MIRACIAL AND RELIGIOUS PERSECUTIONS SINCE 1933 WILL BE PROSECUTED AS WAR CRIMES

WASHINGTON, June 7. (JTA) — Atrostties and persecutions on racial or religious grounds committed by the Germans since 1933 will be considered war orimes and the guilty of inciting, ordering or counseling their commission will be punished, herem Court Justice Robert Jackson, U. S. war crimes prosecutor, declared today in a most to President Truman, following his return from London where he consulted with the United Nations War Crimes Commission.

Justice Jackson said that the American people considered the Nazi regime "a but of brigands," adding that "our people have been outraged by the oppressions, the mellest form of torture, the large-scale murder and the wholesale confiscation of porty which initiated the Nazi regime within Germany. They witnessed persecution of the greatest enormity on religious, political and racial grounds, the breakdown of the unions and the liquidation of all religious and moral influences." Citing the wirecord of brutality, he stated: "We propose to punish ects which have been regarble se original since the time of Cain."

Discussing what persons and groups would be liable to punishment, Justice eaten said that the Wer Crimes Commission would indict "a large number of individuals and efficials who were in authority in the government, in the military setablishment indefined General Staff, and in the financial and economic life of Germany, who by ill civilized standards are provable to be common criminals." Organizations such as its Gestapo and the S. S., which played a "cruel and controlling part" in subjugating, life, the German people and then their neighbors would also be prosecuted, he defined,

BONIEM OF DISPLACED JEWS IS OF "INTERNATIONAL IMPORTANCE" SAYS STATE DEPT. ORGAN

WASHINGTON, June 7. (JTA) -- The problem of displaced Jews, while only a mall part of the problem of displaced European populations, is nevertheless a matter of international importance and consern, it is stated today in the current bulling the State Department, in an article discussing the Jews of Germany.

MEXICO CITY, June 7. (JTA) — A law barring immigrants from practicing many restions has been promulgated by the Mexican Government, it is revealed in the furl official, cfficial rublication of the government.

The decree is not retroactive, and exempts those who "can prove that they ex detims of political persecution in their own country." It, however, does not station imagrants who have fled their native lands because of racial or religious execution.

Under the new law immigrants cannot fill the following positions: Accountant, stary, architect, beaterfologist, biologist, broker, chemist, dentist, economist, aginer, lawyer, metallurgist, notary public, murse, pilot, social worker, teacher as wetrinery.

MINSE CHURCH LEADER CHARGES EXILE GOVT. WITH FOSTERING ANTI-SEMITISM IN POLAND

WASHINGTON, June 7. (JTA) — Agents of the Polish Government-in-Exile have we charged with fostering anti-Semitism in Poland by the Dean of Canterbury, the Rev. R. Ewiett Johnson, according to a broadcast on the Moscow radio reported by the Office of War Information. The broadcast said that Dr. Johnson made the charge at a mass conference in Moscow, at which he also said that in all the time he was in Foliah be heard only one shot fired, and that was at a Jow.

THE DEMANDS REORGANIZATION OF ZIONIST EMERGENCY COUNCIL; ASKS RECALL OF SILVER

MEW YORK, June 7. (JTA) -- Declaring that "unless Zionist policies and Zionit effort take a new turn we face a most serious defeat," Leon Gellman, president of Burachi Organization, today demanded that the American Zionist Emergency Council remembered within the next two weeks to take in "all active forces," particularly . Abba Hillel Silver.

In a letter to Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president of the council, Mr. Gellman debred that the Mizrachi Organization has "reached the point where we must declare that ment no longer bear responsibility for the work and policies" of the council. "The Messread interest which has been aroused among the Jewish public by the San Francisco beforece should not obscure the fact that these actions are of relatively minor imwhere so far as the future of Palestine is concerned," he continued. "Such minor messes as we may achieve there should not blind us to the grave realities of the emral political situation.

"In view of the imminent danger, we feel that adequate measuers were not adoptto our political leadership as represented in the American Zionist Emergency Counc-II. In attempt has been made to reintroduce the Falestine resolution in Congress. her has been no forthright denunciation of the anti-Zionist trends prevailing in the hts Department. There has been no adequate attempt to force a showdown on our perment's policy through the concentrated pressure of public opinion. There has in excessive reliance upon the private and public assurances of individual statesmen of the continuing failure to pursue more vigorous and militant policies.

"With all due respect to the present leadership of the Zionist Emergency Coun-d," Mr. Gellman added, "we feel most strongly that conditions demand a reorganization d the Council to include all active forces in a spirit of complete unity and harmony. increcial months have passed since the leadership of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver and his plicies were challenged. We have urged that steps be taken to re-establish Zicnist mity and recall Dr. Silver to active leadership and our proposals were rejected."

M MOERT WALEY-COHEN URGES JEWISH UNITY; FOUND SERIOUS DIVERGENCIES AMONG U. S. JEWS

LONDON, June 7.
