15. COVERNMENT ABOLISHES WAR-TIME VISA REGULATIONS: RETURNS TO FRE-WAR PROCEDURE

WASHINGTON. June 15. (JTA) - The United States Government today announced hat me-war immigration regulations are again in effect, and disclosed, at the same tim, that the Inter-Departmental Visa Committee - which was composed of representatimes of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. F.B.I., Army and Navy Intellimme - will be abolished as of June 30.

ENTISH GOVERNMENT WILL ALLOW 1,000 JEWISH CHILDREN FROM GERMANY TO ENTER ENGLAND

LONDON, June 15. (JTA) - The British Government has granted permission to to Committee for Jewish Refugees here to bring to Britain 1,000 Jewish children from the concentration camps in Germany, it was announced today by Otto Schiff, chairman the organization.

NEW YORK, June 15. (JTA) — The story of thirty years of American Jewish regraph in all parts of the world through the Joint Distribution Committee is told as special publication issued here today by the JoC., giving facts and figures on the state has brought to millions of Jews between the two world wars.

Needs of J.D.C. For Immediate Future Outlined in 8-point Program

The needs of the Joint Distribution Committee in the immediate future are milined in the report by Joseph C. Hyman, executive vice-chairman of the organization, in a 8-point program. The JaD.C., Mr. Hyman says, must continue to bear the impossibility for:

- l. Extending emergency relief to the several thousand Jews still mere semy control where J.D.C. relief, the only major source of aid, stands between the said death;
- 2. Continuation of relief for refugees who found temporary havens in neu-
- 5. Continuation of aid in transporting refugees from temporary neutral mans to Palestine and other countries;
 - 4. Aiding Jewish nationals in enemy and ex-enemy countries who were never

Highsoed or who returned to their homes immediately after liberation, e.g., Roumania, Migria.

- 5. Emergency aid to Jews in liberated countries pending the organization dessistance by UNRRA which operates only by invitation of the respective national manners and approval of the military.
- 6. Cooperation with UNRKA by lending J.D.C. personnel with experience and hawledge of Jows and by offering forms of supplementary relief to meet special needs of Jows who were everywhere singled out for harsh treatment and suffered more than put people.
- 7. Immediate assistance in the reviving of Jewish communal, religious and whare institutions, medical, child care training and economic aid, which were completely destroyed by Axis occupants and which are indispensable to the effective naturation of Jewish communal life, a task which UNRRA can under no circumstances
- 8. Cooperation with governmental and inter-governmental agencies, to plan in assistance in the long-run economic reconstruction of Jewish life and aid in the mettlement of those who cannot return to their former homes.

"This is the burden for American Jews who have created and sustained the JJ.C. as an all-embracing global agency for rescue, relief and reconstruction," Mr. Fran points out.

EN ENGLAND JNF CONTRIBUTES \$100,000 FOR MASSACHUSETTS COLONY IN PALESTINE

BOSTON, June 15. (JTA) — A check for \$100,000, marking the final installment of a total of \$150,000 pledged by the New England Jewish National Fund for the stablishment of a colony in Felestime named after Massachusetts, was presented to make Fisher, executive director of the JNF.

The presentation was made at a meeting in the Parker House by Dr. Arthur I. Shain, president of the New England JNF. The colony, "Nacleth Massachusetts," will coupy 6,000 dunans in the south-eastern part of the Jesreel Valley. United States Senator Leverett Saltenstall was honorary chairman of the fund drive.
