**NEW ANTI-JEWISH INCIDENTS IN PARIS; CROWD BARS RETURN OF JEWS TO FORMER DWELLING**

PARIS, June 13. (JTA) -- New anti-Jewish incidents took place here today when a Jewish family attempted to move into an apartment from which it was ejected during the Vichy regime.

The clashes, which were not serious, broke out on the Boulevard Sevastopol. Shouts of displeasure at the return of the Jews were heard from the crowd which gathered in the street. Police intervention was limited to a lone plainclothes man who requested the crowd to disperse.

**PALESTINE VISAS AWAIT JEWISH ORPHANS PLACED IN NON-JEWISH CUSTODY BY FRENCH OFFICIALS**

PARIS, June 13. (JTA) -- Palestine visas are available for the 92 Jewish children from the Buchenwald camp who are now being cared for by the Committee of Social Welfare of the Resistance, it was announced today by the local office of the Jewish Agency.

Meanwhile, the youngsters were moved today to a rest camp run by the committee, located 40 miles from Paris. Before the children left, Jewish leaders were assured by an official of the Ministry of Deportees, which placed the children in the custody of the Committee of Social Welfare, that the transfer would not hinder their ultimate emigration to Palestine. The children were gay as they packed, expressing the hope that the next time they moved it would be to Palestine.

Earlier today, both the Ministry of Deportees and the OSE issued statements giving their versions of the controversy which has arisen because the OSE was not given custody of the children, although they are caring for 400 other youngsters from Buchenwald.

A spokesman for the ministry told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the children were placed in the custody of the Committee of Social Welfare, rather than sent to OSE homes, because of the alleged inability of the latter organization to provide quarters for them. He asserted that last Tuesday, three days before the children were slated to arrive, the OSE informed the ministry that accommodations for them would not be ready and were informed then that the children would be placed in the care of the non-sectarian committee.

OSE officials told a press conference that the confusion arose because it had not stressed, when conferring with government officials, that the Buchenwald children were Jewish, since it preferred to act on general humanitarian grounds. They said that under their agreement with the government, the OSE was to be entrusted with 800 children from Buchenwald, whose religion was not specified, but "the Ministry of Deportees, thinking that the OSE home would not be ready, decided to entrust these children to the welfare committee."

THOUSANDS OF JEWS STILL CONFINED IN SEVERAL CAMPS IN AUSTRIA; MANY DYING DAILY

GENEVA, June 13. (JTA) -- Two thousand Jews are still confined in Camp Mauthausen, near Gmunden, Oberdenau, in Austria, which was liberated by American troops, it was reported here today. About 1,500 of them are Polish Jews, mainly from Silesia.

Most of the inmates are ill and many die daily, the report says. They need food, medical aid and other assistance. In the same region, the report also reveals, are other camps containing several thousand Polish, Hungarian and Czech Jews who are in an equally bad state. The American troops are aiding the survivors, but much more assistance is required.

U.S. "PEACE COMMITTEE" REPORTS ON EFFORT TO EFFECT SILVER-WISE RECONCILIATION

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- The committee appointed by the Z. O. A. to explore the possibilities of terminating the dissension within the organization has not yet arrived at a mutually satisfactory formula, but expects to submit a definite report within two weeks, at the next meeting of the executive committee, Judge Louis E. Levinthal, chairman of the "peace committee," announced at a meeting of the national executive of the Z.O.A. held yesterday evening under the chairmanship of Dr. Israel Goldstein.

Judge Levinthal revealed that the Committee has discussed various possibilities with Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver and with others. He asked that in the meantime the committee be empowered to continue its efforts.

Emanuel Neumann, leader of the pro-Silver group, voiced a feeling of disappointment at the delay in the submission of a definite report by the committee. He maintained that the committee has had ample time to complete its work and that another two weeks is too much time to lose. He asserted that the majority of American Zionists have voiced a desire for prompt action.

Daniel Frisch, chairman of the Administrative Council and member of the committee, appealed to Mr. Neumann and his associates to bear with the committee. Mr. Frisch asserted that the committee deferred its report because it felt it to be in the best interests of peace and the cause. He pleaded for a little more patience.

The executive committee voted to empower the peace committee to continue its efforts.

PROF. MORDECAI M. KAPLAN "EXCOMMUNICATED" BY ORTHODOX RABBIS; HIS PRAYER BOOK BURNED

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan, leader of the Reconstructionist movement, which attempts to reinterpret the Jewish religion so as to check the escapism which, it asserts, is prevalent in contemporary Judaism, was "excommunicated" last night by a group of 200 rabbis at a "charem" ceremony held at the Hotel McAlpin.

The ceremony, arranged by the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, concluded with the public burning of the revised Prayer Book issued by Prof. Kaplan, to which the orthodox rabbis objected, declaring it is contrary to the principles of the Jewish religion. The ban on Prof. Kaplan and his prayer book was preceded by a speech by Rabbi Israel Rosenberg, president of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis, urging the "excommunication."

Asked by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency to comment on the rabbis' action, Prof. Kaplan said: "It is just too bad that men who call themselves rabbis should in this day and age resort to the barbarous procedure of outlawing a man without giving him a hearing, and to the Nazi practice of burning books that displease them. God save us from such leadership and from the disgrace it is likely to bring upon us Jews."

JEWS COMMITTEES HOLD CONFERENCE IN WARSAW; DISCUSS REHABILITATION PROBLEMS

MOSCOW, June 13. (JTA) -- The Lublin radio today announced that a meeting of representatives of Jewish committees in the Warsaw area to discuss rehabilitation problems was held in the Polish capital recently.

Of the 30 delegates, 10 represented the Jews of Warsaw, itself. Dr. Emil Grynberg, president of the Central Jewish Relief Committee in Poland, presided.

BELGRADE JEWISH COMMUNITY THANKS ALBANIAN GOVERNMENT FOR AID TO JEWS DURING OCCUPATION

WASHINGTON, June 13. (JTA) -- The Jews of Belgrade have written to the Chief of the Albanian Military Mission in Belgrade, Maj. Vasil Konomi, asking him to convey to his government and his people the gratitude of the Yugoslav Jews who "were nobly received in the homes of Albanian families and protected against any hardships," according to a Tirana broadcast, reported today by the Office of War Information.

"The first thought of the Jews who returned to Yugoslavia from Albania is to express gratitude and enthusiasm toward the Albanians who showed a wonderful attitude in the most critical moments of our lives and at the crucial period of civilized mankind," said the broadcast.

The Yugoslav Jews "were nobly received in the homes of Albanian families and protected against any hardships" and "the Albanian people will be blessed by all oppressed peoples for having contributed toward saving many Jewish lives," the latter was quoted as stating.

TRUMAN INSISTS PERMANENT FEPC MUST BE ESTABLISHED; WANTS HOUSE TO VOTE ON BILL

WASHINGTON, June 13. (JTA) -- President Truman today told his press conference that he hoped that the House Rules Committee would reconsider its refusal to allow the House to vote on the bill creating a permanent Fair Employment Practice Commission.

By a tie vote of six to six, the committee yesterday refused to grant a rule to the legislation, thus preventing it from coming onto the floor of the House for a vote. A petition designed to bring it before the House is now being circulated. It has already obtained over 100 of the 212 Congressional signatures required.

The temporary wartime FEPC is also in danger as a result of House passage, last week, of the War Appropriations Bill without a section authorizing funds for the agency. The House Finance Committee cut out the appropriation for the FEPC after the Rules Committee allegedly threatened to reject the entire appropriations measure if this were not done. The bill is now before the Senate, which can insert an appropriation for the FEPC if it so desires.

TWO JEWS AMONG CANDIDATES ELECTED TO FEDERAL PARLIAMENT IN CANADA

MONTREAL, June 13. (JTA) -- Lt. Col. David Croll, a former member of the Ontario provincial government, who ran on the Liberal ticket, and Fred Rose, Labor-Progressive candidate, were among the Jews elected to parliament, according to the available results. Col. Croll ran in Toronto, while Rose will represent a Montreal district.

JEWISH CONSUMPTIVE RELIEF ASSOCIATION PLANS \$2,100,000 DRIVE FOR POST-WAR EXPANSION

LOS ANGELES, June 13. (JTA) -- Anticipating a sharp increase in demand for service to the indigent tuberculous of the nation, the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association, operating the national, free and non-sectarian Los Angeles Sanatorium at Duarte, California, today revealed plans for a country-wide drive to raise \$2,100,000 for post-war expansion.

The plans envision one of the largest post-war building programs yet undertaken by any Jewish institution in America, with the first two units alone costing \$1,000,000 for buildings and equipment. Upward revision of a \$1,000,000 goal announced several months ago was decided upon at a dinner meeting of the JCRA this week as a result of exhaustive studies of anticipated post-war health needs.

ARAB LEAGUE IS GRAVE THREAT TO JEWISH ACHIEVEMENTS IN PALESTINE, EDITOR SAYS

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- The relation of the Arab League to Palestine was discussed here today by Gershon Agronsky, editor of the Palestine Post, at a luncheon tendered him by the United Palestine Appeal at the Biltmore Hotel, presided over by Sylvan Gotschal, chairman of the U. P. A. in New York.

The Arab states, Mr. Agronsky said, united not for any positive objective, but for the destructive purpose of preventing further Jewish development and reconstruction. The organized attempt on the part of the Arab states to drive all European influence out of the Middle East constitutes "a grave threat to everything that has been built up in the Jewish homeland by the sweat, the toil, the sacrifice and the indomitable idealism of the Jewish settlers," he declared. He emphasized, however, that no political crisis or combination of Arab states would deflect the Jews from their purpose of rebuilding the Jewish National Home in Palestine.

THOUSANDS OF PERSONS MARCH IN FUNERAL PROCESSION OF ELIAHU GOLOMB, HISTADRUTH LEADER

TEL AVIV, June 13. (JTA) -- Thousands of persons, including uniformed men and women representing all the armed services, yesterday marched in the funeral cortege of Eliahu Golomb, Histadruth leader who died on Monday.

The procession, which took more than an hour to pass, was headed by leaders of the Jewish Agency and the Jewish National Council and delegations from settlements throughout the country. Scores of wreaths were placed at the grave. An honor guard kept an all-night vigil Monday night in the meeting hall of the Histadruth central committee where the body rested before the funeral.

KEREN HAYESOD DIRECTORS RETURN TO PALESTINE AFTER SEVERAL YEARS IN AMERICA

JERUSALEM, June 13. (JTA) -- Leib Jaffe and Kurt Blumenfeld, managing directors of the Keren Hayesod, have arrived from New York after having spent several years in the Western Hemisphere on behalf of the Keren Hayesod. They were given a hearty welcome by the Yishuv.

DR. EISENBERG RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT OF NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR JEWISH EDUCATION

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- Dr. Asriel Eisenberg, director of the Bureau of Jewish Education of Cleveland, was re-elected president of the National Council for Jewish Education at its nineteenth annual conference held here.
