MES APPEAL FOR RELEASE OF EX-MUFTI; INTERNED GERMANS RELEASED IN PALESTINE

JERUSAIEM, June 18. (JTA) -- The Arab Party in Palestine today intensified meanpaign for the release of the ex-Mufti and other pro-Axis Arab leaders and for mir return to Palestine by addressing an appeal to King George of England, Prime Mister Winston Churchill and Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden.

Disclosure of the appeal was made on the Cairo radio, which added that simie requests have also been telegraphed by the Palestine Arab Party to the Archbishop flanterbury and to members of the House of Lords.

Meanwhile, the release from internment in Palestine of German nationals who er taken into custody after the cutbreak of war has resulted in a flood of mail to wal newspapers. Indignant readers demand that the Germans be deported to the Reich, alle others urge that the "non-fraternization" rule laid down by Allied commanders Germany be enforced here.

Still others ask whether the Germans are going to be permitted to go home recefully "as if nothing had ever happened." One letter-writer asks if the Czechs me repatriate several million Sudeten Germans, why can't a few thousand be ousted non Falestine.

EMM JEWS REFUSE REPATRIATION FROM SWITZER LAND; BERLINTO MANE RABBIL TO MUNICIPAL COMMITTEE

GENEVA, June 18 (JTA) - German-Jewish refugees in Swiss labor camps do not stire to return to their homes in Germany, it was established here today by a poll alm among the refugees by the Swiss authorities. A similar response was elicited hon non-interned refugees.

The Federation of Jewish Communities in Switzerland, as well as the World with Congress, have been conducting a campaign among the Jewish refugees for a long im, persuading them not to return to Germany. ET, EISENHOWER SAYS WAR CRIMINALS MUST BE FUNISHED; 15,000 ALREADY APPREHENDED

WASHINGTON, June 18. (JTA) -- General Dwight D. Eisenhower, at a press conhrence today, forcefully insisted that war oriminals must be found, that they must at be allowed to escape and must be punished. He said "that is our only hope of showing that orime doesn't ray." To date about 15,000 accused war oriminals have already her apprehended, Gen. Elsenhower disclosed.

The surrems Allied commander said he was never so angry in his life as when is say the "besticity" displayed in the German concentration camps. He added that is would class any SS trooper as a war oriminal, putting the burden of proof on him to stablish his innocence. Non-fraternization with the German people must continue till is last element of Mazism is rooted out, the general stressed.

Declaring that we must utterly destroy the German General Staff because the staff used political leaders to implement their plans, Gen. Bisenhower said "it, should be mide utterly impossible for the German General Staff ever to function again." That mild be accomplished, he stated, by destroying the archives of the staff and by segrenting all trained German General Staff officers.

IN IN AMERICAN JEVISH COMMUNITIES RESULTS IN UNFRECEDENTED FUND RAISING, SAYS REPORT

NEW YORK, June 18. (JTA) — The Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare had today issued an announcement emphasizing how "years of intensive local community spaintation which promoted unity, harmony and singleness of purpose in developing shish social welfare programs reaped a rich hervest of success in unprecedented funding results."

"Fhiladelphia, animated by victories in 1943 and 1944 when it twice broke in the million dollar campaign circle, showed high confidence in its organizational strugth by setting \$2,225,000 as its 1945 goal," the announcement says. "That confidence proved well-founded when it hit that mark—a splendid increase of \$400,523 mm 1944." the announcement points out.

Cleveland met the test of communal strength by going above a million dollars in the second consecutive year, this time raising \$1,342,000 which is \$235,000 more than it raised in 1944.

Los Angeles, with a goal of \$3,000,000 this year, is siming at first place in the list of communities, outside of New York City. It has already passed last years \$2,000,000 figure.

Other outstanding results include Newerk, last year \$706,000, total to date \$51,000, with \$900,000 certain on the basis of outstanding gifts; Worgester which whiteved \$755,000 as against last years \$204,000; and Akron which went over its 1945 gal by \$35,000 when it reported \$236,000. Houston raised \$225,000 which is \$74,000 was than it did last year. Omeha, incomplete at \$206,000 is already \$38,000 cheed of 1944. Top results on the west coast were also reported by Seattle, Fortland and Okland.

Were it not for this progress, among others, the advantages accruing from a high national income, full employment, and favorable tax deductions for philon-tropic purposes might have been lost to the Jewish commanity campaigns. Our committee, which have attained a high degree of organization, can face the future with confidence on the basis of their superb performances this Spring."

LABBIS URGE OPEN DOOR TO FAIRSTIME IN CALL FOR NATIONAL "DAY OF REFERTANCE"

NEW YORK, June 18. (JTA) — An appeal to the United Nations to deal justly lith the long-suffering Jewish people by opening the gates of Falestine, was made today by the Rabbinical Council of America in a proclamation setting eside Thursday, June 28, as a mational "Day of Repentance."

In selecting June 28, the proclamation noted that it was the 17th of Tamas, traditional Fast Day, which marks the saige of Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 A.D. and also that this day has always made the Jew "conscious of the loss of his Home land, relatine, of the destruction of his religious center and of the weakness and failure of the people that brought on the satastrophes."
