### MPE ANTI-JEWISH INCIDENTS IN PARIS, CROWD RARS RETURN OF JEWS TO FORMER DWELLING

PARIS. June 13. (JTA) -- New anti-Jewish incidents took place here today when wish family attempted to move into an apartment from which it was ejected during the Vichy regime.

Meanwhile, the youngsters were moved today to a rest camp run by the committe, located 40 miles from Paris. Before the children left, Jewish leaders were aswred by an official of the Ministry of Deportees, which placed the children in the sustedy of the Committee of Social Welfare, that the transfer would not hinder their ultimate emigration to Palestine. The children were gay as they packed, expessing the hope that the next time they moved it would be to Palestime.

Earlier today, both the Ministry of Deportees and the OSE issued statements giving their versions of the controversy which has arisen because the CSE was not given custody of the children, although they are caring for 400 other youngsters from Luchenwald.

A spokesman for the ministry told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the children were placed in the custody of the Committee of Social Welfare, rather than sent to OSE homes, because of the alleged inability of the latter organization to provide quarters for them. He asserted that last Tuesday, three days before the children were slated to arrive, the OSE informed the ministry that accommodations for them would not be ready and were informed then that the children would be placed in the care of the non-sectarian committee.

OSE officials told a press conference that the confusion arose because it had not stressed, when conferring with government officials, that the Buchenwald children were dewish, since it preferred to act on general humanitarian grounds. They said that under their agreement with the government, the OSE was to be entrusted with 800 children from Buchenwald, whose religion was not specified, but "the Ministry of Deportees, thinking that the OSE home would not be ready, decided to entrust these blety-two to the welfare committee."

# MININGS OF JEWS STILL CONFINED IN SEVERAL CAMPS IN AUSTRIA; MANY DYING DAILY

THE RESIDENCE

GEMEVA, June 13. (JTA) -- Two thousand Jews are still confined in Camp Resse, near Gmunden, Oberdenau, in Austria, which was liberated by American troops, Hows reported here today. About 1,500 of them are Polish Jews, mainly from Silesia.

Nost of the immates are ill and many die daily, the report says. They need hot, medical aid and other assistance. NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- The committee appointed by the Z. O. Judge Levinthal revealed that the committee has discussed various possibilities with Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. Abra Hillel Silver and with others. He asked that is the meantime the committee be empowered to continue its efforts.

Emanuel Meumann, leader of the pro-Silver group, voiced a feeling of disspointment at the delay in the submission of a definite report by the committee. He mintained that the committee has had ample time to complete its work and that another two weeks is too much time to lose. He asserted that the majority of American Zionhu have voiced a desire for prompt action.

Daniel Frisch, chairman of the Administrative Council and member of the comultee, appealed to Mr. Neumann and his associates to bear with the committee. Mr. Frisch asserted that the committee deferred its report because it felt it to be in the best interests of peace and the cause. He pleeded for a little more patience.

The executive committee voted to empower the peace committee to continue its efforts.

NEW YORK, June 15. (JTA) — Rabbi Mordeost M. WASHINGTON, June 13. "The first thought of the Jews who returned to Yugoslavia from Abania is to makes gratitude and enthusiasm toward the Albanians who showed a wonderful attitude in the most critical moments of our lives and at the crucial period of civilized manlin," said the broadcast.

The Yugoslav Jaws "were nobly received in the homes of Albanian families and rotested against any hardships" and "the Albanian people will be blessed by all opposed peoples for having contributed toward saving many Jewish lives," the latter may quoted as stating.

WASHINGTON, June 15. (JTA) — President Truman today told his press conference that he hoped that the House Rules Committee would reconsider its refusal to allow the House to wote on the bill creating a permanent Fair Employment Practice Commission.

MEN YORK, June 13. (JPA) — The relation of the Arab League to Palestine was discussed here today by Gershon Agronsky, editor of the Palestine Post, at a luncheon twiered him by the United Palestine Appeal at the Biltmore Hotel, presided over by Spiran Gotshal, chairman of the U. P. A. in New York.

The Arab states, Mr. Agronsky said, united not for any positive objective, but for the destructive purpose of preventing further Jewish development and reconstruction. The organized attempt on the part of the Arab states to drive all European influence out of the Middle East constitutes "a grave threat to everything that has been built up in the Jewish homeland by the sweat, the toil, the sacrifice and the indomitable idealism of the Jewish settlers," he declared. He emphasized, however, that no political orisis or combination of Arab states would deflect the Jews from their purpose of rebuilding the Jewish National Home in Pelectine.
