, however, learns from extremely reliable sares that the Falestine Government has no intention of lifting the censorship at its greent time.

THINGS TESTIFY CONCERNING MURDER OF THOUSANDS OF JEWS AT TRIAL OF RUMANIAN FASCIST

BUCHAREST, May 18. (JTA) — A Rumanian fessist officer who supervised the ster of tens of thousands of Jews deported to Transmistria was confronted in court taxy with two of his victims who survived. The officer, a Colonel Isopescu, is being this by a Peoples Tribunal as a war criminal.

Jacob Effemian, 42, said that before having the Jews killed Isopesou complied them to surrender all their valuables to him, promising that he would give them their value in money. Joseph Braunstein, 20, said that he had been forced to pile up the bodies of Isopesou's viotims and prepare them for cremation. His own parents, he that, were among the mirdered.

WISH WOMAN AT TERRESIENSTADT GRTS NEWS OF LONG-LOST HUSBAND FROM JTA FRESS JEEP

THERESIENSTADT, May 18. (JTA) — A press jeep in which Eyer Levin, a Jewin Selsgraphic Agency war correspondent, has travelled throughout thousands of miles dilberated territory, including the concentration camps of Dachau and Buchenwald, but the means of notifying a Jewish woman in the Theresienstadt ghetto that her husbut, from whom she had not heard in many years, was still alive.

As hundreds of Jews crowded around the jeep, upon whose hood hundreds of alges in different parts of Germany had sortbbled their names, one young woman who as studying the names suddenly shricked: "My husband is alive." She pointed to the marription "Rosenblatt, Dachau," and sobbed: "That's his signature."

Meanwhile, Levin's partner in the jeep, Eric Schwab, a photographer for the fuse-Fress Agency, who had come to Theresienstadt in search of his mother, found her wing in the ghette nursery. The frail, white-haired old lady stered in disbelief the Schwab walked into the mursery. Within a short time, she was lifted into the partners, and is probably the first Jew to be rescued from Theresienstadt.

TID FRANKFURTER TO BECOME FARMER IN SOUTH AMERICA; FAMILY MURDERED BY GERMANS

BERN, May 18. (JTA) - David Frankfurter, who was pardoned yesterday after wing mine years for the assassination of Swiss Mari leader Wilhelm Gustloff, is planing to go to South America and become a farmer, it was learned today. Frankfurter was a medical student at the time he shot Gustloff.

THE CHERGENCY COUNCIL HITS RESOLUTION ON PALESTINE SPONSORED BY BERGSON GROUP

MASHINGTON, May 18. (JTA) -- Describing the introduction in the House of instantatives of a resolution calling for the establishment of a "Hebrew state" inheting as "a tragic disservice to the Jewish people," the American Zionist Emerica to the Jewish people, the American Zionist Emericant Statement and the Jewish People and The Massilla Statement said:

"It has been announced in the press that a resolution regarding Palestine, massed by the self-styled Hebrew Committee of National Liberation, is being intromed in Congress. We do not doubt the friendly motives of the honorable members of tagess who have been persuaded to sponsor that resolution. They undoubtedly have in lad to believe that in this they are of assistance to the Jewish people. But we may pain out with all the vigor at our command that the so-called Hebrew Committee (kitlonal Liberation has been repudiated by every responsible Jewish organization that United States and abroad, including the highest Jewish authority in Palestine limit, the Jewish National Assembly, which is the democratically elected spokesman in the Jews of Palestine.

"It is a matter of public record that the so-called Hebrew Committee of Hemm! Liberation was repudiated by the Jewish Agency for Falestine, the democratially elected spokesman for the Jewish people, Zionist and non-Bionist alike, recognised in this capacity under Article IV of the Mandate for Falestine, confirmed by the Britain, the United States, and 50 other nations of the world. The 'Committee' is also been publicly denounced by the American Jewish Conference, which represents werehelming majority of American Jewry, by the American Zionist Emergency Coundly which represents all major Zionist bodies in the United States; by the Palestine ke Federation, and by a host of other representative Jewish bodies.

"It should again be pointed out that the Hebrew Committee of National Liberaim, headed by Mr. Peter Bergson, represents neither the Jews of Palestine, nor those forces, nor those of the United States. In fact, that "Committee" represents no ment is responsible to no one.

"As is well know, resolutions in support of the Jewish Commonwealth in Palestin were introduced in the Senate and the House by the majority and minority leaders floth houses. Action on these resolutions had to be deferred at the request of the Ministration. We wish to stress most errestly that any attempt to force action at Ministration by either the Senate or the House on a resolution such as the one sponsored the Hebrew Committee of National Liberation would, in our considered opinion, conflicte a tregic disservice to the Jewish people."

The JDC, he revealed, has already appropriated this year \$735,000 for assisting to the Jews of Belgium and is cooperating closely with SHAEF and Belgian authorities in conducting its relief program there.
