ESTENT HENES INVALIDATES ALL FORCED SALES OF PROPERTY IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA

RAGUE, June 4. (JTA) -- A decree issued here by Fresident Eduard Benes of Methoslovakia invalidates all Nasi-forced deals and provides the foundation for the man of Jewish property to the rightful owners, although very few Jewish survivors main to claim it.

The full text of the decree, carried in today's newspapers, says that "all markets, transactions, judicial decisions regarding mobile or immobile private or bile property are invalid, if undertaken after Sept. 27, 1938, under pressure of wapation, or political, or radial or national persecution."

100,000 TO FINANCE REFATRIATION OF 250,000 POLISH JEWS IN USSR SOUGHT HERE
