## EMS SET FOR NEW SHOWDOWN AT SAN FRANCISCO; FROFOSAIS ON HUMAN RIGHTS ADOPTED

SAN FRANCISCO, May 26. (JTA) -- Arab delegates today indicated that they have tiven up their fight within the trusteeship committee of the UNCIO and that the intend to offer a new amendment to the big powers' proposal on trusteeships which will midify this proposal so as to jeopardize Jewish rights in Falestine. The recommendation as passed by the committee in the form of an amendment the Dumbarton Oaks proposals, reads: "With a view to the creation of conditions disbility and well-being which are necessary for the peaceful and friendly rethins enong nations, based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-termination of peoples, the organization should facilitate solutions of international, second, social, cultural and other humanitarian problems, and promote respect to mass rights and for fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, strate, religion or sex. Responsibility for the discharge of this function should wreted in the General Assembly, and under the authority of the General Assembly, the Becommic and Social Council."

Another emendment passed jointly by the Committee on Folitical and Security butions and by the Committee on Boonomic and Social Cooperation, reads: "The General assembly should initiate studies and make recommendations for the purpose of proming international cooperation in political, economic, social and cultural fields tasist in the realization of human rights and basic freedoms for all, without distants as to race, language, religion or sex, and also for the encouragement of the implement of international lews."

Implementation of these recommendations by establishment of a commission for the graction of human rights by the Committee on Economic and Sccial Cooperation is gracted within the next few days, through a joint amendment of the big powers to the lasteton Cats proposals. This semendment reads: "The Economic and Social Council study set up commissions in the fields of sconemic activity, social activity, culturally, promotion of human rights and any other field within the competence of the familia. These commissions should consist of experts. There should be a permanent family which should constitute a part of the secretariat of the organization."

## WITH AFRICAN NATIONALISTS ASSAIL FILMS OF GERMAN ATROCITIES AS "JEWISH FROFAGANDA"

JOHANNESBURG. South Africa. May 28. (JTA) -- Nationalist newspapers here reassailing films of German atrocities, which are being shown in all theatres, as wish propaganda. One nationalist newspaper summed up its reaction to the films b declaring: "It is clear that Jewish capitalist wer instigators are becoming draid with the approaching peace, that the peace terms may be too Christian. Therefor the purpose of these films is to incite a tremendous hatred against the Germans."

At the same time, nationalists, who openly demonstrated their admiration for Mari Germany all during the war, and who bitterly attacked suggestions that South Mries harbor several hundred Jewish orphans from Europe, are now urging that childless couples adopt German war orphans, and are asking funds for German relief.
