MINS STREICHER CAPTURED BY AMERICAN TROOPS; WAS HIDING ON BAVARIAN FARM

MRIS, May 23. (JTA) — Julius Streicher, the Nazi leader who was considered websiter No.1" because of his violent anti-Semitism, was ceptured today by American filters on a farm in Bavaria, where he was trying to hide, using false identification brushts.

The virulent anti-Semite, who became infamous as a result of his pornographic att-waish weekly "Der Stuermer," and who was very much admired by Hitler for his will anti-Jewish activities, was discovered by members of the 101st Airborne Division. Ass reported to have amassed a huge fortune by robbing Jews and confiscating their party. He was chosen by Hitler in March 1933, to direct a boyoott against Jews as implied to organised persecution and robbery of the Jewish population in Germany and like in German-occupied territories.

MW YORK, May 23. (JTA) — The French Government has recognised the Hias-Ioa at the efficial body for Jewish migration and has permitted the organization to name apprentiative to the Special Screening Committees at all French frontier stations it must to check on repatrictes, it was reported here today by Dr. James Bernstein, town Director of the Hias-Ioa Emigration Association who just arrived from Paris.
