SAN FRANCISCO, June 3. (JTA) - The proposal to establish a Commission on Humaints, advocated by Jewish and non-Jewish consultants to the U. S. delegation, was signed restorated by the Committee on Social and Economic Cooperation of the United Nimes Conference.

"The non-axis nationals are protected by the established theory of internationliv, and represented by their respective governments, but anti-Razis and anti-Fasdut of German origin, or originating from other Axis countries also deserve your thest," the memorandum says. It demands that Axis assets in the United States in a bands of the Custodian of Enemy Property, amounting to a gross value of 445 millim dellars, and blocked assets worth \$6,500,000,000 be used for partial reparation a returner.
