## Jewish Agency Negotieting With UNRRA on Sending Relief Teams to Europe

BLAVIV, June 6. LONDON, June 6. (JTA) - Soldiers of the Jewish Brigade are supervising German thops who are clearing up the ruins of Klagenfurt, in Austria, the correspondent of Niemik Folski, semi-official organ of the Folish Government-in-Exile, reported today.

The same paper reports that hundreds of Polish Jews released from concentration mays in Anglo-American zones in Germany have indicated that they do not wish to remum to Foland. Most of the Jews, it said, wish to settle abroad, with the majority of them desiring to go to Pelastine.

BITAIN WARNED NOT TO ENCOURAGE ARAB NATIONALISM, DANGER TO JEWISH INTERESTS CITED

LOMDON, June 6. (JTA) — A warning that Arac nationalism, although presently directed against France, may eventually threaten British interests in the Arab countess and the interests of the Jewish National Home in Palestine was sounded today by its knohester Guardian, leading liberal daily.

The paper warmly supports Gen. de Gaulle's proposal that the relations of the inh countries to the Western Fowers should be considered as a whole by the great wars, and not be limited to the French-Syrian dispute only. "The United Nations wall then make plain to the Arabs that they, too must make concessions for the sake of walk peace," the Manohester Guardian says?

The article reminds the British Government that in spite of appeasing the Arabs welsing the doors of Falestine to Jewish immigration, Britain had trouble in Igpt and in other Arab countries during the war. "The Arab peasant," the article as, "Is not likely to distinguish too cerefully between French and British imperialise. He may argue that if he can get rid of the one, he can also get rid of the other. In the long run we, too, may find it difficult to recencile the promises to the Jews in Falestine and our economic and strategic interests in Egypt and in Iraq the our present encouragement of Arab metionalism."

#### MO REMAIN OF HAMBURG'S 20,000 JEWS; AMG RETURNS COMMUNITY HOUSE TO JEWS

HAMBURG, Germany, June 6. (JTA) -- Six-hundred and fifty Jews -- all of whom were stried to non-Jews - are all that remain of the 20,000 who formerly lived in Hamburg, as Esneman director of the Jewish Self-Aid Committee, today told a Jewish Telegraph-signmy correspondents. It is expected that 500 of the last transport of Jews sent ham here to Theresienstadt will return, Heineman said.

All synagogues in Hamburg were totally destroyed in 1938, with the exception of the new temple on Oberstrasse, the exterior of which remained. The Nazis moved newsper printing presses into the building and they are still there.

## WIGARIA TERMINATES HEBREW BROADCASTS; RESULES NOWHAL TELEGRAPHIC COMMUNICATIONS

SOFIA, June 6. (JTA) — The Bulgarian radio today terminated its broadcasts in when since telegraphic communication between Bulgaria and the rest of the world has been resumed.

The Hebrew broadcasts were conducted by Welwel Fomeraniec, a correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, for the benefit of the Jews in Falestine. In his last tak over the Sofia radio today, the JTA correspondent thanked the Bulgarian government for the facilities given him to broadcast Jewish news to Falestine, England and other countries during the eight months when no regular telegraphic communication between Bulgaria and other countries existed.

## WIY 12 OF 734 JEWS DEPORTED FROM NORWAY BY NAZIS SURVIVED, SAYS OSIO RADIO

STOCKHOIM, June 6. (JTA) — The Oslo radio said today that only 12 of the 754 was deported from Norway by the Germans are believed to have survived. The others are resumed to have been mardered.

Of the 1,800 Jews who lived in Norway before the German invasion, 825 succeeded in escaping, the broadcast seid, while the Nazis deported 734, including 180 women and children. Of the deportees, 470 were Norwegian citizens.
